Adorage manages to get its animations playing smoother than usual thanks to a special trick. It takes advantage of a side effect of the Amiga's interlace mode (which changes the display very quickly to give the impression of double vertical resolution). It's designed to add a professional edge to all your presentations, whether that means a slick front-end to your latest game or demo, or a posh title sequence for your new video production. Unlike some other software, *Adorage* is incredibly easy to use, and you'll be generating those slippery wipes and special effects within minutes. For an idea of what you can do with *Adorage 2.0*, double click on the icon marked *SSADemo* in the *Adorage* disk window. This will play a pre-rendered sequence, showing how you can build up a complex animation by combining a number of simple effects.

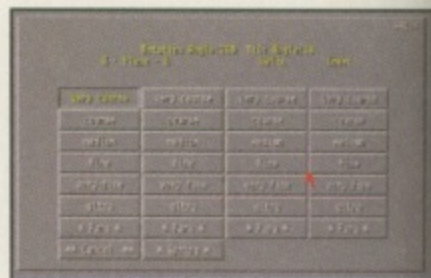
Getting started

Have a go at rendering an animation by clicking on any of the effect buttons on the left of the screen. These are the ones marked with little patterns. Each effect has a number of options that allow you to customise it, so once you've clicked on an effect button, you'll be presented with an options panel. These options are generally self-explanatory, offering different angles and directions.

These effects also give you a number of choices ranging from 'very coarse' to 'ultra fine'. This refers to the size and number of

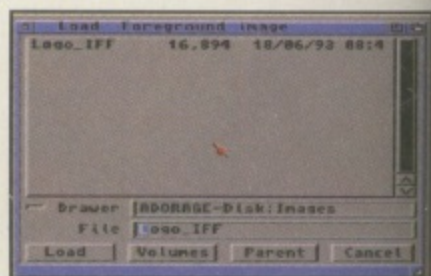


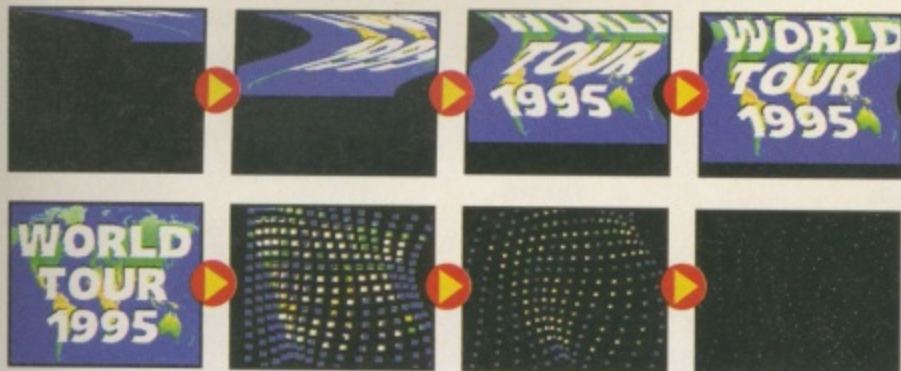
pieces into which the image will be broken during the animation. For example, selecting very coarse with an explode-type



effect will cause the picture to fragment into large blocks, while an ultra fine selection would lead to a spray of much smaller pieces. Click on any of the option buttons, or just choose the default setting (which is highlighted in yellow).

Pressing the Return key always





selects the current default option.

Next you'll be asked to specify a foreground image. Click on File Select, and a requester will appear, with the Logo_IFF file from the *Adorage* disk already selected. Click on Load, and you'll see it appear on the screen.

Click the left mouse button and you'll be presented with another options panel. Click on SSA Recording and the picture will be processed with your previously-chosen effect. This can take some



time, depending on the speed of your Amiga and the complexity of the effect.

Once it has rendered the sequence, you'll find yourself back at the main control panel. To watch the sequence, click on the Control button from the Animation section and then click on the Play button. You'll now see the first frame of the animation frozen on the screen. The rest of the animation will play when you click the left mouse button. This is especially handy if you're recording your sequences to video tape, in which case precise cueing is essential.

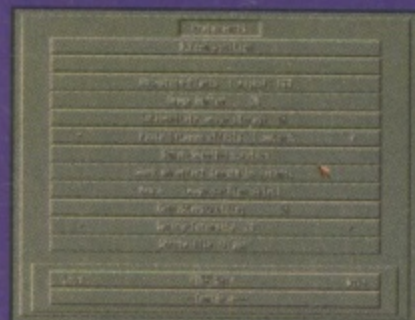
Click the right mouse button to stop the animation and return to the Edit Animation panel. From here you can save the sequence to disk.

Click on File and then Save to bring up a standard file requester. You'll need a pre-formatted floppy



IFF versus SSA

You can render your animations in one of two formats: SSA or IFF. SSA stands for Super Smooth Animation and is a format specific to *Adorage* (and its sister program *Clarissa*). You can't load SSA animations into *DPaint* and most other animation software but you can play them back using the ADOPlay utility on the *Adorage* disk. ADOPlay can only be used from the CLI. Put it in your C directory, and enter: ADOPlay filename in which 'filename' is the name of your SSA animation file.



The advantage of using SSA is that you'll generally get smoother playback than if you used an IFF format. SSA animations are saved as single files.

However, if you render your sequence as IFF, you've got complete compatibility with every other Amiga animation package. *Adorage* saves IFF

animations as a series of IFF images, with incrementally numbered filenames (eg anim1001, anim1002 etc). You can then load these into *DPaint* or a similar package, using the Load Picture option and defining a number of frames to load. To switch to IFF format, click on the Ado-Prefs button and then on the button marked Super Smooth Animation, which will change to read IFF Images. From this screen you can also set the path to which the images will be saved, by clicking on the Path for Saving IFF Images button.

disk or hard drive space in order to save your animation.

Further effects

Now that you've got a simple animation, how about expanding upon it? You should have a sequence in which your picture appears on the screen, so the last frame is the full picture. Now we can take that last frame and put it through another effect so that it's removed from the screen. Return to the main control panel, and click on the Out button from the Direction panel. This reverses the direction of the next effect, so that the image will break up over the course of the animation, rather than come together, as happened in the first effect. The point of this is that we want the logo to materialise on the screen, and then disappear. If you don't alter the direction, it will just appear once, disappear briefly and then appear again.

Select another effect. Click on one of the effect options (or use the default setting). Next you'll be asked to select the foreground image. This time, select From

Animation, then Last Image. This will tell the program to use the last frame of the animation as its source for the next effect. Finally click on Previous Values, Activate Previous Centre and then SSA Recording. Now play the animation as before.

Miscellaneous

If you booted from the *Adorage* cover disk (rather than a hard drive or Workbench) you may want to alter the positioning of the screen, in order to centre it on your display. This is done from the AdoPrefs screen. Click on the Screen Position button and the top of the screen. The pointer will change appearance and you can now move the screen around with the arrow keys. When you're happy with it, click the left mouse button, and select OK from the panel that appears.

Spring intensity is a parameter used by many of the effects, and controls the rate of acceleration and deceleration during the animations. Generally, a higher setting will cause the graphics to slide onto the screen quickly, and then

complete the final stages of the transition more slowly. To save your preferences settings, click on Save from the Pref Data button.



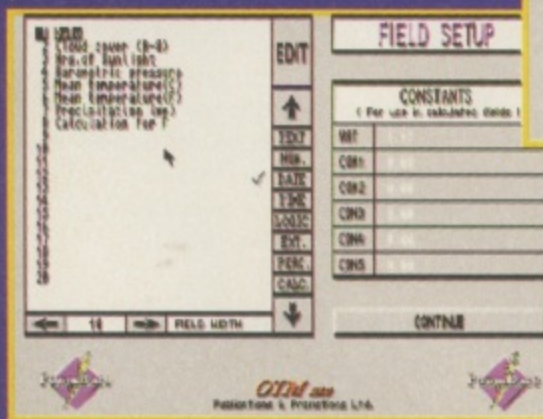

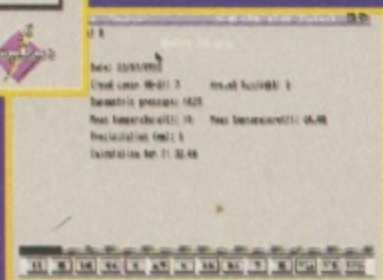
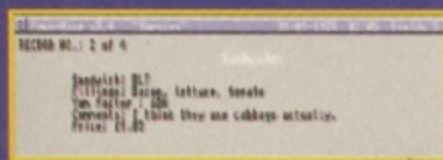

Sound samples

It's been a while since we've included any sound samples on our cover disks, as space limitations have kept us from doing so. However, this month there's a small selection of highly useful sounds for you to get stuck into. You'll find them in a drawer cunningly entitled Samples. With so little free space on the disk, it's a case of quality rather than quantity. There's a cutting horn stab, suitable for anything from a big band jazz number to a full-on house stomper. Next we've got a distinctive bass sample to rattle your woofers. For use as a sound effect or in your music there's a telephone tone (you never know when it might come in handy) and finally there's a funky carnival-style drum loop.

All of the samples are in standard IFF format, for use with any Amiga music package (*OctaMED*, *ProTracker*, *Music X*, *Bars and Pipes* etc), or in fact anything that supports IFF sounds. All except the drum loop are sampled at 16KHz (C-3). The drum loop was sampled at around 21KHz (E-3).

Think of a database as a collection of cards. Let's assume that these cards contain details of members of your club. Each card would be headed with the member's name. It could then be followed by a number of other details (or fields), such as address, telephone number, and any other relevant information. You could then access any of the cards (or records) by specifying a name, a postcode or any other detail. You can also amend the records and print them out at any time.

Getting started

See page 16 for full loading instructions. Before you load the *PowerBase* program, format a disk from the Workbench and label this *PowerBase Data*. You can use this to save out your database files.

Once you've loaded *PowerBase* load one of the example databases. This will give you an idea of how the program presents the data, which will make things easier when it comes to creating your own database. Select Load a Database from the Project menu. Double click on the Example Files drawer and then on any of the three files that appear in the requester. Have a look through the various records in the database by dragging the slider along the bottom of the screen with the left mouse button (it's the black bar just above the VCR-style controls). Once you've got the idea, have a go at starting your own.

The database

Select Create New Database from the Project menu. Answer 'Y' for yes when asked. If you want to create a new database, press Return. You'll now be asked for a name for your database. This is a heading that will appear at the top of your database. Next you'll be asked to enter an additional comment to elaborate slightly on the title eg Classic TV programmes from the 60s.

The next thing to do is define

the field names. These are the categories that will appear on each record or card. In the case of the classic TV example, your first field would be the name of the programme. This could be followed by any combination of fields, such as the date it was first broadcast, the actors or presenters, the genre and so on. You can have up to 20 fields in each record.

The number '1' will be highlighted at first. Type in 'Programme' and press Return. This has set the first field name to Programme. Now you need to define the width of the field, or in other words, how many letters you'll be allowed to type into the Programme slot (60 is the maximum). Click the left mouse button on the left and right arrows at the bottom left corner of the panel to change the field width. Now you can move onto the next field name. Press Return, and click on the figure 2 in the list. Now type in the second field name (Genre for example) and press Return. Alter the field width once again. Use a high value to be on the safe side. You can go back and alter the field width later, but it can mess up the whole database, so it's not advisable. Continue this procedure until you've entered as many fields as you need, then click on Continue.

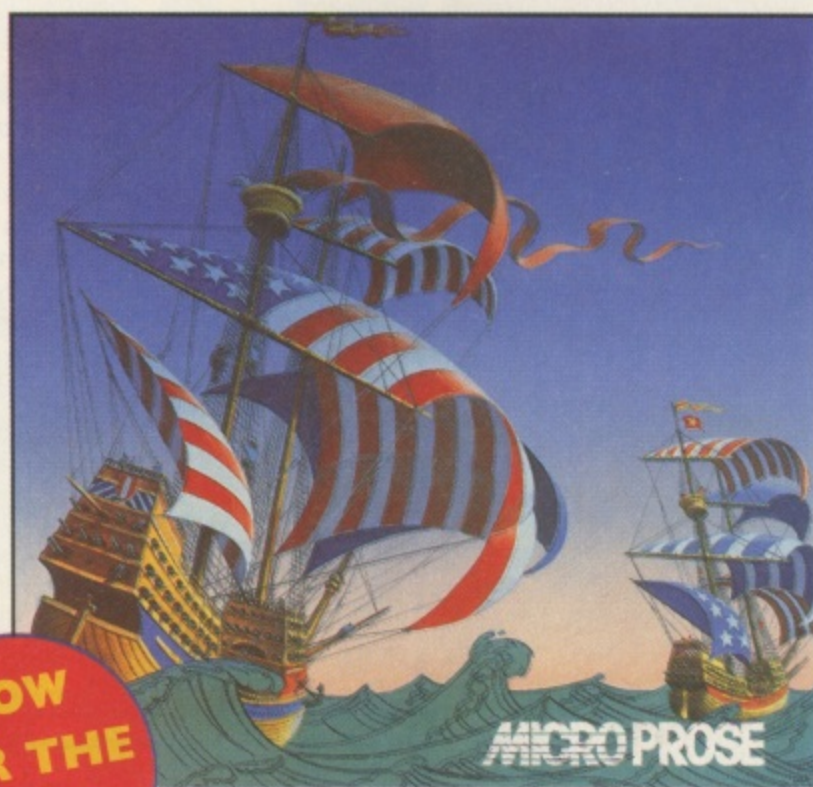
Records

Enter the details of your first record into the blank spaces. Once you've done that, a new blank record will be created. Use the slider at the bottom of the screen to move to this new record and enter the next lot of details. When you want to save your database, insert your blank formatted disk, and select Save a Database from the Project menu. Warning: if you see a red and blue window entitled System Request, do not click on Cancel, as the program is likely to crash and all your un-saved data will be lost. Insert the disk that it asks for and everything should return to normal.

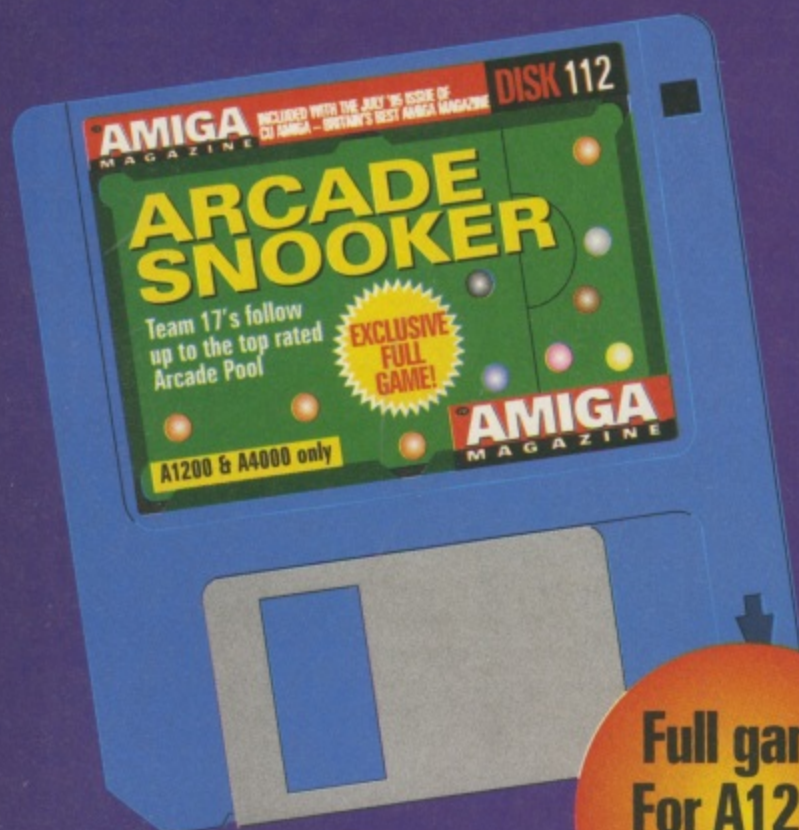

If you enjoyed *Arcade Pool*, Team 17's ultra popular top down viewed green baize game which was released last summer, you'll love *Arcade Snooker*. And it's all yours ...

You may notice ...

Although the label on your *Arcade Snooker* disk clearly states that this game is for A1200/A4000 only you may notice an earlier version of the same label printed on the front cover of the magazine after you have removed the disks. This says 'For all Amigas'. Well it isn't, just in case you've been confused by this conflicting piece of information. As usual we reserve the right to make last minute changes to the information contained in this magazine, and this was a pretty unavoidable one since the final version of the game we received was, unlike *Arcade Pool*, only AGA compatible.

WARNING: ARCADE SNOOKER HAS NO SAVE OPTION.

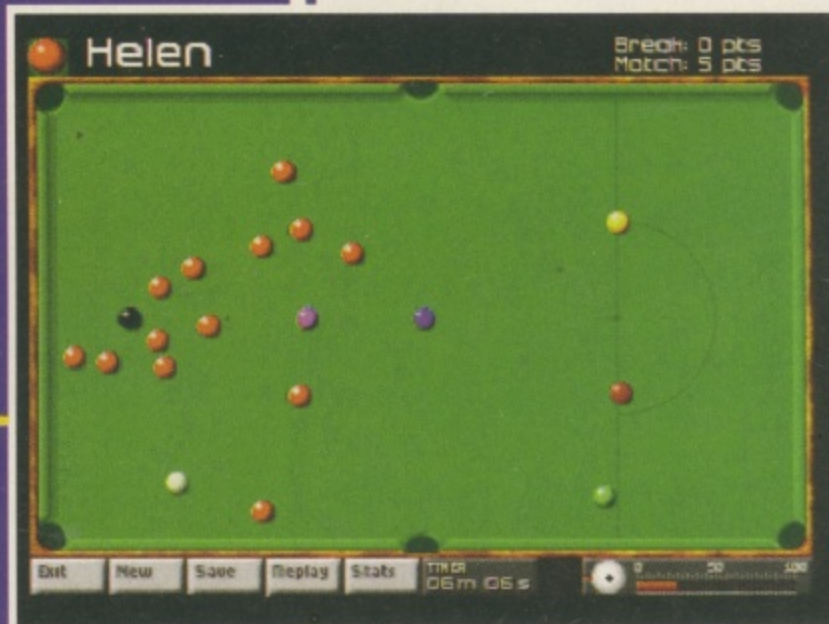
Do not try to save a game, especially when your disk is un-write protected!

You should have already made a copy of your disk. Do not use the original. If in any doubt consult our disk loading instructions on page 16.

While playing the game you'll notice that there is a save game option which appears to work but, search as you might, you'll never be able to find the load-in feature. Furthermore, if you do try to save a game and un-write protect your disk to do so you will corrupt it. The next time you load it you will get an error message stating that there is a checksum error on block 22. That will be your saved game, your disk will be unusable and you will have to go back to the master disk to play again.

Because *Arcade Snooker* is based on the *Pool* game but has been written differently and conforms to different rules the save option was considered inappropriate, and damn hard to do by Team 17, so they cut it out. Because we rushed them to give us the game, they didn't have time to delete the option from the menu. So it's our fault.

Penalty points

In general a foul shot will give your opponent a number of points depending on the ball you were intending to hit or pot. For example, if you had nominated the Pink, and accidentally potted the white, a red or any lesser colour, or missed altogether, or hit a lesser colour first, your opponent would gain 6 points. If during this shot you accidentally hit the Black ball first, or potted the Black, then 7 points would go to your opponent.

Foul shots involving a red or the Yellow, Green or Brown ball would see your opponent gain 4 points, as 4 points is the minimum for any foul shot.

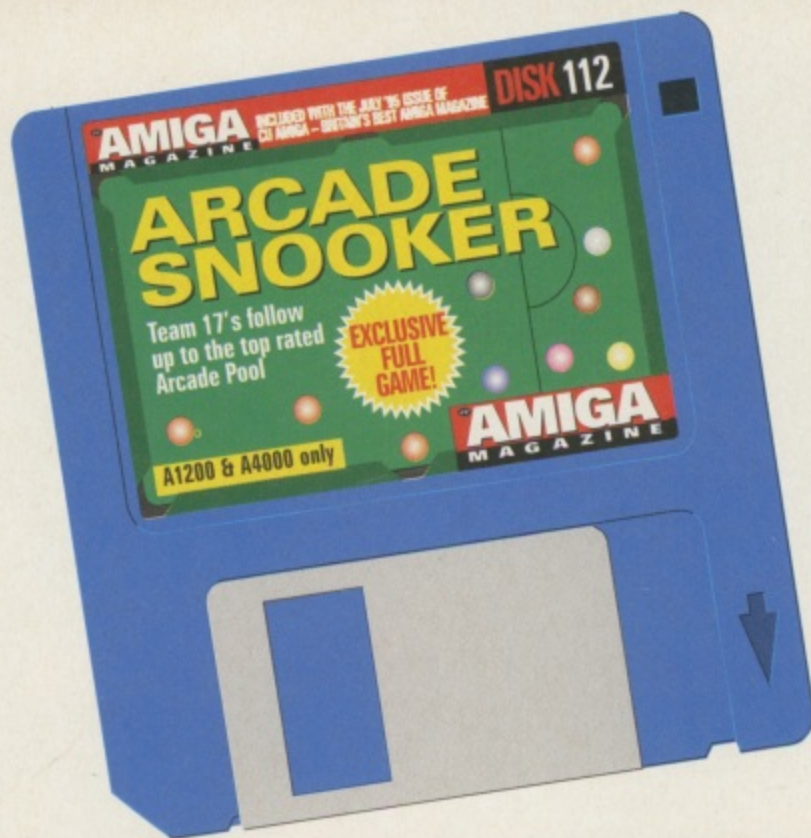

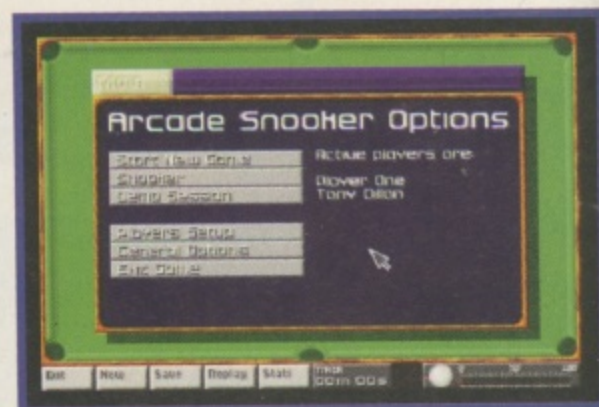
Snooker Rules In Brief

The idea is to rack up maximum points by potting the red and coloured balls. You start off by sinking a red ball. If you miss then the other player gets a shot. Once you have sunk a red ball (which stays in the pocket it has fallen into) you must then try to sink a coloured one, which will give you extra points – minimum for the Yellow and maximum for the Black. The total points for each ball is listed below. If you fail to sink a coloured ball then your opponent goes on to try to sink a red ball, followed by a coloured one. If you do sink the coloured ball it is then placed back on the table and you can continue by trying to sink another red ball, then a coloured and so on.

The player to sink the last red ball gets a shot at any of the colours. After this shot, the coloured ball is replaced (if it was potted), and now the colours must be potted in the following order, once again points are added up: Yellow, Green, Brown, Blue, Pink and finally

Black. If, while doing this you accidentally hit another colour before the correct one, or pot one of the other colours on the table your opponent is awarded a shot and the value of the ball, ie, if you are trying to pot the Yellow but you pot the Brown or hit it before the Yellow, your opponent will receive 4 points and start playing again.

Snooker is all about strategy. To pot a colour after a red you have to line the ball up properly or you will lose the advantage. However, because it is all about points, snookering or making it virtually impossible for the other player to score is also equally important. If there are not enough points on the table, you should 'snooker' your opponent to try to force a foul shot (which will incur a penalty to your advantage). A snooker occurs when there is no clear path between the white ball and the nominated colour or red ball. In this way you can rack up enough points to win.



▲ Under the Snooker option you will find two other types of game: timed Speed Snooker and Trick Snooker.



In the Player Setup screen, you can change player names to whoever you want while the default players consist of Team 17 members and various well known journalists from the games industry. Try Tony Dillon for a laugh. To change them to your name simply click on the end of the bar to change it to Player 1, then click on the bar itself to bring up a red cursor, then change the name to whatever you want.

In the General Options screen you can adjust sound, cursor outline and the friction of the surface of the table. Although there is a colour change option here, Team 17 decided not to implement this in the game because a) unlike pool, snooker is only played on a green table and b) because of the colour palette used the various balls would clash with the baize, ie you would find it very difficult to see all the red balls on brown baize. Thus this feature has been disabled. Finally, Quit quits the game. Enjoy yourself! ■

How to play

The player interface is simple enough to master: if you have seen *Arcade Pool* you'll already know what it's all about. *Arcade Snooker* is a mouse operated game and once you load it up you will be presented with a cursor and menu. New Game is just that: you can play a new game. The next bar will have Snooker written on it, which is the full game. Clicking on this changes the game to either Speed Snooker, a game against the clock where you have to pot as many balls as possible, or Trick Snooker where you can practice shots by moving the ball around the table, or set up all manner of 'trick' shots and try them out.

At the beginning of a game, to move the white cue ball within the semi-circle simply place the cursor over it and left click the mouse. This will bring up a hand cursor with which you can grab the ball and move it. The

same technique is used for moving all of the balls in Trick snooker.

Once you have the ball positioned, left click once away from the ball and place the targeting cursor which appears on the table on the ball you are aiming for. This will give the ball its targeting information. Then move the cursor down to the right hand side of the screen to the white ball and the power gauge. Click on what part of the ball you want the cue to hit (a little dot will show you the new position), for various types of shot (screw, topspin and side) and then select the amount of power you want to use.

Finally, once you're sure you have everything right click on the right mouse button and the shot will be taken. Simple. If you want to see an action replay, click on replay, if you want to quit the current game click on New or Quit. Save, as mentioned in the boxout, does not work. More's the pity.

How to load...



Before you start anything

Make a back-up copy of your cover disks before you do anything. This will save you endless trouble if you erase or damage your disks.

If you aren't sure about how to make a back-up just follow our guide to the right. Make sure to rename your back-up disks to match the originals.

For example, the copy of *Adorage 2.0* will be automatically renamed Copy of *Adorage 2.0* by the Amiga. Use the Rename option from the Workbench menu, deleting the 'Copy of prefix'. This is absolutely essential, as parts of the program will not work otherwise.

Making a back-up is easy

1. Take a spare blank disk.
2. Boot with your Workbench disk and load the Shell program. This can be found in the System drawer double click on it.
3. Now type in the following line and press Return:
`diskcopy from df0: to df0:`
4. You'll now be prompted to insert the source disk (111, 112 etc). After a few minutes you'll be asked to insert your blank disk. On some Amigas you'll have to swop disks several times.
5. Once finished type in the following, and then press Return:
`endcli`
You now have a back-up of the disk. Now you can begin.

IF YOUR DISK WON'T LOAD

We go to great trouble to ensure that the CU Amiga Magazine cover disks will work on common Amiga models. However if you do experience problems follow this simple guide.

- 1: Remove all unnecessary upgrades and peripherals, such as printers and modems. Some trapdoor expansions can also cause problems.
 - 2: Follow the instructions on this and previous pages exactly.
 - 3: If you still experience problems loading the disk call the DiskXpress helpline on 0451 810 788 between the hours of 10am and 5pm Monday to Friday.

WRITE PROTECT YOUR DISKS

Before you do anything, write protect your cover disks. Cover disk 111 must be write protected before you begin the decompression process, otherwise you may overwrite the original data. Disk 112 does not need to be write protected, but it's a good idea to do so anyway as a precautionary measure.

Adorage 2.0

Adorage has been compressed in order to fit it onto cover disk 111. Before you can use it you'll need to decompress it onto a separate disk. Have a spare disk to hand, and label it *Adorage*. This disk must be write enabled (with the tab in the closed position) while the original cover disk should be write protected.

Insert disk 111 into the internal floppy drive and switch on your Amiga. A Workbench screen will load, showing an icon marked CU_111. Double click on this, and then double click the icon marked *Adorage*. After a short while, you'll be asked to insert a blank disk. At this point, replace the cover disk with the blank disk labelled *Adorage*, and press Return.

Swop the disks back again when asked to do so. You can now go onto decompress the *PowerBase* disk, or reload with your *Adorage* disk.

To load *Adorage*, either insert the *Adorage* disk and reset the Amiga, or boot from Workbench or a hard drive. Then double click on the *Adorage* disk icon, followed by the *Adorage* program icon.

To install *Adorage* to a hard drive, boot from your hard drive, and then drag the HDInstall icon to the part of the hard drive where you want *Adorage* installed. Then by double clicking on this icon you will now start up the installation process.

PowerBase

PowerBase also needs decompressing before use. Insert cover disk 111 into the internal floppy drive and switch on your Amiga. Now double click on the CU_111 icon, followed by the *PowerBase* icon.

When asked to insert a blank disk, swap the cover disk for a blank write-enabled disk labelled *PowerBase* and press Return. Swop the disks back again when asked to do so.

To load *PowerBase*, insert the *PowerBase* disk into the internal drive and reset the Amiga. To install *PowerBase* onto your hard drive, double click the HDInstall icon and follow the instructions.

Arcade Snooker

Arcade Snooker is an autobooting disk. All you need to do is put it into the internal floppy drive and turn on your Amiga. *Arcade Snooker* is compatible with AGA Amigas only (A1200 and A4000).

NB: You can not save a game in *Arcade Snooker*. If you click on save game it will say that it is saving the game, however, there isn't a facility to load this saved game.

Welcome to Amiga Technologies

The Amiga was officially re-launched by German manufacturer and retailer Escom on May 30th 1995. We held up the printing presses, bribed newsagents and took publishers hostage to bring you this report by Alan Dykes, our man in Frankfurt ...



Key Events In The Amiga Re-launch

April 1995: Escom buy Commodore, all its trademarks and patents for \$10m.

May 1995: Escom re-open Rumbelows stores as Escom Computer retail outlets.

May 1995: Press re-launch in Frankfurt. Commodore name dropped from Amiga and new company, Amiga Technologies GmbH, formed. Commodore name now solely for use on Escom PCs.

August/September 1995: A4000T goes back on sale in old 040 form and in new 060 guise. Workbench 3.1 and Scala MM300 to be included.

September/October 1995: A1200 goes back on sale. Inexpensive HD and RAM upgrades made available simultaneously. Workbench 3.1 and Scala included.

Christmas 1995: CD32 may reach the shops. But it may not. Boo!

Spring 1996: A1300 version of A1200 launched with 30Mhz 030 processor and extra fast RAM. Also likely to have a CD-ROM drive. CD32 may be updated and re-launched to compete with the newer CD consoles on the market.

1996/1997: A new range of Amigas and AmigaDOS. CPU changed to HP PA RISC or PowerPC. AAA a possibility.



Amiga Technologies GmbH is the new title of a brand new company, set up by Escom to market, develop and manufacture the Amiga. It's going to be based in Germany, with additional hardware research and development staff in Philadelphia in the USA, software development support staff in the UK and distribution headquarters in Holland.

This was announced at a press conference in Frankfurt on the 30th May, presented by top representatives from Escom and the new Amiga Technologies GmbH (this is an abbreviation similar to Ltd, for limited company here in Britain). The General Manager, Distribution Manager, Product Development Director and Engineering Director are all from the old Commodore organisation, though none of them had a kind word to say for the company that went broke just over a year ago.

The new General Manager Petro

Tyschtschenko was with Commodore in Germany for twelve years rising to Director International Material Management and Logistics, his new role will be to co-ordinate the resourcing, manufacturing, R+D, licencing and sales of the current range of Amigas and any future development. Dr. Peter Kittel will already be familiar to users of the internet as over the last month he has released several fire fighting statements and press releases on-line. Having been with Commodore for 10 years he is now the man charged with the future development of the Amiga and will head up the R+D and support departments at the new Amiga Technologies headquarters in Bensheim in Germany.

Bernard Van Tienen, whom we interviewed in the May issue of CU Amiga Magazine when we scooped the story about Escom's bid was originally head of Commodore in the Netherlands and is now in charge of Escom

and Amiga Technologies' international production and distribution, as well as overseeing Escom UK and several key European countries.

There are still two Americans on the Amiga management team, at least one of whom will be familiar to Amiga magazine readers – Jeff Frank. Jeff was with Commodore for eight years and his last job was Director of Technology at the famous (or infamous) Norristown development headquarters. Escom have taken over and are maintaining this facility and Jeff Frank continues on in the same role for Amiga Technologies. The other American, Ed Goff is the legal eagle, who will be in charge of maintaining all the patents and copyrights, contracting third party development deals and licencing.

New CD32

The CD32 is proving to be the most difficult prospect for production and sale, and although General Manager Petro Tyschtschenko claimed that they hope to get it back on the shelves by Christmas Manfred Schmitt was less optimistic. He even went so far as to say that with the new Sony Playstation (and Sega Saturn) becoming available, a rethink of the design and capabilities of the CD32 might be in order, to increase its competitiveness against the new formats. This could set the release date back to sometime next year.

They were keen to stress the importance of the CD32 to the future. Amiga Technologies intends to use the CD32 as the basis for a low cost platform to sell and licence to cable and on-line entertainment and information companies to use as TV set-top boxes. These will be able to play games, movies, be connected to the TV enabling the owner to partake in interactive programming and go on-line in the Internet in an easy to access living room environment.

The fact that the CD32 was available and relatively cheap to manufacture was one of the original reasons why Escom was so interested in Commodore.

A1200 and A4000T: On sale and upgraded

In September, the A4000T, will go back on sale. They have dropped the old style A4000 for the machine which Commodore only managed to produce 1000 of before going into liquidation and halting production. Escom have already got 25,000 firm orders for the A4000T in Europe and the USA all of which will be fulfilled by Christmas.

The big news on this high-end front is that Amiga Technologies have signed a licence deal with Phase 5 to use their Cyberstorm expansion board version of the Motorola 68060 as the basis for the A4000T, and this version will go on sale before Christmas. This has the new 60 Mhz processor, the last of the 68000 series, with storming performance. However because Escom are still testing the water for sales and tooling up for production there is likely to be a waiting list for these machines, so order if you have the cash, but don't hold your breath for delivery!

More good news was waiting for the Amiga 1200 and CD32. The 1200 will be back on sale by the autumn, with a new bundled software pack, for which Escom are about to enter negotiations with software houses. They have already signed up Scala MM300 for all new Amigas (see our review of MM400 on page 79) and AmigaDOS 3.1 will be standard.

Although a price point has not been set for the re-launched 1200 Manfred Schmitt, Escom's chief executive told CU Amiga Magazine that he would like to see a machine for the home market retailing at around one third of the price of their current PC range. The cheapest current Escom PCs sell for just over £600 plus VAT, and if he is serious this could mean that the A1200 will go on sale including VAT for an unprecedented sum of under £250.

Manfred Schmitt, Bernard VanTienen and Petro Tyschtschenko were all eager to stress that the new Amiga Technologies will operate with as low an operating overhead cost as possible, relying on low cost manufacturing and distribution, this being the key to low retail prices. Also, rather than selling them solely through Escom outlets (they have converted the former Rumbelows chain into Escom shops) they will continue to rely on current distributors in a further effort to keep prices and overheads to a minimum. They were reluctant to announce any official prices at Frankfurt though, because distribution deals still have to be worked out.

The A1300CD

The A1200 is due to be improved early next year with an EC030 processor and a fast RAM upgrade almost certainly on the cards, while a CD-ROM drive becomes a distinct possibility too. Because of their PC multimedia experience and the knowledge that CD is the games platform of the moment they are considering this very seriously. Also, because of the processor upgrade from an EC020 to the 030, Manfred Schmitt let slip that this machine is at least under development with the title of A1300. So fans of the fictional A1400 now have something concrete to talk about.

According to Escom there will be no problem sourcing the necessary microprocessors for new Amigas despite many reports of a shortage of Motorola 68000s as that company concentrates on PowerPC production. Negotiations with Motorola have shown that they are very keen to see the Amiga continue to use their chips, since their current customer base solely consists of Apple and IBM and they very much like the idea of another competitor in the market buying and using their chips instead of Intel's.

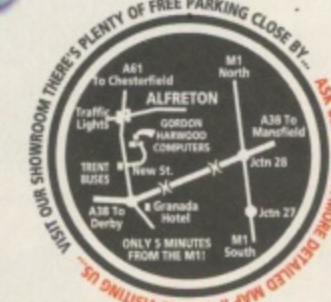

What is a 'Set Top Box'?

In all the furore over the Escom takeover of Commodore several new pieces of terminology have reared their ugly heads in this mag and other organs. One of the most frequent has been 'Set Top Box'. There is no mystery surrounding this. All it is is a computer or console designed to be part of the TV entertainment system which currently includes your video and possibly a stereo or surround sound system. Like the primitive CDTV and the current Phillips CDi it is not intended to have a keyboard, but unlike these machines it is fully intended to interact with you not just by remote control keypad but also through the TV screen using touch sensitive technology.

Because it can play video CDs and games it crosses into console territory but it will also allow you to link up to the Internet, carry out banking transactions, download movies (rather than going out and renting a CD or video), engage in home shopping activities or do an interactive course of education on any subject you like. Among the many applications for such a device one of the most interesting is being able to participate with thousands, millions even, of other viewers on a cable TV show, using the Set Top Box to communicate your commands to game show contestants, TV private detectives or whoever.

At the Frankfurt press conference another ex Commodore employee, and a pretty famous one at that, former Development Director Don Gilbraith, was putting forward his vision of a set top box using the CD32 as a cheap but very capable basis for implementing all of the above. The company is called VisCorp and they already have test machines in American homes. Although Europe has yet to become familiar with this technology it won't be long before it gets here.

... and SoHo?

Another newish and easy to explain term is SoHo. In London it means an area of town filled with strip shows and porn shops and the odd good pub. In New York it means 'south of Houston' and it's a good place to get mugged. But in computer parlance it simply means Small office, Home office: people working from home and communicating with an office and the outside world via modem. It's a popular anagram used by computer salesmen and marketing bods at the moment because they reckon it's a big growth area for sales.

Brand new Amiga

A new Amiga is definitely on its way within the next two years. Speaker after speaker praised the Amiga's operating system, multitasking ability and workbench management. As a cheap but very capable people's computer some of them went so far as to liken the Amiga home computer revolution to the VW Beetle's success. In recognition of its strengths they are investigating porting AmigaDOS to other computers as well as developing 'Amiga Environment Emulators' for the PC and Apple Mac.

In terms of the new Amiga itself it will most likely become available with either a development of the Motorola PowerPC chip or the HP PA RISC processor as its core CPU. The possibility of resurrecting the AAA chipset from the drawing board was also cited by Dr. Kittel as one approach to developing the new machine as this has already had a lot of work put into it. But he refused to be drawn on whether it will definitely be used or not. Newer Amigas can also be expected to have crossover Mac and PC abilities, just like the Mac is now available with a PC operating system in tandem with its own.

A new workbench version is a certainty though, as is a new machine design and a more modern, professional look. In fact one of the lighter moments of the conference was the appearance of Bjørn Rybakken from a company called Bates Strategic Design who presented, using visuals, lighting effects and music, a vision of the modern Amiga and a new Amiga logo, pictures of which you can see below.

There are also plans to keep spare parts available to current Amiga users through a spare parts control service in Bensheim, Germany and when brand new RISC Amigas are released (which is unlikely to be for at least 18 months, the A4000T 060 and the A1300 are intended to fill the gap) Amiga Technologies will attempt through emulation to make sure that they are as backward compatible as possible with the thousands of titles currently available for Amigas.

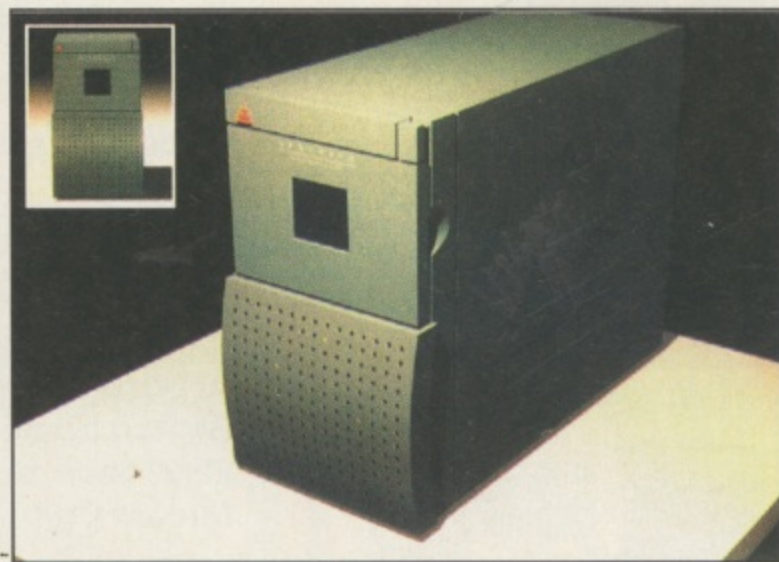
Overall, the conference was positive. The re-launch of the current A1200 was greeted with enthusiasm, but the completely upgraded version, which is what we really wanted to hear, was even better, despite that fact that it will inevitably cost more. This commitment, along with the

one to upgrade the CD32 and only produce the vastly more expandable A4000T showed a desire to make the Amiga better and more competitive, not just in price but also in capability.

Escom plan to make their initial purchase money back by the spring of 1996 and turn over about 100 million Deutchmarks (£45M) worth of Amiga business by the end of the year. Manfred Schmitt told CU Amiga Magazine that a turnover similar to Commodore's 500 million Deutchmarks (£225m) would not be out of the question in a couple of years time, at which stage the Amiga will have become a big player again.

Commodore and Amiga in Multimedia future

Escom bought the rights to the Commodore name and all its associated patents and trademarks, for \$10m in New York at the beginning of April, against strong competition from Dell. At that stage they confirmed their interest in the Commodore name as a strong PC brand, but quite how the Amiga would fit into their overall strategy has been uncertain.

Manfred Schmitt, Escom's chief executive was keen to emphasise that the acquisition of the Amiga now means that Escom has become a multimedia company rather than just a PC retailer, able to take advantage of the growth of 'Pay-TV, Video On Demand, Home Banking, Home Shopping and on-line services'. Amiga technology will enable Escom to give users a 'cost efficient way to access all these new services'. In line with these expectations they are aiming to licence the Amiga's core technology to third parties for use in tv set top interactive boxes and other related goods.

Claiming that 93 percent of all PC users still recognise Commodore as a strong brand name Escom are attempting to do what Commodore itself failed dismally at three years ago and are launching Pentium 75 and 100 PCs under the brand name, which will no longer be associated with the Amiga.

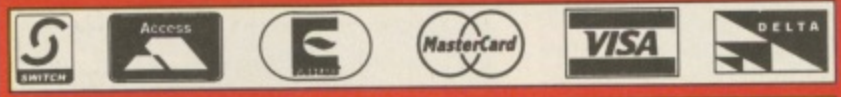

The Internet. Most of us know what it is, but exactly how does your average Amiga owner go about getting onto the information super highway, and what do they do once they get there? For the answer to these questions, and many more, look no further ...

▲ One essential site for Amiga users is the Amiga Home Page. Here you'll find all kinds of news, gossip, rumours and articles about your favourite computer.

If you've looked in any popular magazine or newspaper, switched on the TV at any given point of the day, or simply glanced across the magazine shelves, you will have noticed the Internet. Dubbed everything from the information superhighway to the virtual homeworld of geeks and spanners, the .net – as it is known to its friends – has finally hit the mass market. Every major company now sports an E-mail address as part of their advertising and almost every social gathering seems to be full of talk of 'surfing', 'skimming the net' and so on.

To the uninitiated, all this hype and furore must make the Internet look like the most amazing, incredibly exciting experience on the face of the planet. Forget Space Mountain, forget Nemesis, for thrills and spills, switch on your modem. But that's not really the kind of excitement the Internet offers.

What the Internet actually is, however, is the greatest advance in communications this planet has seen since the invention of the

telephone. This may sound like a very bold statement, but you have to admit it starts to look impressive when you think that it gives you the capability to access information on almost anything you can think of, chat in real time to people all over the globe, send any kind of digital information – images, sounds, text files, diagrams and so on – instantly to any other part of the world, join debates and conferences with like minded people from all around the globe and download all the free software you could ever want, all for the cost of a local call. Howzat? As Ian Botham would say.

If you have been following the

hype in the major press, you can't help but notice that almost all of the coverage seems to be geared toward PC owners, who, along with Apple Macophiles, have access to native versions of Netscape and NCSA Mosaic, the two main Web Graphical Browser that form the well known visual part of the Internet (don't worry about the terminology – all will be explained later on). You could be forgiven for thinking that the Amiga doesn't get a look in, but fear not as Web browsers and full Internet access are readily available for the Amiga.

Before you can leap right in and get moving, a little explanation is required. The Internet was

Connecting up

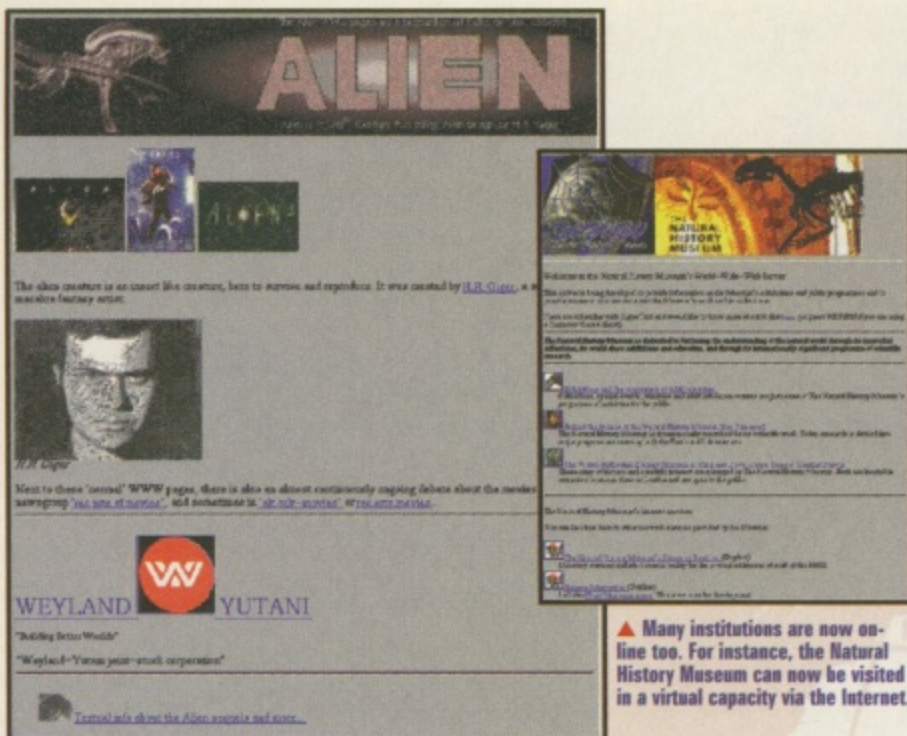
There are a number of ways you can set yourself up to access the Internet. We'll go into detail a little further on, but for now, here's a typical example of how you might choose to set yourself up.

- Buy a modem, capable of 14,000 or higher transfer rates
- Join Demon (phone 0181 371 1234)
- Demon sends software to get you connected
- Install the software
- Dial into Demon
- Run your software (supplied by Demon)
- Use FTP to get a program called Magic User Interface from Aminet, and AMosaic from <ftp://max.physics.sunysb.edu/pub/amosaic>

You can now access the Web pages pictured here plus thousands of others. Don't worry if this doesn't make much sense yet, all will become clear.

What's It All About, Archie?

The Internet is an unbelievably massive place and without a little help, you're going to find yourself stuck or lost in no time at all. That's why there are two little programs incorporated into many Web sites to help you, known as 'gophers' and 'archies'. An 'archie', or Internet Archive to give it its full title, is a catalogue of other Web sites. You can use a 'find' option with these archies to pick out Web sites that may be of particular interest to you. When you've found one you want to investigate, the 'gopher' will take you straight there.

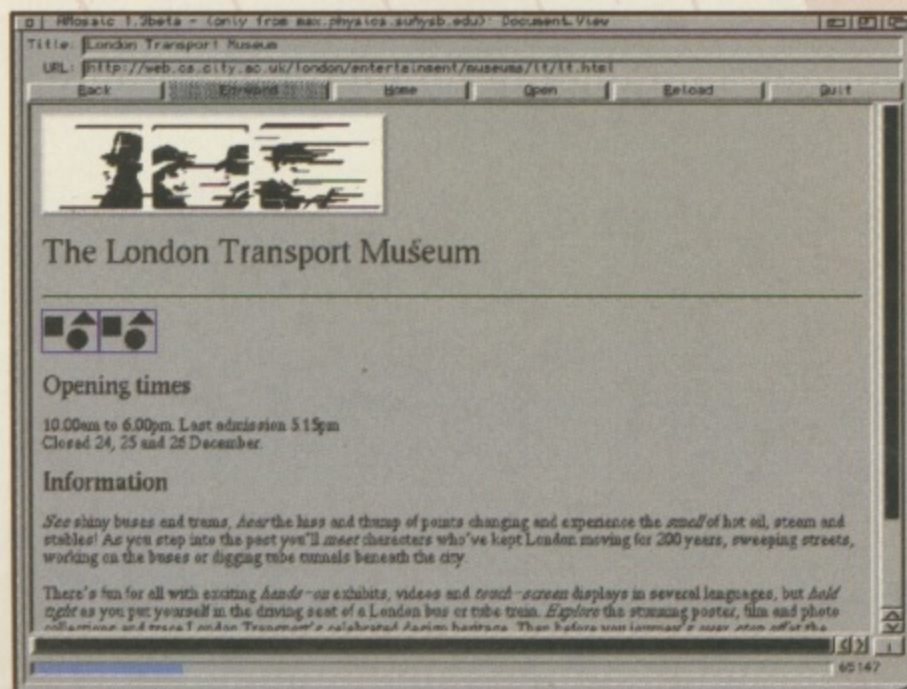

set up initially in the USA as a network of scientific computers, designed to send information between colleges and universities. The .net has grown to mammoth proportions and now contains thousands of computers all interconnected around the world via direct connections. The end result is the ability to log on to any of the machines worldwide and use

their resources to your own ends. If you have ever used a bulletin board system, then you will already know how this kind of thing can work. Now imagine that your local bulletin board has access to a thousand other hard drives around the world, which you can download software from through your local board, and you've got a basic working

Realtime Conversation

Over 25 million people are currently estimated to be connected to the Internet. These people come from all walks of life and from all over the globe. Thanks to Internet Relay Chat (IRC) you can talk to them in one-to-one or conversations or group discussions. This system lets you type messages in real time to any number of other people in a closed conversation, discussing any topic you care to think of, and there are hundreds of conversations going on at any one time. The best way to use IRC is with the Amiga program *Grapevine*, available from any Aminet site via FTP.

What Is E-mail?

E-mail, or Electronic Mail, is the most popular use of the Internet, and it isn't hard to see why. E-mail can act just like a computerised telegram service, but it's capable of so much more. You can send anything via E-mail, so long as it can be converted into digital information. This includes pictures, sounds, movies, documents and of course computer software. This has been possible for years, since the dawn of modems, but Internet has given it a new twist. Now you can E-mail anyone else in the world (providing they're wired up too) by simply quoting their E-mail address, which makes the whole process so much quicker, easier, and cheaper than it used to be.

version of the Internet right there, but of course there is much, much more than that going on.

Text vs WWW Graphics

There are two methods of Internet access. The simplest is through a text-only link, using a service such as CIX (Compulink Information eXchange), Delphi or Almac. CIX is a bulletin board that also acts as an Internet 'gateway'. You can access parts of the Internet via this gateway, but you won't be able to get at those attractive World Wide Web (WWW) sites. Anyone with an account with CIX (or similar Internet gateway provider) can go straight through to the Internet with normal comms software (such as *NComm*), and a simple typed command (eg. Go Internet). This will let you send international E-mail, and download free data and software from FTP sites around the world. Unfortunately this method can be rather long-winded, as anything you download must first be downloaded to the CIX bulletin board, and then to your Amiga from there, which doubles file transfer times.

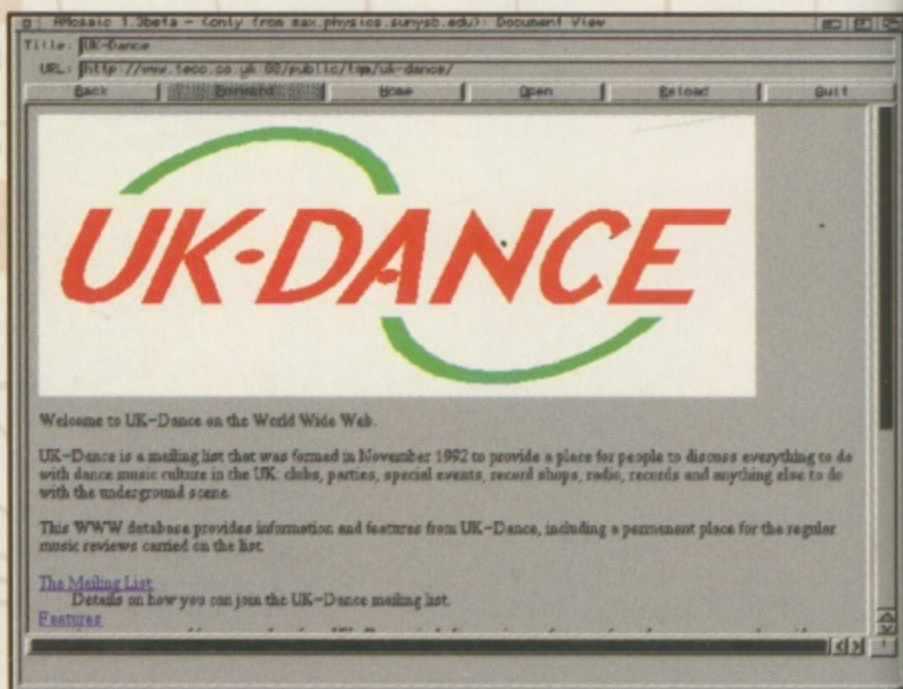
Don't Forget...

Don't forget FidoNet, the network of Bulletin Boards all over the world. FidoNet is totally free to use and offers similar E-mail and file facilities to the Internet. Call you local BBS for more details on how to take part.

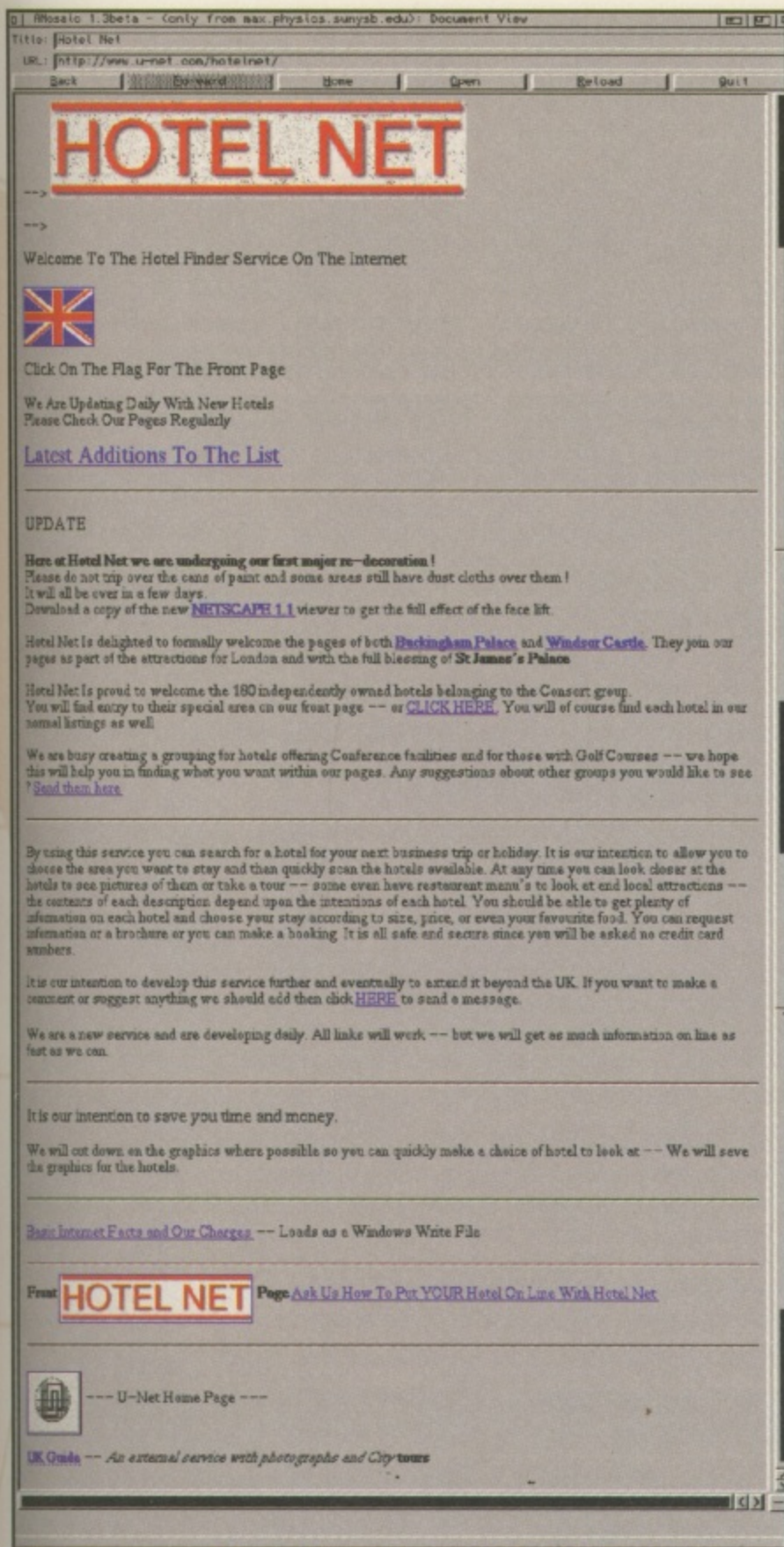
However, if you're to get the most from the Internet, you should really get set up for WWW access, in which case you'll need some extra software, and an account with an Internet 'middle man' such as Demon. Demon are recommended particularly to Amiga users, as they can offer software and services particular to the Amiga. Many alternative companies are geared towards PC users. Take this route and you can experience the point-and-click interface of the World Wide Web.

Text-Based Access

Setting up for text-based access is simple. Get yourself a modem and some terminal software, such as *NComm*. *NComm* is shareware and so it's available from most

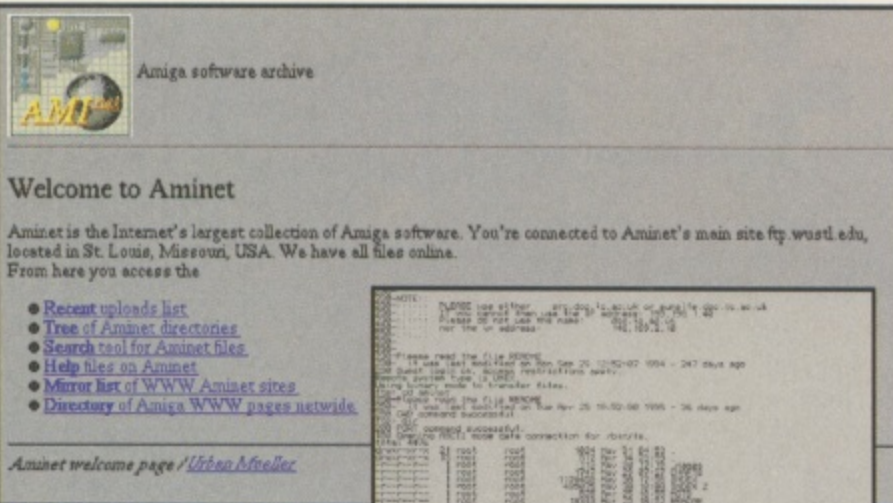
Choosing A Provider

In our examples here we've selected CIX and Demon Internet as Internet providers, but there are others. Demon Internet are the largest Internet providers in the UK and charge £10 per month for unlimited access. If you choose to shop around, there are a few main points to check for. Some providers (such as Demon Internet) will supply Amiga users with the appropriate software, but don't expect the same service from all providers. Differing prices will be charged for initial connection and subsequent Internet access. Also check that there is a local Point of Reference. This is the phone number your modem will ring each time you use the Internet, so in order to keep your phone bill as low as possible, this should be a local number.

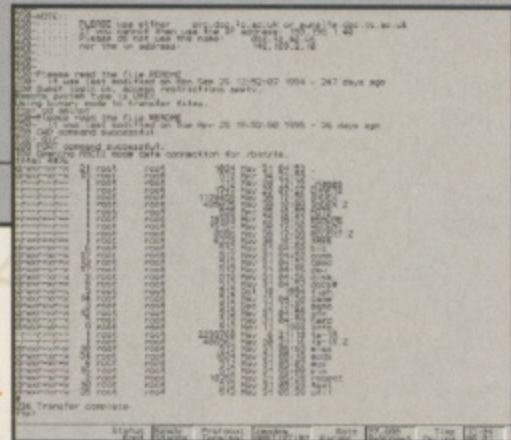

public domain libraries for around £3 including post and packing. You can then send off your registration fee for a fully functional version of the program. Now you need an account with CIX. Phone them on 0181 390 8446, and they'll tell you everything you need to know about setting up an account. With your CIX account sorted out, it's just a matter of logging on, and entering 'Go Internet'. That's it!

World Wide Web Access

If you haven't got access to Web sites, you're missing out on an enormous part of what makes the Internet so special. The World Wide Web is a system that allows navigation around the Internet

with a civilised graphical interface. You don't have to learn reams of confusing commands and codes. The hardest thing is setting up your system. From then on it's plain sailing. Here we'll expand on the brief 'Connecting up' panel from page 27.

We'll assume you've got your Amiga and a modem capable of 14,000 or higher baud rates. The next thing you need is an account with an Internet provider, such as Demon. Phone Demon on 0181 371 1234 and enquire about setting up an account for Internet WWW access. They'll fill you in on what needs to be done. Follow their instructions, and soon you should receive some software. Install this software according to the instructions. Now run the software as directed and dial into

Tell Me More About Aminet

Aminet is the ultimate collection of Amiga software: you have probably seen or used the CDROMs of the same name, which are taken from the on-line archives at regular intervals.

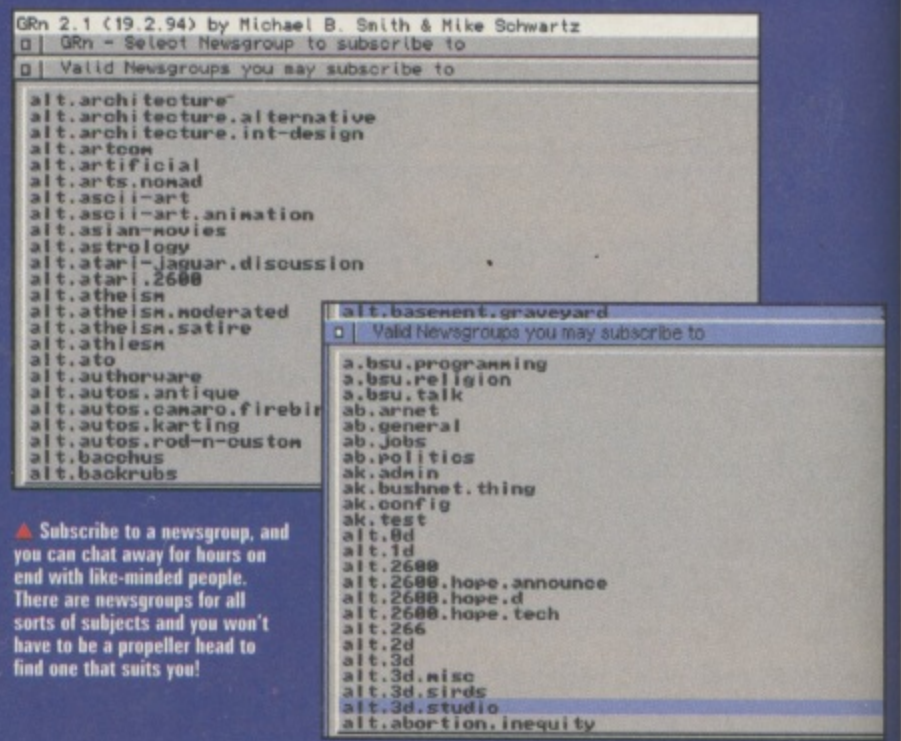
DIY Web Pages

One of the reasons that there are so many Web pages around the world, is that they are relatively easy to put together. All Web pages are constructed using a hypertext formatting language called Hyper Text Markup Language (HTML). This allows you to transform a set of text documents and pictures into a professional-looking Web page within minutes. You can also use this language to build links to other Web sites.

A Lorra, Lorra, Newsgroups

The second most popular use for the Internet is, without a doubt, the Usenet network. This is a massive collection of over 15,000 debates all happening at once and the list grows every day. Here like minded users can post messages in response to other messages they read in the debate, which are in turn responded to and the debate grows, and most of them make for very interesting reading. Topics cover everything you could think of, from a Bill Clinton fan club to more serious topics like animal rights and abortion.

You can join a newsgroup at any time by simply posting a message to it, but there are a couple of rules to follow. The first is that you read the FAQ (Frequently Asked Questions) document before you submit anything. This is a list of questions often asked by new users, and saves the more experienced users having to continually answer the same old questions. The other is that for the most part, 'flaming' is not allowed. Flaming is the term used for having a go at someone when you don't agree with what they are saying. If enough people are annoyed at something someone has written, a new newsgroup dedicated to flaming them will appear, so keep the flaming to a minimum, as again it wastes people's time.



▲ Subscribe to a newsgroup, and you can chat away for hours on end with like-minded people. There are newsgroups for all sorts of subjects and you won't have to be a propeller head to find one that suits you!

FTP Explained For You


Three letter acronyms are very popular on the World Wide Web. One of these that you will find very useful in your travels is FTP, or File Transfer Protocol. Any addresses that have the phrase FTP are university computer systems stuffed to the gills with freely downloadable software. There are millions of files available from FTP sites, from sound samples and graphics, to complete games and novels in hypertext format. It does take a little longer to download software from the Internet as it would from a regular board, but what you lose in speed you make up for in choice.

Here's Some Jargon Clarified

AMINET: The home of the ultimate Amiga software library. It is free to use, and there are 'mirrors' or copies of the site the world over.

AMITCP: The Internet is held together with a protocol called TCP/IP and this is the suite of Amiga programs which implement it. Needed for dealing with direct access to Internet via companies such as Demon.

FTP: File Transfer Protocol/Program: the standard method for copying files and data across the Internet.

INTERNET: The world-wide 'network of networks' which links many thousands of computers with high speed links. By tapping into it via modem, you can send E-mail, get free software and play games. Why not read the rest of this feature, that's what it's about!

IRC: Internet Relay Chat: a

real time method for chatting to other users. Join a channel such as '#amiga' and you can chat with other Amiga users the world over.

MODEM: The hardware that connects your Amiga's serial port to the telephone network. From here you can call into the Internet, and from there the world's your virtual oyster. Remember: you need to pay for the telephone call from your Amiga to the provider.

TCP/IP SOFTWARE: Internet software interfaces.

TELNET: program used to log into remote computers across the Internet.

WORLD WIDE WEB: The collection of Hypertext pages (pages with point and click links) which are linked via the Internet.

USENET: Collective term for the thousands of Newsgroups used for public discussion.

Arizona

If a prize could be given for most attractive Web site, it would have to go, hands down to Megadeth Arizona. Whether you like the band or not, this is a fine example of just how a web site should be put together. It's a 'meet and greet' site, that gives everyone the chance to see how Megadeth's recent album was pieced together. You can join in live chat sessions with the band and other fans and send digital postcards to friends on the net. It looks fantastic, is very easy to move through and has a lot of fun things in there.

The OJ Files

As you will come to find out as you work through the Internet, a large proportion of it is currently based in the US, and so one of the most popular Web sites around has to be the extremely professional OJ Simpson site (see Usenet for plenty of OJ stuff),

which documents all the happenings in the OJ trials each day, has a full background on the story, photos, profiles of everyone involved and an extremely lively conference forum where the general public get a chance to decide for themselves whether OJ is innocent or not. A little morbid, perhaps, but still fascinating.

In Conclusion

The Internet is far too large a place to ever give a fair indication of on these seven pages. Indeed, if you've seen any of the Internet Yellow Page directories, you'll see that those 600 page plus publications are the only real way to find out exactly what there is to see. These sites should serve as a fair starting point, however, and the Yahoo site will take you through the four corners of the .net with no trouble at all. Basically, jump in and help yourself! ■

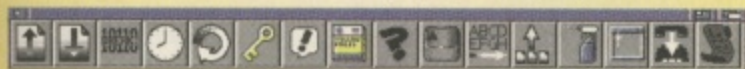

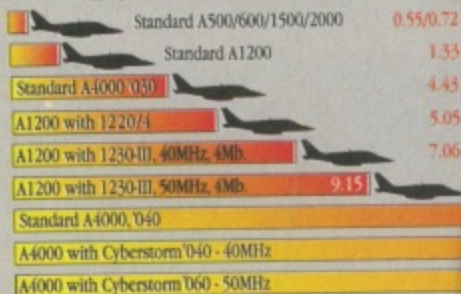

Primal Rage

PART 2

What use would a work in progress be without a part two? This month we talk to the man responsible for fitting it all onto Amiga, Richard Costello.

Donnington motor racing track is one of the last places you would expect to see an extinct monster, but one appeared there on a bright Tuesday morning in the middle of May 1995. I had journeyed to Nottingham with Probe product manager Robert O'Farrell to meet *Primal Rage* re-programmer Richard Costello and said monster was parked outside his house. It's a car, it's called a Lancia Delta Integrale and although it's no longer made, it's world famous for its four wheel drive rally exploits. And if *Primal Rage* plays as fast and as smoothly as the totally loony Costello drove us around Donnington after this interview then I'll be very impressed.

AD: How long have you been working with the Amiga?

RC: I've been working with it for about seven years now. My background initially was at Gremlin Graphics, where I produced *Gauntlet 2*, *Hot Rod* and other mainly coin-op conversions. I have also done *Golden Axe*, *MK1* and *2* Amiga for Probe and finally here

we are now, with *Primal Rage*.

AD: The *Primal Rage* coin-op was the most memory intensive ever produced, do you find the challenge of completely re-writing the code much more difficult than in previous games?

RC: So far, no. But then the hard work has yet to come! You're stuck at the end of the day with a 1Mb machine and you've got to fit everything into that. You can only put so much time into designing compression routines because to compress the lot would be impossible and the more you have, the slower the game. So it's really a process of talking to the producer and seeing how many corners you can cut.

AD: Does having to develop the game for original 500s with only 512k chip RAM and the other 512k added on limit you? Wouldn't it be easier to do the conversion for full 1Mb machines, from the A500+ onwards.

RC: As it happens *Primal Rage* doesn't actually need 1Mb of chip RAM, because the sprites and everything else are compressed and you've got to actually decom-



press them with the 68000 as you print them anyway and you can't use the custom hardware of the Amiga to do that. The only thing you actually use the chip RAM for is for temporary buffers, things like the screen. Even the sound can sit outside of chip RAM and be copied in as it's required. The biggest problem is panel space because *Primal Rage* has a very big panel by comparison with *MK2*, and even though there is a lot less digitised speech which

may have sat in chip RAM previously, the larger program is squeezing into this space and this could become a problem in the future. This panel also effects processing time, slowing things down considerably. However because the graphics are in eight colour instead of 12 colour as in *MK2*, there is less data to manipulate and this will help.

AD: Has working with eight colours been a disadvantage?

RC: Not really. Drawing the components is actually faster because you are using less data and as far as the look of the graphics go, the reason why we couldn't do it the same way we did *MK2* was because in that game four colours were shared between the two fighters and obviously if you have got two human beings they've got skin tones, so it's easy to do that. But with dinosaurs, as in *Primal Rage*, they're all different colours, all blues for one, all reds for another, so they've got to have individual palettes. Because they are more or less one colour, Vertigo for instance is mainly blue, seven shades of blue and transparent looks quite nice.

AD: Last month James Stewart told us that the Amiga version was based heavily on the Genesis version, what original features and changes will you make?

RC: Basically the processor in the Genesis is the same as the Amiga so any logic code can be transferred directly. My job is to do what you can see on screen – sprite routines, audio routines, disk access etc, etc. Coming back to the disk access, that is one of the major stumbling blocks, and the main reason why I can't just drop the Genesis logic in. Obviously with a console, the cartridge is all memory so everything is accessible all the time. In the Amiga you've got 1Mb of RAM, which is three or four times smaller than a Genesis cartridge and everything is on floppy disk.

As an example, on the cartridge there is a separate file for each of the characters and one large projectile file. As projectiles are used the cartridge enables this file to be accessed. With my version I have had to cut down this projectile file and put an individual one with each of the fighters and that will increase my character set size.

AD: How many disks will you manage to get all of this onto?

RC: Three. I think.

ROF: Yes, three.

RC: You've only got seven characters in *Primal Rage* but they're much larger than the ones I worked on for *MK2*. However because of disk limitations you're still stuck with about 230 or 240k per character, which is a pretty paltry amount when you consider that in the original planning of *Primal Rage* for the Genesis they were talking about 1Mb charac-



ters, which is the whole of the Amiga's memory (at this point Richard laughs maniacally). It's rather a problem. However, because we're using eight colours the graphics are about 20 to 30 percent smaller than the console version so that starts us off in good stead.

AD: Because of this memory restriction, is there going to be any limitation on the moves each character can execute? Will they be the same as the arcade version?

ROF: We're not looking at reducing the amount of moves, and can't foresee doing so.

AD: Richard, how does that affect you? There are some complicated moves and animations to deal with.

RC: You've basically got two options. You can increase compression and you can remove frames. You start off by making the compression as tight as you can to still enable a decent update on screen, and at this very moment that's what I'm doing. I've created a couple of character sets and the guy who's writing the compression will take over and try to compress them to

the smallest size possible within the speed restraints. I'll then take the resultant files and work with the artist to see if we can take out any further animations and still maintain continuity. In the end, if we haven't got what we want we'll have to look at removing sequences, which is the most efficient way of reducing file size.

ROF: We've got to be careful not to remove sequences or moves from *Primal* because a lot of them interact with each other, and we won't get away with removing them willy nilly to save space. We are loath to do this.

AD: You're working with an A500, which is the lowest common denominator. What does this mean in terms of what's available for higher spec Amigas?

RC: In fact I'm working on slightly different versions for each extra bit of memory available. They are not completely different versions in terms of them being different programs or anything, but if the extra memory is there I'm going to use it because it removes things like disk swapping, makes it look a bit prettier in places, and will definitely make it faster, less jerky.

AD: What about hard drive installation?

RC: To be honest there hasn't been any software written to date which reliably accesses Amiga hard drives, so really this is not the kind of game you can do on a hard drive. Which is a shame, because it would be really useful. But then how many Amiga users have a hard drive?

AD: I think a lot of them have, and it would be nice to

have more software with an install option. But working with hard drives does mean that you need buffer space in RAM.

RC: I was having this discussion with someone else, and to use *MK2* as an example, I figured that I only had 48 bytes of memory left out of 1Mb, and where do you put machine code stack? It goes down towards the vectors, and if it gets any smaller then the game is going to crash.

AD: Ahem, very technical. I'll leave this up to you. When do you expect to finish?

RC: Well, all we're waiting for now is the Genesis code. I've gone as far as possible without this, but it will be finished by the end of May and once it has been bug tested I can drop it into my version and start modifying it. This process will take about a month or so, so we're looking at the beginning of July if all goes well.

AD: So everything's on schedule then?

ROF: Yes. Because of the way the game is being converted we are able to check it at all stages and thus when we start testing the finished product, before handing it to Time Warner, most of the hard work and problems have already been sorted out along the way and in the Genesis version.

There's still some way to go, but the screenshots you see here are from the eight colour Amiga version and it looks impressive. Next month we should be able to see and have a bash at a fully working version and find out more about just how many moves the characters have and what they're like. ■

A long, long time ago in a galaxy not a million miles away from Chris Roberts a 3D, first person perspective space flight sim did the same for arcade flight shoot 'em ups as what *Doom* is now doing to the land based shoot 'em up. It was released on Amiga and played

well enough on high end machines, but was a bit treacley on standard A500s and other non-AGA machines. Unfortunately although there have been many follow ups and rivals on the PC (most notably *X-Wing*) there have been few on Amiga.

Enter *Star Crusader* which is being converted to the Amiga by a company called Human Soft. It's very similar in concept to *Wing Commander*

except it's even more of an all encompassing strategy game, allowing you to fly combat missions for either of the main protagonists in a stellar battle for supremacy. There will be a choice of eleven different ships to fly and 100 different missions.

The in-flight combat perspective remains similar to WC but the graphics are much more detailed, with full advantage taken of the AGA chipset, with improved clarity and depth. The most modern aspect of the game though is its use of 3D rendered characters in the cut scenes and between missions. Fighting is made more interesting too by the inclusion of combat in asteroid fields.

Rather than just taking on the enemy in a series of battles, you have specific strategic objectives



to reach and progress is mapped out as you go along. To round things off there should be an action replay and mission rewind function included so that you can re-live those moments of enemy ship destruction.

If the game looks as good as the preview screens we've seen and plays as fast, or nearly as fast as the PC version then we could be on to a winner. Watch this space for a review. ■

If imitation is the sincerest form of flattery then Acid software can take pleasure if not money from Italian programmers Floating Point effort. That is if some its jolly antipodean crew could get a car around the track without running off it into a no-man's land that looks smooth as a baby's behind but is lumpier than bio-yoghurt when you drive into it. Ten seconds of frustration and

backwards-forwards jiggling later brings you back onto the track. And if Acid software were still playing at this point I'd say they were drunk (which is not altogether improbable).

Once on the track everything is much better, the car moves well, corners well, reacts to bumps well and collisions are smashing fun (and yes, pun watchers, I did intend this one) with all manner of vehicular catapulting japes resulting from contact. The tracks, like the backgrounds are rendered affairs and suffer from having lots of nice textures, but not enough features. This makes it difficult to judge where dangerous undulations lie and the result is often a session in the bio-yoghurt.

Wheelspin is a one or two

player game where you can control one of a variety of vehicles; road racers, drag cars or overlanders in a race against four other competitors. You have a choice of invented international driving stars to man your vehicle too, and in this respect it's a bit like *Streetfighter 2* meets *Super Skidmarks* as the choice of road warrior effects the performance of your car, with each one having different abilities.

There is the requisite shop for upgrading engines, tyres and running gear and the terrain varies from show to hills to deserts.

If I sounded a tad critical at the start it's just that the work in progress version I tested is just that, very much an unfinished product. Lurking beneath this ultra smooth but fairly featureless exterior is a good game engine that could carry *Wheelspin* far if enough attention is paid to getting the look and playability right. We'll have to wait and see. We should have a review over the next few months. ■

The game is divided up into four sections, the first three of which involve controlling one of the characters, while the fourth enables you to switch between them. Each character's actions and abilities are defined by their personality; the woman is a red headed femme fatale (known coincidentally as Donna Fatale, and not a million miles away in terms of looks from our April cover cartoon), the nerd is a computer buff while the funniest character is the beaten up Italian

boxer with the big chin and the tiny brain.

Because it is a direct port *Big Red Adventure* is fairly close to completion and is due for release in June. With Warner Interactive's *Flight Of The Amazon Queen* also due for release that month it looks as though graphic adventure fans are in for a big treat this summer. ■

Vulcan's joystick operated *Valhalla* series, with speech (rather annoying and high pitched in the first one) and difficult puzzles was moderately popular. Now, rather than bringing out another instalment in the series they've decided to try something different.

Timekeepers involves a group of future cops who have to save the world from a crazed alien who has placed nuclear weapons in four time zones; stone age, mediaeval, Vietnam

and space. The demo version we looked at, set in the mediaeval land, hit me with a sudden sense of deja vu. Surely this is *Valhalla* from a high altitude bird's eye perspective? The palette used and the style of the interface is very, very similar and the tiled floor, corridors, doors and traps are almost identical. Detractors from the *Valhalla* series would find themselves in a nightmare world upon loading up this disk: it's got fourteen Lord Of Infinity lookalikes who look up from time to time, just to remind you of the game's origins.

The style of gameplay is more *Lemmings*-esque than *Valhalla* though. The object is to guide all sixteen cops through the level, fighting guardians, opening doors, extending bridges and solving complex

routing problems. Inevitably you'll lose some of the men along the way, but if there are too many casualties you may not be able to defuse the bomb at the end.

In order to get the cops to do something you need to give them instructions. This is done by picking what you want to do from an icon bar at the bottom of the screen and then placing an instruction on a tile in front of the cop you want to carry it out. To send him in a certain direction you simply place a directional arrow and he will go as far as possible in the direction chosen. Getting anywhere successfully involves planning the route in advance and you can scroll the screen upwards to plot your course of action and then place icons at strategic points.

Although this level does look like *Valhalla* the other levels should provide welcome variety and the game is certainly more accessible and puzzle orientated than the *Valhalla* series. It is due to be released in June as a budget-priced title, with a total of sixteen levels (four for each land). We'll have a full review next month. ■

You get to play a rampant capitalist trying to make the most money and create the highest consumption of power possible without wrecking the ecosystem of our planet. And if you manage to do that you will be one step ahead of reality (OK, enough of that political stuff, get on with it - Ed).

The scenario is that you are in competition with three other megalomaniacs to create the most wealth and a high share price by exploring the planet and selecting the best means of providing power to each part. You can use unrenewable (not

in the next 10-20 million years at any rate) fossil fuels or elect to use nuclear power, hydro electric or wind generation, or a host of others. Negotiation for rights to extract fossil fuels, or set up power stations with various governments adds to the reality.

Like most current PC ports *PowerHouse* will only be available for A1200 and A4000, but the advantages that AGA graphics give it are immense. This game looks like equalling or bettering the graphic quality achieved with *Sim City 2000* though depending on how many animations and special features remain in the Amiga version it also runs the risk of being slow. However Impressions



are still confident of making it acceptable on a base level A1200. We'll see. ■

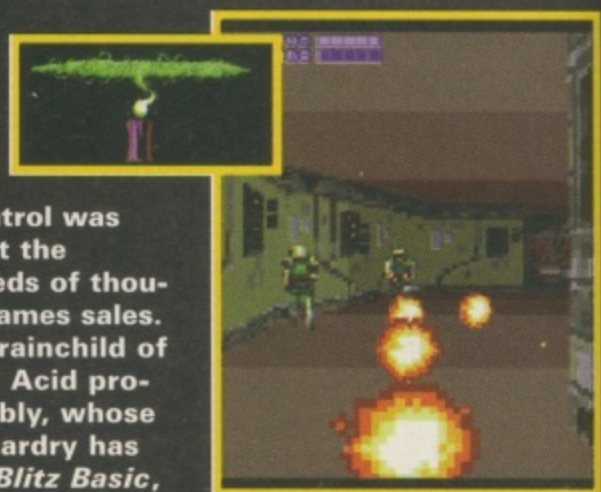

Gloom is anything but gloomy. When it first arrived into the office it immediately went to the top of the 'must see and talk about list'. 'Cor, that's better than *Fears*' was the analysis of one young CU Amigan, another claimed 'it's better than *Doom*', but we sent them to the shop to get some sense. He had a point though, for something the critics claimed was not possible, *Gloom* is much more than a passable attempt at recreating the atmosphere of the game that has taken the PC and console world by storm. In fact *Gloom* and *Fears* have, between them, caused a minor stir in the pants of various software

house moguls as pound signs ching-chinged their way onto their eyeballs and sphincter control was temporarily lost at the thought of hundreds of thousands of Amiga games sales.

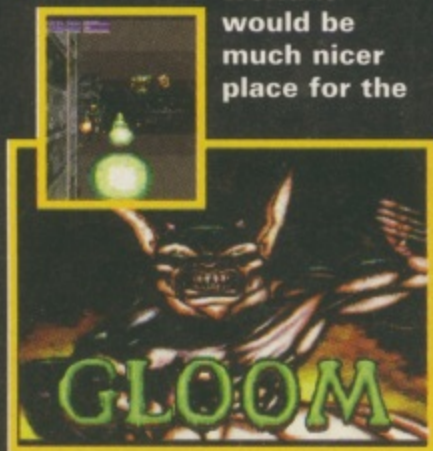
Gloom is the brainchild of the bleach-haired Acid programmer Mark Sibly, whose programming wizardry has already given us *Blitz Basic*, two superb *Skidmarks* and a vector game called *Guardian*, which some of you might remember was pretty spectacular.

The game is essentially very similar to *Doom* in everything but name (actually, forget I said that, it's really very similar in name too) and to allow playability to rule you can adjust the screen resolution and size to suit your machine, although it runs fine in full screen mode on a standard A1200. Even in low-res the graphics are more than acceptable, unless you are perched right up against the screen.



There are two play modes, Messy and Meaty, which govern the amount of gore you are likely to see, and that is a lot. The big difference between modes is that in Meaty the gore remains where has been spilled, even if the little blood spots on your screen become annoying after a while. There are weapon power-ups, doors and lots and lots of enemies to spice up the levels too. Watch out *Fears* and *AB3D*, *Gloom* could steal the show. ■

Viruses eh? Bad news. They mess up your body, they mess up your mind, they mess up your computer, they mess up your pool table ... er, pardon? Read on ...

An antibody. What a terrible name for something which is actually rather useful. I used to read horror novels and I definitely saw horror movies long before biology arrived on my school curriculum and thus spent a sizable part of my youth thinking that an antibody was like an Antichrist, only worse. It stands to reason: If it's anti-your-body, it's gonna kill you, right? Horribly. A quick cuff on the back of the head by my Biology master (a priest, would you believe) soon cured me of this delusion in no uncertain terms.

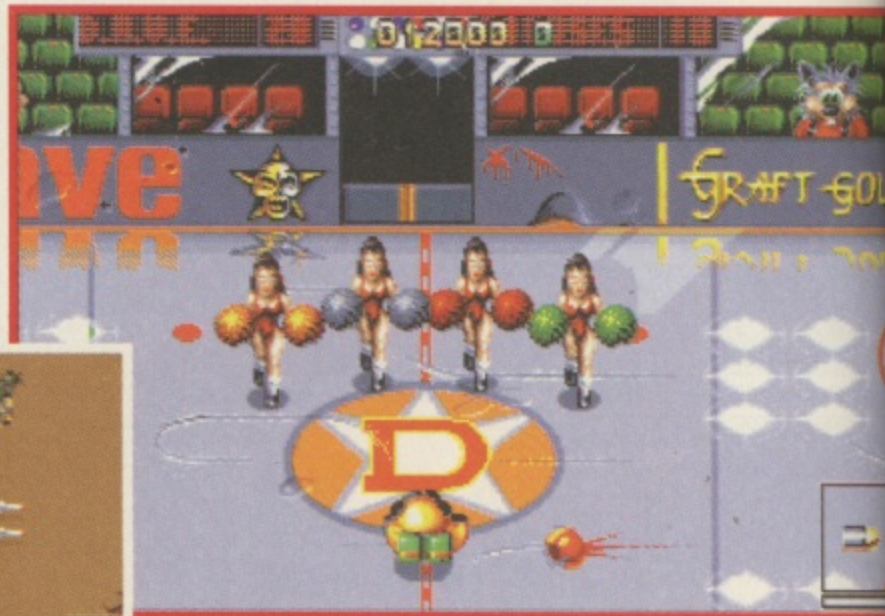
The hero of this game is a sort of antibody. A mechanised, armed, robot antibody, called DAVE or the Digital Armed Virus Exterminator. And the storyline is short but sweet: Viruses (who look like green Jabba The Huts) have inhabited a virtual games theme park called GameDisk and DAVE is sent in to sort them out. The gameworld is split into several zones some of which pay homage to an awful lot of popular games from the past.

Wonderful worlds

You start off in the sports world which is filled with American football gridirons, pool tables, baseball parks and bouncing footballs. You then move into a platform world called the urban jungle, where you have to climb terraces, speed around the roofs of houses and cross platforms. The next level is the gods level, where everything is in miniature, except the viruses and DAVE. Here tiny troops attempt to stop you, but inevitably end up dying horribly in

Cannon Fodder style.

The Adventure world, known as Crusader is filled with swamps, castles, ghouls and knights while the final world, Silicon Valley is right in the depths of the computer that controls GameDisk and the surroundings are circuit board, chip and transistor orientated.

The type of enemy varies widely throughout these levels, from pool balls, American footballers, Scalextrix F1 cars and kids on space hoppers in the sports world to microchips and guided missile turrets in Silicon Valley. As mentioned earlier some of the levels and creatures pay homage to the past: there are whirlwinds which turn into demons (like *Ghouls 'N' Ghosts*) and the adventure level has swamps filled with frogs reminiscent of *Chaos Engine*.

ViroCop has been produced by Graftgold, with the magic hands of Andy Braybrook, Iain Wallington and Steve Turner at the keyboard and this pedigree and quality shows. Everything is smooth, from near perfect sprite detection to a fast, economic and intelligent loading routine – which means that it's a pleasure to play from disk. But just in case, it's hard disk installable. (Praise be! A platform game that's hard disk installable. There is a god.) Also, just in case you've any doubts as

to who is responsible for the game there are plenty of hints, logos and famous characters from past ventures on the background scenery.

Weapons

DAVE has three weapons slots which, at the beginning, are filled with a single shot gun, a grenade launcher and a mine layer. These can be added to by picking up icons that provide you with a range of weapons including a multi-direction, multi-shot gun, a smart bomb which causes damage to anything and everything on screen, an invincibility shield and destructor drones.

Throughout each level you can pick up and store power icons that allow you to shop in between levels. The 'shop' is like a printed circuit board with connectors to 12 different weapons. To make a weapon available for use you need to power it up. These weapons include mines, lasers, guns and homing missiles. The

pick-ups from terminated enemies, try not to get killed and use the points collected to reach the weapon of your choice, either in one go or in several stages.

Protects DAVE, but not that well really.

CENTRAL BOX
This figure represents the amount of power icons you've picked up.

SHORT FLAMER

more useful the weapon, the more power you need to get it. Once you have more weapons available you can insert them into any of DAVE's three slots, picking the best weapon to deal with a particular situation.

The password system, which is unique to each copy of the game (you won't be able to use another person's level codes), records the level, the amount of lives and the weapons you have available for use. This means that

you can go back and pick a more appropriate weapon to deal with an enemy second time around.

Conclusion

Although it has a two-player mode you still have only one DAVE, with one player controlling his movement and the other controlling his firepower. This system tends to lead to heated arguments when the controller doesn't go in the direction the gunner wants them to. The only other problem is that although Graftgold

have gone to great pains to make each world unique, the gameplay doesn't differ that much between them. The platform level isn't significantly different from the regular fare, nor is the shoot 'em up one.

Never fear though, you're unlikely to get bored. *ViroCop* is great fun throughout and the difficulty curve is just about right. Original and not-so original enemy sprites are a joy to behold and you can't help laughing at some of them - until they kill you that is. Progressively getting hold of

new weapons and selecting the right ones for the mission on hand means that you never get put off and always return to a level to beat all the bad guys and to collect enough power points to get a really big weapon.

In summing up I have to say that *ViroCop* is a well planned, superbly executed game that gets a bit predictable from time to time, but remains good fun and highly addictive. ■

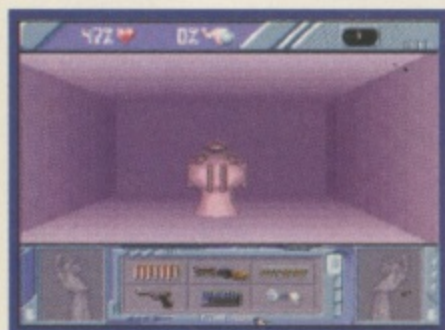

Yet another Doom contender steps into the ring. Take your places gentlemen.

It's enough to bring a tear to even R2D2's eye. All his criminal robot mates have been banged up in UIS Facility 6, the world's largest robot detention centre, for some time now. It's home to a range of naughty robots, convicted for crimes ranging from blowing people up to stealing castor oil. Now the robots have turned, a full scale riot is breaking out and you've got to sort it out.

How? Why the usual RPG way of course which involves scrolling around a three dimensional world picking up some heavy duty weaponry and blasting the hell out of those errant robots. But, as in life, it's not that simple really. You've got to find your way

around the huge complex, opening up the gates that have so far kept the robots at bay. Opening these gates involves flicking levers and finding keys and sliders to fit the locks.

Once you're through a gate and into a certain section of the huge complex you need to hunt around carefully to see what you can pick up in the way of weapons, bullets, keys, sliders or energy boosters.

Activating action

Once you've worked your way through each section picking off robots as you go, you need to activate any bombs that may be lurking around before you can progress to the next level. Did I say activate bombs? Yes because your boss has decided the best way to make sure that all your robots are dead is to blow the whole place up. This can be a pain as the bombs tend to have a minuscule fuse which leaves you a nanosecond to get to the exit, or worse still it blows just before you get out, leaving you start all over again.

If you do manage to make through the exit, you're into the

shop where you can trade in the robots you've killed for some extra weapons. And so you continue until the world is free from nasty varmint robots and law and order is restored.

A contender for the crown

As *Doom* contenders go, *BTIG* scores and fails on various points. It scores because the 3D graphics are fast and it's involving enough to keep you occupied for quite some time. But it fails when it comes to the control method. There are four control options, which are all different variations of using either a joystick or a mouse to control movement, to pick up and use items.

Alternatively you can use a combination of both the mouse and joystick. This involves using a joystick for movement and the mouse for clicking on items. However, firing at aliens requires some pretty quick hand changing action which can be infuriating. Picking up items is also a bit of challenge. Who would think that a rather large key would take so many attempts to actually pick up? In some cases even though the item is right in front of you,

you need to perform some sort of strange ritual two step to actually pick it up – bizarre. The graphics are also quite blocky but RPG fans will agree that the gameplay is normally more important than flash graphics. The low throbbing noise in the background does nothing to add to the game either.

Behind the Iron Gate is involving enough but the complicated control method knocks a few points off. ■

A decent beat 'em up upon thine CD32? Surely thou jest! But no, for tis true ...

When the CD32 appeared I rejoiced for a number of reasons. Obviously I had rather hoped that it would become the most popular machine in the world ... but it didn't happen. Though this was most probably due to that crap advert featuring 'Professor Silly Old Sod' ranting on about "so many colours" etc. It takes more than that to keep us down at happy old CU Towers, and the CD32 still offered Amiga users the chance to sample games the likes of which we'd never seen before (er... in theory, that is).

Of course, the reality of the situation was that all we'd get were old A1200 products with the odd bit of ray-tracing and it seemed as though no-one was ever likely to take advantage of the CD32's six button joypad.

Oooghya!

Well, we still await the day when someone produces a beat 'em up that makes use of these buttons, but at least now there's a decent fighting game that helps itself to a generous portion of the CD media. *X-Fighter* is an interesting product in a number of ways. Firstly, it's from Thalion - a company hardly famous for anything other than RPGs and Flight Sims. Secondly, it's the first time out for the solo programmer. And lastly, the game's bloody weird from start to finish!

The first thing that hits you about *X-Fighter* is the unattractive graphics (hmm, not too good so far). Next up

comes the complete lack of music and the rather limited sound effects that crunch and heave in the background (hmm, still not looking groovy). Then you play the thing, and ... HORRAH!! The eagle has landed!

Yes indeed, if there's one thing that saves this game, it's the sheer playability and 'feel' of the thing. The characters (of which there are 32 - yes 32!) move in a quirky yet responsive way, and with *Mortal Kombat*-like special moves, it won't be too long before you've picked out your favourite fighter and are beating your way to the top.

Bunch of fives

I've already told you that there are 32 characters to choose from (which goes some way towards explaining why the game has been put out on CD only, rather than a billion floppies) but I haven't mentioned that they are grouped into eight separate teams. These teams range from standard groups such as martial artists and Ninjas, to less usual gangs such as bouncers and greasers (chain-wielding leather-clad nutters).

Though it's disappointing to see only a single fire button used, this does mean that you can plug a joystick in for two player japes, and the moves are about as easy to pull off as humanly possible. There are also a number of options for two-player games, including tag teams (with multiple

characters from any group making up your overall tournament 'team') and 'see-saw' bouts. Here, the standard power bars are replaced by one huge bar that moves back and forth in a 'tug-o-war' kinda way as the two contestants battle it out. This makes for longer matches, and works especially well when used by two players of similar skill. Unfortunately, this option isn't available for the single player. Damn it.

Combos ahoy

Another interesting feature with *X-Fighter* is that there's no limit to the number of combinations you can perform. Boot your opponent into the air, punch him on the way up, jump up and kick him again, land and punch him back up as he comes down, etc. etc. Yep, you can keep this up for as long as your control is spot on, and being awarded 15 hit combos isn't unusual once you get the feel for your character's movements and abilities - especially with the Super Combos. 'What Super Combos?' I hear you ask. Aha...

If you've managed to hit your opponent a certain number of times in rapid succession, the words 'Super Available' appear by your power bar. It's then up to you to pull off a *Mortal Kombat*-esque movement (such as down, left, down, right, fire) to initiate a sort of auto-pilot attack, where your player goes into a set-piece

sequence of moves. Needless to say, should you manage to time and position your player correctly, this does a fair bit of damage.

So there you are. Yes, it looks a bit arse and yes, it sounds a bit arse too, but scratch beneath the poor presentation and you'll find a responsive and addictive beat 'em up. Step up CD32 users - your time has come! ■

F1 World Championship Edition

The popular console racing game has finally made it over to the Amiga with a few extra features too.

With the Amiga conversion of the console favourite F1, Domark are the latest software house to return to the Amiga fold. OK, F1 may have been kicking around on the consoles for at least eighteen months now but it was well received there and should be more than welcome among the Amiga racing fraternity, who have been starved of a decent racing game for some time now.

F1 Championship Edition is a first person perspective racing game which throws you into the glamorous world of Formula One racing. Glamorous, I suppose, to those who actually enjoy the prospect of being severely mangled in a claustrophobia-inducing sardine can on wheels. In F1 you can rub shoulders with the likes of Damon Hill or Schumacher amongst others depending on which team you join. The teams include Ferrari, Benetton, Williams, Jordan, Minardi, Tyrrell, McLaren and Lotus.

After a few laps in the practice rounds you can either enter a knockout tournament or a world championship competition. In the knockout tournament you must make into the top eight otherwise you don't go on to the next round. The Championship runs over up to 16 circuits. Choosing from tracks such as Montreal, Australia, Germany and Brazil

amongst others, you get to pick which ones and in which order you will race them. You can also set the number of laps per race (5, 10, 20).

Qualifying

Before you start the championship races you've got to qualify. Building a up a fast lap time in the qualifying round ensures you a good position on the grid. Before each race you're informed of the best lap time and the weather conditions so you can nip into the pits to make any adjustments necessary. Then you're off into the race, trying to get ahead and stay on road despite twisty bits and adverse weather conditions. Control is simple enough – a light touch to the joystick to the left or right should keep you on track if you've selected auto gears. If you've chosen manual gears then pressing fire and the joystick either up or down will move through the gearbox.

Control

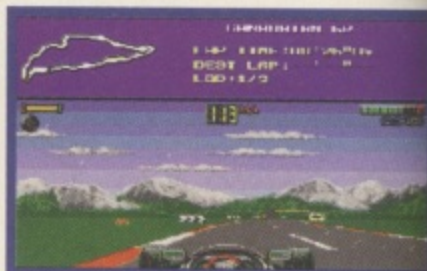
Personally, I prefer first person perspective racing games to the overhead variety. There is more a sense of actually being in the car

than overhead racing games and this is certainly true of F1. The smooth control and road handling also gives the impression of total control over the car. The graphics are fairly good too, with each track having its own unique graphics (mountains for Montreal and so on), but don't expect to drive past the casino at Monaco. Most of the scenery is of the standard scrolling horizon type. However, unlike the original F1 there are more track-side objects which also add to the overall racing experience.

The sound effects, however, are quite tame. Crashing headlong into a trackside hoarding (I was only testing I swear) produces a pathetic puny pinging sound – disappointing. Also, timing a pitstop can be incredibly difficult. The handy map at the top helps you memorise where the pit stop is but it doesn't seem to help you pull into one smoothly. I've often pulled into a pitstop and shot straight through into the barriers at the end! Bad driving performance? I hear the doubting Thomases of you murmur. Perhaps. Why not try it out for yourself and see. Racing fans

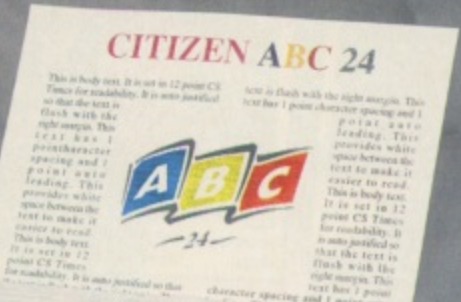

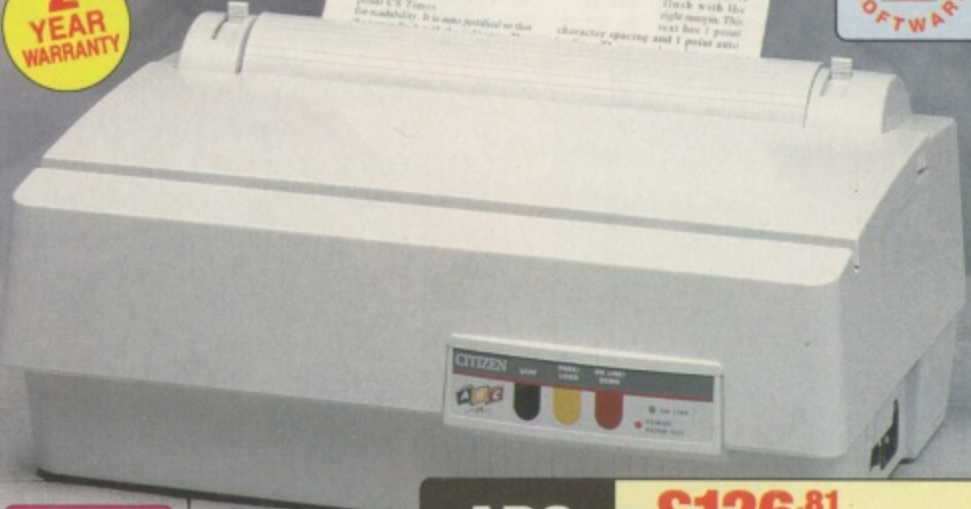

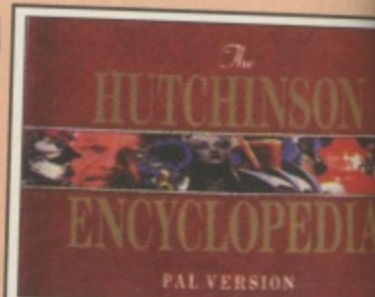

In the light of reports of magazines rating unfinished copies of this game, we check out the final version.

You own an Amiga. You walk up to me in the street and prod me gently but firmly in the chest with a well manicured forefinger. "Hey fella," you demand aggressively, "which is the best football management sim currently available on God's own recently resurrected computer platform?" I would have no hesitation in recommending several recent releases to you, *On the Ball*, *Premier Manager 3*, even *Ultimate Soccer Manager*, (at a push) but crucially, I would stop short of urging anyone to go out and spend a penny on *Tactical Manager 2*.

Out of date

Tactical Manager 2 is the follow up to *Tactical Manager*, which most people rated quite highly. The 'new' game (not my word but Black Legend's) shows few signs of having developed graphically and one's first impression is

game like this really stands or falls by. A pity then, that they are completely out of date. I chose to manage Reading, who appeared without Lee Nogan and a cursory glance at the team I am silly enough to support, Aston Villa, revealed that Guy Whittingham was still on the books, while Tommy Johnson and Gary

Charles remained at Derby. As did Gordon Cowans, who has been at Wolves for yonks. Oh, Andy Cole is still at Newcastle United! I am sure you will spot many more such howlers. Now call me Mr. Pernickety, but the football season is over. All the players I have just mentioned completed their transfers several months before the game was due for release. Surely the

clever thing to do, at the very least, would be to include the squads as they stood at the end-of-season? With the promise of a free update disk after the next transfer deadline? Please may I use the word 'ARSE' in CU Amiga? Even

Sensible World of Soccer has more up to date stats than this! On the positive side, *Tactical Manager 2* is easy enough to find your way around and in this sense it is playable, but the graphics and in-game screens/menus look tired and creaky. Take the play match window and compare it to *OTB* and *Premier Manager 2/3* and the game fails to cut the interactive mustard.

Data problems

Finally, and in my view, crazily, *Tactical Manager 2* only has data for the Premier League and the Endsleigh Division 1. As the new manager of Reading, I should liked to have strengthened my squad by cherry-picking from the lower divisions, but they aren't there, so I can't. Surely the omission of Divisions 2 and 3 saps the game of any pretension to realism?

What's the point of including the FA Cup and denying me the opportunity of managing the majority of teams who play in it? These omissions also mean that you can't learn management at a lower level and for all you romantics out there, you can forget about steering Lincoln City or Kidderminster Harriers to the dizzy heights of The Premiership.

Is it finished?

Publisher Black Legend has just taken an enormous ad in the computer trade press, under the



banner headline, 'A whole new ball game' to promote the release of *Tactical Manager 2* and counter an earlier review which awarded the game 25 percent. The ad explains that the magazine in question received an unfinished copy. What, I wonder will it say to retailers now that the final version is released to cat-calls of derision from the consumer press? Something along the lines of 'I'm taking my ball back', I shouldn't wonder. ■

Ultimate Soccer Manager tips

Getting a team to the top in this game isn't just about good soccer skills, you've got to have a top business head too ...

Ultimate Soccer Manager is an honest attempt to recreate the thrills and spills of modern football management by including such features as bungs, match fixing, shop and bar running, advertising and merchandising. For those used to the old days, when a management game was a management game, these hints and tips could come in handy.

Wise buys

First of all, it's pretty obvious, but don't be too hard on yourself. Start off with the maximum amount of money: £5M. Make sure that you use all of the friendlies to good effect, testing out your team for weaknesses and getting the right players into position. You have enough money to replace slackers, so do so. The most important positions are striker and goal keeper, so spend money on these for maximum success. Also, use the first season to build up your grounds, but be sure to fill them. You'll find that

as time goes on inflation sets in and the price of improvements goes up. Advance preparation with all that cash will help.

Build the biggest refreshment and merchandise stands you can afford, you will make a lot of money from all the merchandise they stock. Following on from this, if you are getting very low attendances and your gate receipts look as though they will never pay the team's way build a 10,000 seater stadium and give away upwards of 6000 tickets. You won't get their money at the gate but you'll sure sell lots of clobber through your shops.

On the subject of attendance, if the crowd get bored with you using the long ball option in every game they will give up and stop supporting you. You must play to impress, believe it or not.

Hotdog hints

Spread your outlets evenly around the ground, but don't build near a stand where there is low capacity or no capacity. It follows that you should put the best outlets near the biggest stands, this way you'll get maximum returns. On the subject of returns, keep your tickets at a fairly low level for regular league matches and friendlies, but as soon as a cup game comes along bump them up sky-high. Remember to plan your improvements so that by the time you reach the first division you have an all seater stadium. If you get promoted from Division 2 the FA will condemn the stand otherwise.

In terms of managing promotion and advertising, don't let your assistant sell ads on the ground, he'll get

really terrible deals, and usually for a long period too. Do this yourself and get the best money for the smallest space and the shortest amount of time, so that you can go back and sell to better revenue earners when it runs out.

Experiment with raising your overall level of ticket and goods prices every year, in line with inflation (of course). Up to 10% a year is not unreasonable, but remember that Ultimate Soccer Manager has a realistic business engine and sharp price increases will scare away customers. They will lose the feel good factor or something.

Deputy Dawg

The assistant manager may not be very good at picking advertising revenue earners but he is generally a top geezer for recommending team formations and changes, and before you pick a squad you should always heed what he says. Sometimes you may disagree but hey, that's the nature of the job, and you must do things your own way at times.

Although training seems to take a long time to work it is essential that you continue to supervise it. This is the only way to improve inexperienced or injured players, and you must remember to hire and fire trainers as the need arises and as they become available. Offering more money will bring more trainers onto the market. Young players may seem a bit useless at first, but they have their careers ahead of them and will train up a lot faster than your existing team. So go ahead, buy some.

Remember to keep the chairman happy too, if your job security percentage falls below 20% or the chairman's opinion falls below ten you are out on your ear, with no appeals. Do not ignore his messages on the notice board - you will only make things worse.

If you have only played USM

using the instant result feature and have not been having much luck lately, then try actually following the game through, making formation and play style changes to both the team and players, reacting to the opposition's strengths and weaknesses. See who is scoring goals for them and double team that player. Also, when you start out, carefully examine each player's stats and put the right ones in the right places. You should then monitor each player and try swapping say all the strikers and midfielders around. Despite their stats, some may operate more efficiently in a different part of the field than you are playing them.

If you want to get a player from the higher divisions but they all seem to refuse to move down, try luring an older player. They are often under utilised and are more willing to move clubs. While on this subject, try to rotate under-used players as they will begin to go soft, lose their skills and become dissatisfied if left on the bench too long.

Finally, on the subject of bungs and bets, at the beginning of the game we are reliably told that only 20% of the teams are corruptible. So if you're lucky you'll pick the right ones. This changes every time you start a new game so you are not guaranteed to find the same clubs being dodgy a second time around. As far as betting is concerned, when you have been caught four times (you'll know when you've hit the three mark because it'll be in the newspaper), you will be fired. On that note, we'll let you get on with it. But be careful ... you could bet caught.

In the wall behind the pearl that keeps disappearing notice a small hole, insert the snooker cue in here and the pearl is knocked to the floor allowing you to pick it up. This is for the spell. By now you will have found the objects you need to make a cake.

Put the cake tin on the stove in the kitchen and drop inside the egg, the flour and the sugar. Take the cake for use later on.

Add icing

Put Infinity's teddy bear on his bed and take his sleeping pills. Put these on the tomb of the insomniac near to the wizard's room. Take the nightmare spell and put this in front of the cook who up until now has told you to leave her alone because she is sleeping. Put the cake in front of her and she ices it for you.

In the carpenter's workshop put the picture onto the saw, take the piece of jigsaw that fits into the incomplete puzzle nearby. The chests open allowing you to

take a heavy ball and a door key. Put the piece of pipe next to the glass in the carpenter's workshop, travel to the other end of the pipe that it fits onto, then put the heavy ball down onto it. The ball rolls down the length of the pipe and smashes the glass that was hiding a potion of faith. Save this for later use.

Take the iced birthday cake and give it to the maid who has been telling you its her birthday and now informs you she was only joking. She gives you a sapphire for your trouble. The book of birthstones will inform you that it is the birthstone of Libra. Put the sapphire in the scales near to the Vaseline, take the sign of Libra and give it to the oracle who gives you a vase.

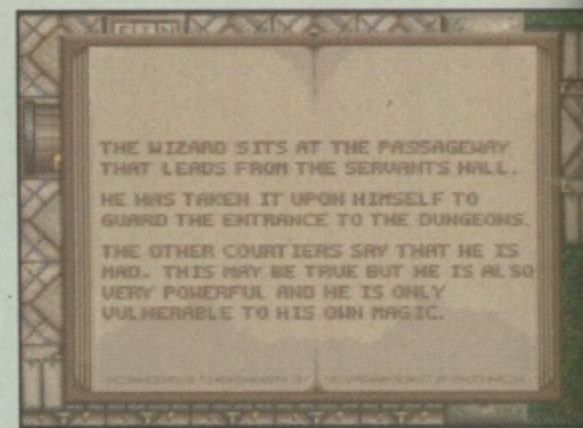
The key from the jigsaw chest opens the door into a room where there is an identical vase on one side of a locked door, place your vase opposite and the door opens, before you walk inside it would be a good idea to save the game as this is the maze. Pull the lever to open a door elsewhere then travel past the electrical device, once you have done so your potion time goes up and then begins to descend informing you how long you have before the door into the maze locks itself, the book at the entrance to the maze explains all about it.

Somewhere inside here is a chest for which you have the key and inside the chest is the wiz-

ard's staff which you need for your spell.

The lever in the maze opened the door below the carpenter's workshop and inside is an old man who tells you he is hungry. Notice also the potter's wheel on which you place the clay you would have found by now. Operate the button on the potter's wheel and take the soggy clay bowl. Put this on the kiln in the wizard's room and take the fired bowl. Fill this up with the stew from the kitchen and deliver it to the old man. He rewards you with a coin for the piggy bank in the maid's room, take the fan and the sword from inside the chests.

Back in the wizard's room put the fan on the left-hand altar that prevents you reaching the love letter. The fan blows the love letter of its perch so you can take it.



▲ Read these sacred words very carefully because you may need to remember them one day.



▲ I know, I know, dear, it's terrible about the price of cabbage these days.

Put the sword on the tomb of the jeweller nearby and take the jewels, put these on the tomb of the jeweller and take the pound note.

You now have all the ingredients for your spell: the pearl, the love letter, the pound note and the wizard's staff. Put all of these objects into the wizard's cauldron and take the banish spell in front of the wizard who disappears into the floor leaving the way clear into level two. ■

The stakes are being raised in the world of Amiga 3D rendering. As LightWave 4 nears completion, there's a new challenger from Germany in the form of Cinema 4D.

A quick browse at the pictures on this page should be enough to convince you that *Cinema 4D* is set to be a major player in the 3D rendering business.

LightWave might beat it on sheer number of features, but then not everyone has the kind of immensely powerful system needed to be able to use *LightWave* to anything like its full potential.

Cinema 4D has been designed to give powerful, professional features, without demanding system requirements that force

you a to get a second mortgage to even get hold of it.

Friendly interface

Cinema 4D is immediately approachable, thanks to its simple guide to functions of each icon. When you pass the pointer over an icon, you're given a brief description of its action, so within a couple of minutes, you're in no doubt as to what everything does. All of the menus are configurable, and the system of movable windows allows you to set up the screen to exact preferences.

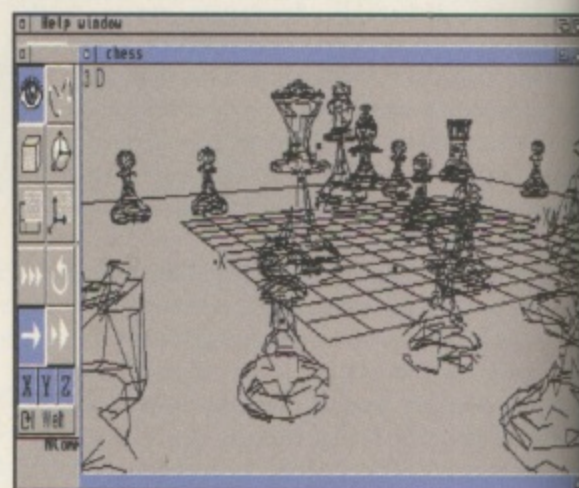
Scenes and objects can be viewed in any or all of four modes simultaneously (outline, draft, side and 3D). Apart from RAM limitations, there are no limits on the numbers of objects and polygons in each scene. The program will come with 13 basic objects, all of which can of course be tweaked and altered to your suit your specific requirements and needs.

Special effects

Cinema 4D looks likely to score highly on its range of special effects and rendering tricks. Simulated fog, rounding of edges, fractal routines for realistic landscape generation, divergent and parallel light all bode well.



▲ Before and after. After: a fully rendered 3D chess game in all its chequered and textured glory.

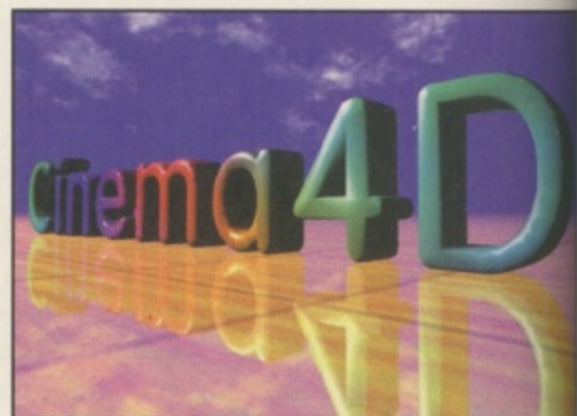


▲ Before: here we see the beginnings of various chess pieces. *Cinema 4D* seems to have a very friendly editor front end.

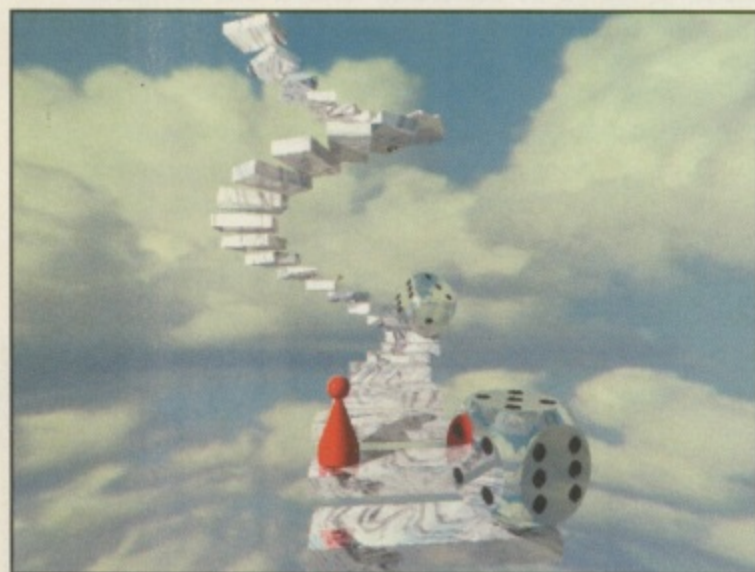
Rendering times are another main priority, and every effort has been made to keep these as low as possible.

While there are professional features by the bundle, and support for 24-bit graphics cards (Retina, Merlin, Picasso and all EGS boards), *Cinema 4D* will work on any Workbench 2 Amiga with 2Mb of RAM and a hard drive! With AGA Amigas still in short supply, that's got to be a good thing. We'll have a full review very soon. ■

Lightwave 4.0

LightWave got the Amiga's foot in the door of the professional animation and video industry. Now that Version 4.0 is shaping up for release, big time movie animator CU Amiga Magazine reports on its progress.

There can be very few Amiga enthusiasts who haven't heard of *LightWave 3D* and its award-winning use on popular TV science-fiction shows such as *Babylon 5* and *SeaQuest DSV*. Originally available only as part of the Video Toaster system, and therefore all but useless to British users (the Toaster was never made in a PAL version, necessary for UK TV use), a standalone version of *LightWave (3.5)* was finally released in the summer of 1994

By this time Commodore had slipped into liquidation, and to cover their backs, NewTek started work on conversions of *LightWave* for other platforms, specifically the PC and Silicon Graphics system. This switch in policy has

simultaneously benefited and hampered the progression of the Amiga version. On one hand it's ensured that *LightWave* continues to

grow and wedge itself further into the professional 3D animation industry, but on the other hand, the shift of emphasis to other platforms

Here it is - a glimpse of LightWave 4 in action

Let's put the new features of LightWave 4 to the test. Here we can see a sequence which I've created using an Amiga LightWave 4 test version. The characteristic LightWave lens flares have been enhanced by the use of the new 'fog' and 'glow' features. The Amiga version promises to be fast (it compares well on the 4000, even with a Pentium) and continues to have ARexx support - a definite advantage over its PC cousin.



has meant the updates to the Amiga version have been pushed further and further back.

Having made these commitments, NewTek missed one deadline after another and finally shipped a pre-release (ie unfinished) *LightWave 4.0* for the PC in April of this year. The latest estimate we've been given for an Amiga release of Version 4.0 is the latter half of June '95.

CD-ROM Only

LightWave 4.0 comes on four floppy disks and a CD-ROM, so you might expect a bonanza in terms of new goodies. The CD supplied with the PC Version 4.0 release (which is also expected to be shipped with the Amiga release) contains 84Mb of files, split into two sections, one following PC conventions (eight letter filenames followed by a three letter extension) and one for systems which accept long filenames, such as AmigaDos and Windows NT. This means that there is actually only 42Mb on the CD. What there is though, is very good indeed.

Unfortunately it's a bit of a mess. There are a number of errors involving the naming of files. For compatibility with MS-DOS (the lowest common denominator, as it were) most files have a name of up to eight letters, followed by a three-letter extension indicating the file type. These include:

- .IFF.....IFF image
- .LWS.....LightWave scene
- .LWO.....LightWave object
- .MAP.....Image map (usually a grey-scale)
- .PIC.....Picture
- .SCN.....Scene file (most now use .LWS)
- .SRF.....Surface
- .TGA.....Targa image

There's a problem with the naming of some of the files. When you load a scene, it goes looking for all of the objects and other files it needs. However, due to the omission of .LWO extensions on certain object files, and other filenames becoming abbreviated, they cannot be found. It's possible that a new CD may be compiled for the Amiga release, in which case this could be overcome. Let's hope so.

What's new?

I had expected to see a very different *LightWave* from the now-familiar 3.5 I use

everyday. However, with a few minor exceptions, such as the use of ASL file requesters, the look and feel is remarkably similar, and existing users should feel immediately at home.

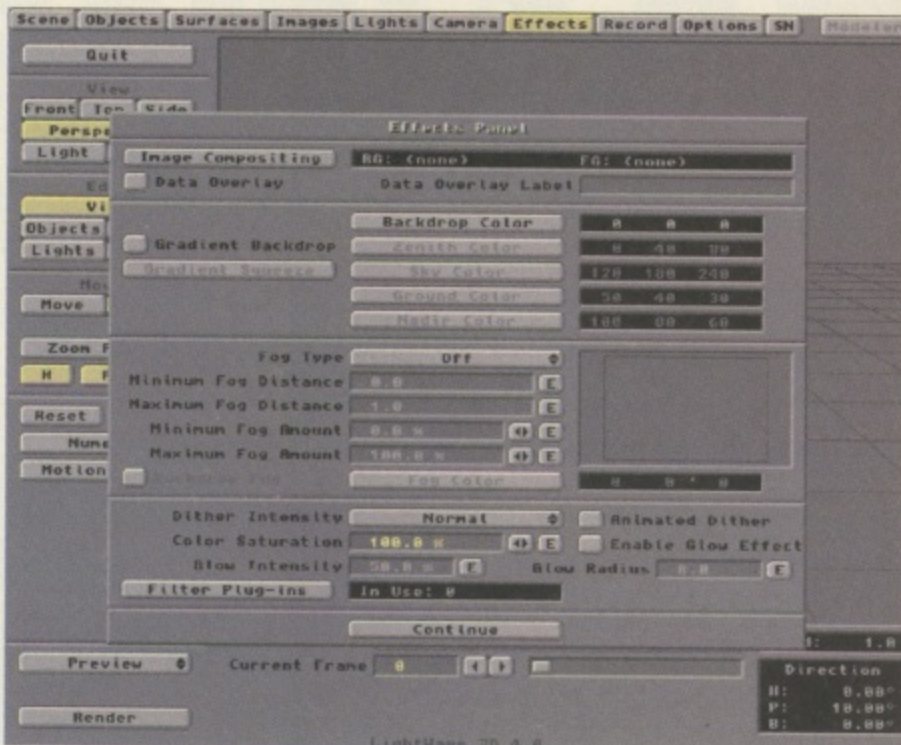
So, what's in Version 4.0? There are a number of new features to explore, and some minor changes have been made for compatibility across all versions.

The Modeler section remains virtually unchanged, and although there is a separate Redo feature, 3.5 always let you undo an undo anyway. The Macro button has changed its name to Custom, reflecting the wider range of options that will be available with the plug-ins from third parties. It appears that the 'moving solid' preview mode is likely to be dropped, but that's no great loss.

It is in the Layout program that most of the changes have taken place. Most of the main menus and requesters now sport a plug-ins button (see the screenshots here), but top of the list for many seasoned users will be the introduction of Inverse Kinematics. For those of you unfamiliar with IK, imagine for example that if I move a virtual fingertip to press a doorbell, the attached virtual arm, shoulder and body, if necessary, should follow through, according to rules previously established. This allows you to build up realistically moving interconnected parts, and animate them more realistically and with less hassle than before.

They've made a start, but it's a fairly rudimentary system so far. However, NewTek did warn that IK in *LightWave 4.0* would be pretty basic, but half a loaf is better than none, and you can expect rapid progress in this area both from NewTek themselves and from third-party plug-ins.

The glow feature is an absolute must for all those who want to make Ready-Brek ads, and a boon for all kinds of sci-fi and other effects too. On the other hand, adding glow to objects will seriously increase rendering times. Tested

on the Beta version, a simple logo with a lens flare thrown in for effect took 23 seconds without glow, but 74 seconds with glow switched on! However, this doesn't necessarily mean that the final release version will produce such extended rendering times.

Control over lens flares has improved, but there is still no way to set the number of rays for the Star Filter. Actually, some of this support was available in 3.5 but was via the undocumented LW-Irefs configuration file, frankly more trouble than it was worth! Nor is there any way to control the shape of the lens reflections, a feature that has been available in competitors' packages for some time now.

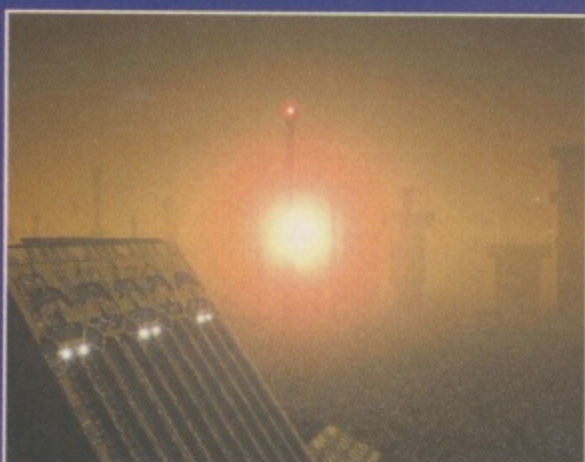
Another nice new feature, although currently only on the PC and Alpha versions is the surface preview window. When experimenting with surface attributes, you can map it onto a small sphere to get an idea of how it might look on your object. Initially, this was thought to be too processor-intensive to be worthwhile on the Amiga version, but after much outcry, the programmers are attempting to implement this feature on the Amiga.

Also planned for *LightWave 4.0* is much wider support for image file formats such as GIF and JPEG images, courtesy of Elastic Reality's HII P (Host Independent Image Protocol). Elastic Reality were formerly known as ASDG, the brains behind *Art Department Professional* and *Morph Plus*.

Still on top

It's easy to fall for the anti-Amiga hype and jump ship prematurely, but in our tests, a Pentium 90, supposedly 2 to 5 times faster than an A4000 with a Warp Engine, was barely 20% faster. Add to this the fact that the Windows interface is much slower than the Amiga's, not to mention the lack of ARexx and and you have to wonder why anyone would want to change. All being well, we should have a full, in depth review of *LightWave 4.0* (nothing short of the official Amiga release version that will appear on the shelves) very soon. ■

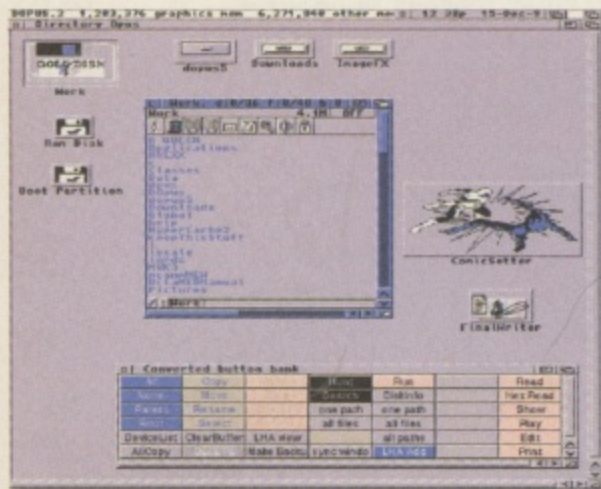

Directory Opus 4 went down a storm on our February cover disk. Now Version 5 has arrived, can it really be any better?

Directory Opus 4 was one of a kind. It's simplicity, power, and versatility won it friends and success around the world. It was such a beast that we covered a complete version of the program on our February 1995 issue. No wonder it shot to fame as the Amiga's best utility.

So when we heard the news that it was to be upgraded, more

than a little excitement swept through the CU Amiga Magazine offices. I've now had six months to play with it in various beta forms. I've also spent several weeks checking the final release version and I have to say it's even better than I thought when writing the preview.

Independence

Directory Opus 5 (Opus 5 from now on) works using a series of independent objects, all of which are separate tasks that can do their own thing while you work with other objects. The objects can be banks of buttons for controlling the program, or windows containing lists of files in disks and drawers. To give an example of this independent nature, imagine you had windows showing the contents of DF0, RAM and a hard drive. You could select something from the DF0 window, and copy that file over to the RAM drive window. Whilst it's copying you can go off and edit another file in the hard drive window.

But it gets better. In addition to basic file control, you can also display pictures and play sound samples. You can also process files in just about any other way you can think of. By assigning buttons to utilities and applications on your hard drive, you can make

mincemeat of previously awkward tasks, such as unpacking archive files, converting file formats and so on. Batch processing is simple, as all you need to do is select a number of files before you hit the relevant button.

And it gets better still. While Opus can work as a self-contained pro-

gram, it can also work with the Workbench or even as a complete replacement for Workbench. Any Workbench disk icon can have its contents displayed in an Opus window. This approach means that your screen can quickly fill up with lots of windows. This is one of the few problems of the new version. In the previous version you had just two listers (Opus refers to its windows as listers) and a bank of buttons along the bottom. All operations were carried out between these two listers. As a result you could use Opus 4 on a low resolution display (having only two listers to display).

With a 640 by 256 resolution screen, which many people will have, the Opus 5 screen can quickly fill up with masses of overlapping listers, which is messy, confusing and not nearly as friendly.

The whole set up of Opus 5 can be completely customised. Every aspect of it can be tailored to your taste and needs. New banks of buttons can be created, the style of the listers can be, you can even put buttons and icons inside listers so you don't need separate

windows for buttons, saving screen space.

Existing Opus users will be pleased to hear that the configurability is just as good as the previous version, if not better. Heck, it can even import Opus 4 configurations, although it came unstuck once or twice when I imported some really complex configuration files.

Amazing

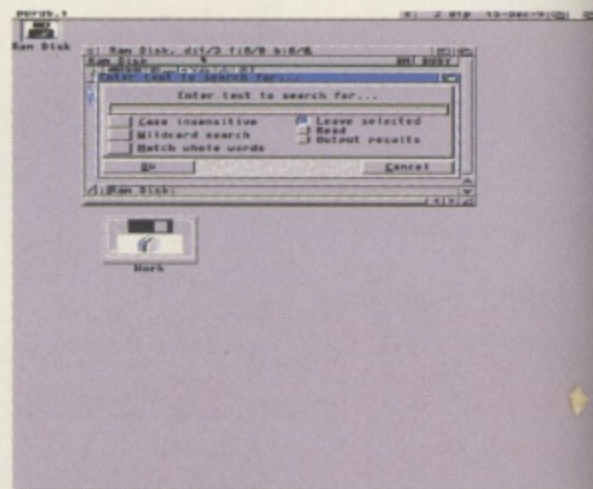
Opus 5 is astonishing. I know of no other program that takes advantage of the Amiga's multitasking capabilities in this way. Watching a lister simultaneously copy a huge collection of files from a download directory to a permanent hard drive drawer and a floppy for back-ups, while unarchiving an LHA file, and displaying a text file at once and one one screen is wonderfully impressive.

Its configuration capabilities also ensure it can grow with you and keep up as you use more advanced software. It's worth pointing out that you'll also get more out of Opus 5 as your knowledge grows because you find new and better ways of doing things.

However it's not all good news. In gaining the extra power it has lost a lot of its simplicity. You could easily use Opus 4 without referring to the manual, but you'll have trouble doing this with Version 5. This above everything else is the biggest weakness of

What is Opus?

Workbench was designed to be very friendly and allow new computer users to work with the Amiga without too much bother. The trouble with this is that all of the advanced features are tucked away and only accessible from the CLI (command line interface) window, which takes everything back to old fashioned MS-DOS style operations. Directory Opus was designed to overcome this problem, allowing the complex operations to be carried out quickly and easily, without sacrificing the ease of use.

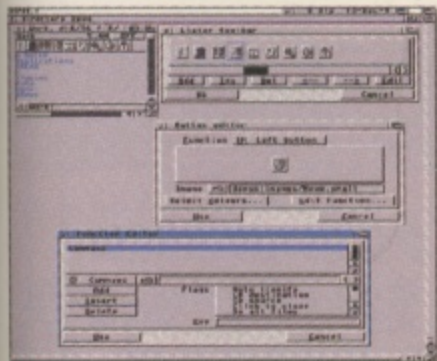


▲ Previously awkward search and find operations are made simple with Directory Opus 5's new features.

The authoritative review

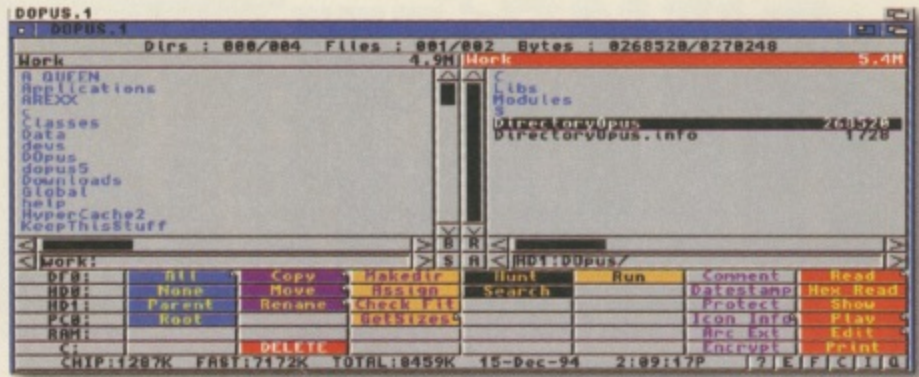
Several other magazines have reviewed unfinished beta versions of the program. However, there are differences between the beta version and the one that's currently on sale (Version 1.1). These differences are as follows. Firstly, Version 1.1 includes a sound module playback facility. This wasn't present in the beta test issues. This plays *OctaMED 4* modules, but doesn't include every module format around and we'd recommend you get hold of *DelTracker* (available from PD libraries) - which is much better. It wasn't included in the beta releases because GP Software didn't initially have rights to the one included with *Opus 4* (that came from Innovatronics) so they had to write a new one - this wasn't done until the main program code was finished.

Next, a hard drive is essential, not optional. While the whole concept of *Opus*, even Version 4, assumes you'll be using a hard drive, *Opus 5* is the first version that will only work if you have one. This is made perfectly clear in the final release version but those using or reviewing beta versions may have missed this rather important fact.

the new version. The only way around this would have been for GP Software to supply the program with a simple default configuration, similar to Version 4, capturing the instant ease of use factor of the earlier release. This would, however, have meant that most people never used the extra power that the program offers - something like 85% of *Opus 4* users never went beyond using the default settings. I can't think of a easy solution. Although I

understand why GP Software took this route, it still doesn't make up for the fact that it's not as easy to use as the one on our January cover disk.

The extra power and versatility also take their toll on hardware. *Opus* is now a hard drive only program and to really get the most out of the program you need a monitor capable of supporting high resolutions. Neither of these are serious problems for anyone with a big set up, but they should be considered.

There are several other smaller niggles as well, such as the inability to scroll text file displays using the mouse buttons, but these boil down to personal taste rather than faults of the program.

This is an amazing program and about as good an example of what the Amiga is capable of as you'll

get. If you use the CLI or *Opus 4* on a regular basis it's a must have, but do read the manual. ■

If *Photogenics* continues to develop at this healthy rate, soon nothing will be able to touch it for 24-bit image handling.

The core program is perfectly suited to continual upgrading, as it's completely modular in design. New modes and 'filters' can be written and plugged straight in, and they have been.

New additions to the paint modes include some texturing tools such as cross hatch and jitter, which offset alternate rows and columns of the picture to various degrees, mirage, which adds a faint mirrored reflection of the image to the bottom of the picture, rub emboss, which embosses the pattern of the

secondary picture onto the first, and a few others too.

In the Loaders section, among the file formats such as JPEG, IFF and GIF, you'll now find one called *ProGrab 24*. Select this, and you can grab video stills from a *ProGrab 24 RT* video digitiser directly into *Photogenics*, which is extremely handy.

A new warp/twirl tool has been added to the toolbar. This allows you to drag out an ellipse over the image, and then stretch and/or twirl the area according to your settings.

Other additions include the print option, which supports any Preferences printer and also the Studio II colour management system. You can now paint directly to any graphics card that supports the Cybergraphics standard (such as Cybervision 64, Picasso II and Retina Z3) in either 15/16bit colour, or full 24-bit true colour.

You can now make use of the new HAM-6 rendering module, and the 16 colour preview mode, but you'll still need a 3.0 operating system.

There are plenty of other little

additions and improvements through the program.

Anyone upgrading from 1.1 gets a whole new 150 page manual (which is so well written and organised it could convince you to start reading manuals again).

New users of course get the full package. *Photogenics* is a superb program, and an essential part of any serious Amiga user's collection. There's very little excuse to be without it.

What impressed me most about the original *Scala* was how incredibly easy it was to use. Not only that, it came with loads of high quality backgrounds and fonts together with lots of exciting visual transitions. No wonder it's become the Amiga's most popular video titling and presentation system. That was a few years ago now. Since then it's been updated a number of times, but it still remains just as easy of use.

One of *Scala's* most appealing new features is its support for

stretchable Compugraphic fonts. Compugraphic fonts are stored as vectors, and so can be re-drawn at any size without becoming jagged around the edges.

However, you'll need Workbench 2.1 for this feature.

Both the horizontal and vertical dimensions of Compugraphic fonts can be altered, so you can have tall thin ones, or short fat ones. Standard bitmapped fonts can also be stretched, but retain their original aspect ratio, stretching equally in both directions. It's a pity there are no scalable fonts included with the package. Still, there are a few supplied with Workbench and thousands more available on PD.

Image formats

Another major change in *MM400* is the ability to load a variety of picture formats. Through the use

of EXs (external modules) *Scala MM400* can now load BMP, FLC, GIF, PCX, TIFF and YUVN images as well as PCD pictures from Kodak's Photo CDs. It also supports Workbench 3 Datatypes, so any other file format can be loaded if you have the relevant Datatype.

Once loaded, pictures can be re-sized and saved as IFFs. The only problem is that when re-sizing pictures as backgrounds you can't lock the aspect ratio. As most pictures imported from the PC or Mac will not suit the Amiga's screen size, re-sizing them usually gives a stretched or squashed appearance. The only way around this is to load a blank background and then load your picture as a brush which can then be freely re-sized in any direction.

An extra advantage in loading odd sized pictures as a brush is that they can be automatically saved as IFFs but retain a link to the original file. The program uses the scaled image for speed, but if you need to change the size of the brush, the program refers to the original picture to ensure that it is working at the highest resolution.

Thumbnails

If you're frustrated by the obscure filenames on many CD-ROMs, you'll be pleased to see that *MM400's* file selector displays thumbnail images in full colour. You no longer have to load each individual file to view it, but can scroll through the file shuffler.

Amongst the other new EXs supplied are controllers for FrameMachine, VLab, Neptun genlock and CD32 audio/MPEG. Support for the Frame Machine and VLAB means that users can now grab a frame off video to be used directly in *MM400* as a background or brush.

MM400 is available as an

upgrade to *MM300* users, or as a complete package to new users. While low cost upgrades are always welcome and users only expect an addendum to their manual, new users deserve a little more. The manual we were supplied with contained *MM200* documentation with an addition for *MM300* users and another addition for *MM400*. Surely it's about time that *Scala* got down to rewriting the manual considering the price of the package? In all, though, *MM400* is a welcome addition to the *Scala* range and a worthy upgrade for *Scala* fans. ■

Surfing on the waves of *deja vu* Final Data is back with a comprehensive update.

One thing that's certain in life is that time marches on relentlessly. Another is that few pieces of software stand the test of time, even good ones like Softwood's *Final Data*. Despite gracing the pages of this magazine only six months ago, Softwood have already seen fit to release an update of *Final Data*, their laudable database program. If you're not familiar with the original version, *Final Data* uses a similar GUI to that featured in the excellent *Final Writer*. This is a very good thing indeed, the interface not only looks a treat, but is extremely user friendly and intuitive. In fact I'll stick my sizable neck out and say that Softwood have come up with the best Amiga interface that I've had the pleasure of using.

New additions

New features in version 2 include a database query requester that enables complex search criteria to be executed as well as non contiguous selection of rows and columns. Basically this means that multiple rows or columns which are not next to each other can be selected easily.

A memo function has been included which allows additional information, in fact as much as

required, to be entered and comes in handy when regular column sizes aren't large enough to cope with the amount of information being entered. Meanwhile the updated views function now enables selected sort and search definitions to be saved. I found this particularly useful when drawing up a list of Amiga software to sell as I could say, group together all my flight simulations, print the list out and then save the file in case I required further copies in the future.

But hang on, the list of new features doesn't stop there! As well as a sublist feature which displays rows that have been located by a query or manually selected (and can be printed separately from the main list) it's also possible to have running calculation

columns, so a database displaying a current account statement can be made to show the running totals of credits and debits for instance.

Organised

Like the original, *Final Data 2* at times still looks and indeed acts more like a spreadsheet than a database. Rather than keeping

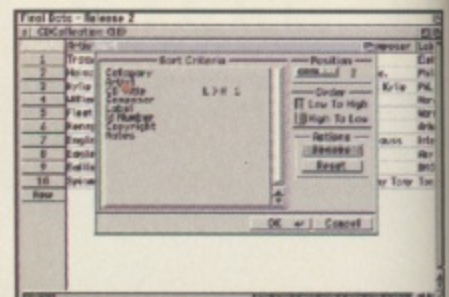
files on individual 'cards', as you would normally expect from a database, *Final Data 2* has a grid of rows and columns. Where the rows and columns cross they form small windows adjustable in size and it's here where data is entered. The database is created by choosing labels for each of the columns. So if you

wanted to catalogue your CD collection it's likely that one column would be for the artist's name, one for the title of the album, another for the record label and so on. What I particularly liked about the program is that it checks the data as it's being entered and if the type doesn't match, say a string of numbers representing the catalogue number is entered in the label column by accident, the program will warn you. I imagine this type of feature is most useful for anyone who hammers in large amounts of data quickly.

My only real fault with the program is it still lacks a complex find feature. To keep the CD analogy it isn't possible to hunt down classical CDs from the main CD list which have a value of over £20. It's either one search criteria or the other. Actually, that isn't strictly true. As I mentioned earlier it is possible to set up such find requests but doing so means a through dabble with the included *Arxex* macro language and I can't see that appealing to the majority of people out there.

Nice and simple

Still, if you're in the market for a database package that's easy to get to grips with and on the whole simple to use then I'd definitely recommend *Final Data 2*. Its clean

look is easy on the eye and allows plenty of scope for multiple windows being open simultaneously and without clutter or hiding other windows. As John Kennedy mentioned in his review of the original product *Final Data* is ideally suited for anyone out there who wishes to catalogue their CD or computer game collections.

Although you may well have lived perfectly well without a database up to now you'd be surprised just how useful they can be. Why not find out for yourself with *Final Data 2*? ■





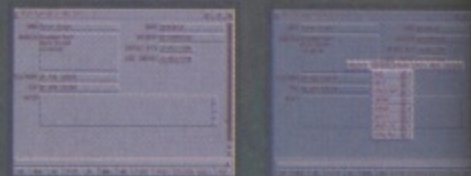

Suffering from an unrequited love affair with my French teacher, I was interested to see what *10 Out of 10's* German tutorial software could do for me.

German is designed for anyone aged eight years or older, specifically for those on key stages three and four of the national curriculum and those revising for GCSEs. It's a collection of six games, with the emphasis on vocabulary. In most cases, the player is asked to match up pictures to words. For example 'ein Ei' must be matched to a picture of a fried egg ('ei' being the German word for egg of course). Let's take a look at the games then.

First up is a game called *The Cat*. A fat cartoon cat stands in the middle of the screen waving his paw at you, while words appear one by one below him. Pictures of

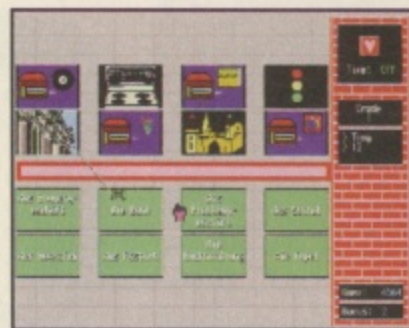


Match a picture and a word and the cat will do a widdle (joke).

various objects scroll up and down the sides of the screen. The idea is to click on the picture that matches the word. The trouble here (and in all of the other games) is that the pictures are so badly drawn that it's hard to know what half of them are supposed to be. For example, there's a yellow oblong with a white bit at the top, various coloured blobs, and a thing that looks like a French cheese. To be fair, most objects are recognisable, but there are plenty of mystery items in there.

Other games include *Ski Lift*, in which you're presented another small picture, and given three choices of word to match it to. There's a yeti sitting in a ski lift, and the object is to stop him reaching the summit by answering the questions correctly. *Word Search* asks you to pick out German words from a grid of letters. *Partner* is another 'match the picture to the word' game. *The Wall* is probably the worst *Breakout* game you've ever played, in which you break through the bricks to hit pictures that correspond with certain words. *Stones* is a counting game.

presented as if it's aimed at very young children, but hopes to appeal to GCSE students. Frankly I can't see it happening. The production values are off-putting, with nasty, ear-piercing sound effects and messy little graphics. The games themselves are tedious, mainly due to their acute simplicity. It will benefit anyone who has the time and patience to sit through it, but surely the idea of using a computer for learning is that it's more fun, more interesting and more inspiring than using traditional methods? Back to the drawing board methinks.

Structured Spelling is from the same camp as *10 Out of 10 German*. It's aimed at anyone aged up to nine years. On the menu there's a game called *Diver*, which is remarkably similar in format to *The Cat* game

from the *German* software. A word appears in the middle of the screen, while various letters scroll up and down either side. The player has to 'spear' the correct letters to spell out the word.

Painter presents you with two words and asks you to match letters that appear in both words by painting them the same colour. The remaining letters also have to be painted different colours before you can move onto the next set of words.

Astroword is the most appealing of the games, and has you guiding a teddy astronaut around the screen, homing in on the area containing a word

that describes a picture at the bottom of the screen.

Keeper gives you five objects descending the screen. You have to click on each one as its name appears below, in order to stop them reaching the bottom. *Go Cart* is a pathetic attempt at a car racing game, in which you drive along a vertically scrolling road, bumping into letters to spell out words. Finally there's *Driller*, in which you guide a drill through the earth to one of four pictures at the bottom.

Compared to a straight spelling test, a game of *Structured Spelling* would be more appealing, but not much. The producers have put a lot of thought and time into the system, but the bottom line is that

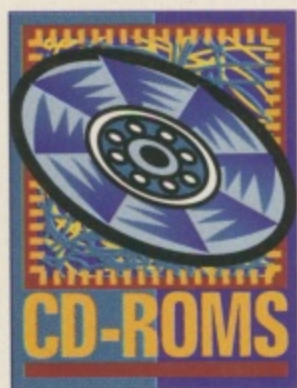
the games needed to be much better to create a sense of fun. However, they are more like poor 'type in' Spectrum games from the 80s. A bit of a let-down, really. ■

However, the sheer number of photos on the CD ensures that there's something to suit everyone.

Unfortunately, not the animal sounds themselves, but background music designed to complement the pictures. The only criticism I have of the disc concerns the naming of the files. Surely the logical filename for a picture of a lion is 'lion', or is that too much to ask? Nevertheless an excellent way to go on safari.

The main criticism of this Oxyron production is that most of the effects are shown in a small part of the screen, surrounded by a fairly plain border. Although this may be done primarily for presentation reasons, it just makes it look as though they're compensating for slow code. Whatever the case, the range of effects are good, including phong vectors, vector balls, a very nice animation sequence, 'relief feedback' on what looks like BOBs (!), texture-mapped opaque and transparent poly-



gon objects and a spinning RGB vector effect. The music is not synchronised to the action very well but it's nice. And that's all there really is to say about this demo – nice. There's nothing outstanding to distinguish it but nevertheless it's worth a gander.

Spondulix V personal accounts

If you've got about ten different bank accounts, all sorts of credit cards and you want to find out exactly how much you're in credit (or debt!), you could simply sit down with a ledger and a pencil and work it out. You'd probably have no hair left on your head by the end of the exercise though. But why bother when *Spondulix* is available.

Written by Jack Pritchard (of EpochMaster fame) it is a powerful, versatile and easy to use personal accounts spreadsheet. You can set up a number of accounts into which you enter transactions. These accounts make up your entire portfolio, which you can look at from an overall perspective and discover the true depth of your financial woes at a glance. Becoming depressed has never been made easier!

You can generate graphics, interlink account transactions, use exchange rates invisibly, set up automated entries (eg: direct debit and standing orders) including automated cut-off dates, print out your accounts, create shopping lists and invoices, attach reminders and notes to accounts, user-definable macros (via *ARexx*), encryption and password protection, and you can configure it all to your own personal tastes.

Want to get some more organisation into your life? Well, start off by using ProCalc to set up your very own reviews library.

Last month we briefly explored ProCalc's database functions. This month we show how you can use those database functions to set up your own library. For this tutorial we will be using CU Amiga Magazine reviews as our data and we want to be able to search for all reviews of specific types of product. So, if you're looking for a new printer you can simply ask ProCalc to list all printer reviews in CU Amiga Magazine.

The database should also be able to limit the search to reviews of printers within a specific price/rating range. For example, if you wanted to find a CU Amiga Recommended printer that you could buy for, say £300, the database should search for any printers in that price range that have received a score of 90% and over. If there is only one that matches those requirements you could perhaps widen your options by dropping the score to 80% and maybe increasing your price range.

Getting started

The first thing we need to do is build the structure of the database ie the number and names of the fields in the records. Remember that ProCalc databases build upon the its basic grid structure, ie fields are horizontal columns, vertical rows new records. Assuming you've loaded ProCalc move the cell cursor to A2 and enter the following field names which should run across the screen from A2 to F2:

Product [return]
Type [return]
Type2 [return]
CU Score [return]
Price [return]
Date [return]

Now to enter some records and give our base some data (for this example we are using the technical reviews from the January '95 issue). Move the cell cursor to A3 and enter the following. Note: press return every time you see a comma and move the cursor to the start of a new row when you reach the end of each line. Also set the cursor to move to the right in the preferences requester.

Your screen should now look like figure 1. The contents of columns B and C determine the type of product that the review is of. Column B will be either software, hardware, CD, or other - and allows you to search the database for basic product types ie all hardware, or CDs. The data in column C is a secondary product type, is more detailed and depends upon the contents of column B. If the product was software this field could be accounts, programming, DTP, database, utility, wp, graphics, or video. Possible hardware entries include sampler, accelerator, printer, monitor, hard drive and modem.

In figure 1 we've only used some of these, and of course you can create as many types as you want. There's nothing to stop you entering games, PD, shareware review data, anything you wish.

However, if you do you'll quickly find that you run off the bottom of the screen and the field names disappear off the top as the window scrolls. Here you can use the freeze facility to keep the field names, stored in row 2, on screen as the other rows scroll off it. Move the cursor to row 2 and click on the 'Options/Freeze/Row' menu. See our January

issue for more information on this. Once you've entered the data define the database, which we covered last month. Call it something like 'CUREVIEW'.

Manipulation

OK now we've got some data it's time to test out some ways of manipulating it. The first technique is to sort it into order. As we discovered in the June issue we can sort the data using any of the fields to determine the sorted order. Moving the cell cursor to column A and selecting Sort will shuffle the data into alphabetical order using the product names. Alternatively you could sort it on the type of product, so all printers were next to each other, or on score. It's your choice.

To search for a specific entry we first need to think about what we're after. A common use will be to search for a review score of a product you're about to buy. This is dead easy. Move the cursor to G2 and type in PRODUCT. Now in cell G3 type in '=="PageStream"' and define this as a search criteria (see June tutorial). When you use this it will find the record with the product name of PageStream. You can change PageStream to the one wanted.

That's all very well, but what if you didn't know the product name and just wanted a DTP package. Simple. Change the word PRODUCT to 'TYPE2', and 'PageStream' to DTP. Now when you search it will compare the contents of the field TYPE2 in every record to the word DTP and move the cursor to those records. How about looking for reviews of a products using several different types of search. How about all reviews of products that scored 85% and above but have prices below £50?

In cell G2 type PRICE, and in cell H2 type CU SCORE. In cell G3 type '<=50.00', while in cell H3 '>=85'. This searches for all records where the contents of the PRICE field are less than or equal to £50. When it finds them it then checks if the value in the SCORE field is greater than or equal to 85. If it finds a record that they both match the cursor moves to it.

That about finishes this months tutorial off. Next month I'll be looking at further database techniques. Until then have fun putting some order into your life. ■

Buyers Guide

Setting up your own personal office at home is easy when you have an Amiga, some peripherals and follow our expert shopping advice, of course.

Judging by the amount of national press hype and coverage recently, you'd be forgiven for thinking that only a top of the price range PC could hook you up to the internet or enable you to run a business from home. But we know better. With your Amiga you can join the global web and run your business for a lot less money than your PC owning mates. Most Amiga owners know this already but are less sure about the physicality of setting up their home office and linking into the web. In this buyers guide we'll look at common areas of concern, what you need to start and what to look out for when you are shopping around for your home office goodies.

The internet

There can't be many people who haven't heard about the Internet, if you haven't you should read

your email! It's a huge network of people all communicating using their computers and linking up over telephone networks. But a lot of people are still confused by all the technical hype surrounding it as to how to actually log on to the thing. Our lead feature this issue should clear up any remaining queries you might have so I won't go into it too much here.

To join this network you need a modem, a piece of hardware that allows your Amiga to hook up to the telephone. One major consideration to bear in mind when you are buying a modem is to go for the fastest model you can afford as it'll save you money on phone bills.

Once you've got a modem you need software. Luckily Amiga comms software is available as shareware, which should set you back little or nothing. Contact one of the main shareware libraries and ask for either NCOMM or TERM. These two are the main programs to get you started. Refer to this month's feature for further details.

Accountability

If you're running a small business from home you'll find *Easy Ledger* from GP Software more than adequate for your needs. It's available from most Amiga dealers, or Wizard Developments on 01322 272908 (price: £199.99). For looking after home finance you could also try out *MyMoney*, from MySoft, 71 Springfield Avenue, Whitehaven CA28 6TT. You could also do with a spreadsheet. This will allow you to make business plans ahead, monitor cash flow, etc. Here CU Amiga Magazine can really help you save some cash. Our November 1994 issue had the full version of *ProCalc* on the cover disk, and this is without doubt one of the best Amiga spreadsheets available - it'll even load Lotus

1-2-3 files from PCs. Call our back issues department on 01858 468888 for a copy.

So fax me

First there was the phone, then came the answer phone, now any budding work-a-holic has to have a home fax. To use your Amiga as a fax you'll need any modem that complies with the signals issued by normal fax machines. Such modems are labelled, sensibly enough, Fax Modems. We recommend the X-Link modems, call Wizard on 01322 272908.

You'll also need software to handle fax documents. Wizard provide GP Fax software for £34 with the X-Link models. Alternatively try Supra Fax Modems from Gordon Harwood, on 01773 836781.

Answerphones

The Amiga can be used as an answer phone but it's more difficult to organise this. You'll need a GVP PhonePak, but as GVP are no longer in business so it's getting rather difficult to get hold of these Zorro expansion cards. Try Silica on 0181 309 1111 or Power Computing on 01234 273000.

WPeasy

For creating letters, typing up reports for the office, or any other typed document a good word processor is vital, and thankfully the Amiga has no shortage of these. Our preferred choice is the SoftWood Final Writer. This is available from SoftWood UK (price: £74.95) on 01773 521606. If you're working on documents from an office PC you'll need to save the documents as ASCII when transferring it to and from the Amiga, and of course save the files to a PC disc (PC0:).

DTP queen

For creating leaflets, flyers, adverts, and other promotional material you'll want a DTP program. Here your choice is slightly limited. Currently PageStream V3 is the only DTP program available. However it is more than adequate

for all your DTP requirements including colour work. Available from Gordon Harwood on 01773 836781 (price: £229.95). If you're doing DTP work you could also do with a CD-ROM drive for getting clip art. For CD clip art take a look through our CD-ROM reviews over the last couple of months. For information on CD drives and interfaces call HiSoft on 01525 718181.

And the rest ...

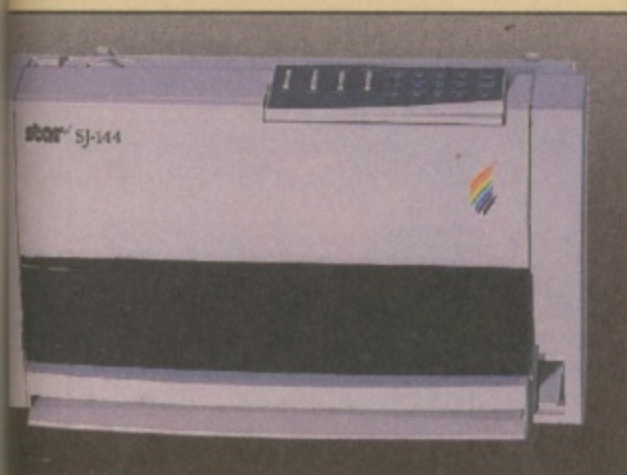
If you're serious about using your Amiga for any kind of home office work it's worth investing in some extra hardware. A hard drive, accelerator, good quality screen, monitor, and extra RAM will all greatly improve productivity.

Hard drives for the A1200, A600, and A4000 are available from just about every Amiga dealer, try Flashtech on 01736 331999 for some good deals. For A500 hard drives call Power Computing 01234 273000.

For accelerators we recommend either the Blizzard range from Gordon Harwood, see word processing for the number, Visage Computers (0115 944 4501) also do a very fast A1200 accelerator. For monitors try Silica, 0181 309 1111, who sell the Microvitec 1438.

And finally for printers we suggest you try out the Star SJ-144 inkjet (price: £249), it prints in colour and at high resolution. Star are on 01494 471111. ■

PART 4 The divisions between reality and fantasy have long been blurred. Now Photogenics gives you some of the power to manipulate images in such a way that only you will know what's real and what's fake.

It's never really been true that 'The camera never lies'. But with the advent of electronic image manipulation it's harder than ever to trust images.

And that's not just the clever ads, where the impossible is routinely made to happen. Doubt has been cast on historic pictures claiming to be authentic – in recent memory there's the famous shot of Lee Harvey

Oswald showing off with his rifle – which, according to some, is just a fake to implicate the man accused of assassinating President Kennedy.

Earlier still, Russian despot Joseph Stalin had his one-time ally Trotsky erased from photographs of them taken in friendlier times.

So when someone sits down at a computer and makes changes to a digitised picture,

they're part of a long standing tradition. Is this practice right or wrong? I guess it all depends on your motives. Sticking the head of a famous person onto a risque shot may seem like a bit of fun, but do it maliciously and you could end up in big trouble.

The movies, too, have cottoned on to the fact that new twists can be added to authentic material; Woody Allen's *Zelig* incorporated many original newsreel shots with

the lead character superimposed on them, to make him part of the recorded event.

And more recently multi-award winning movie *Forest Gump* has Tom Hanks stumbling through America's recent past via film trickery where it is impossible to see the joins. Maybe a generation of kids will believe he actually did meet JFK.

All this brings me to our final topic; using *Photogenics* to lie – in the nicest possible way. The program offers unparalleled opportunities to manipulate one or more images seamlessly. The subtle nuances of shading and original grain can be simulated on your Amiga as you mix and match images. Here are a few light-hearted examples to give you some ideas to play around with.

The fab five!

You know the sad kind of fan who has their picture taken alongside a cardboard replica of their heroes? This is pretty much the same – but more high-tech! You can actually step 'inside' the picture of your idols for a unique memento.

Being both sad and old, I chose the Beatles as my source. The main digitised image was a 24 bit colour scan in GIF format, and it was taken from a CD full of images.

Once loaded into *Photogenics* (there was no need to convert the image format as the program interprets GIFs) I loaded in a head shot of myself into the sec-

ondary slot. But before combining the images, I had to remove all traces of the background to my face, including the ears because it was simply the features I was going to use.

This is quickly done in *Photogenics* using the filled polygon tool and tracing around the area to be blacked out. Once fixed, changes are made to the image and the real business of trickery can begin.

Using the Image/Compose menu item, I was able to precisely position my face on top of John Lennon's head. It is also vital to get sizing right, and this is easily achieved by using the drag-handles on the overlaid

image. This way pictures containing elements of wildly differing sizes can be incorporated to look as if they are in correct proportion to each other.

Once the positioning was achieved I activated the Blend In button on the Compose requester, and using a medium sized airbrush in free-hand paint mode I touched up the image to allow recognisable portions of my face to remain over Lennon's.

Decreasing the size of the air-

brush and using magnify mode allowed for fine-tuning of the edges, to create a good fake.

terclass



A lovely black and white picture of Marilyn Monroe is given the high-tech treatment to colourise it. Using *Photogenics'* Tint mode you can stain images any colour. The trick is to choose the correct colour so that when it is overlaid on the greyscale image, it isn't too stark. Trial and error are the only ways to judge this; adding small test areas of colour at different translucency settings is necessary and easy with the Undo function. Once the correct colour match is discovered, use the freehand fill tool to outline the area to colour.

Note the extra work on the



face; I had to whiten the eyes and add a highlight, and also strengthen the colour on the lips and shadow on the right of the face image.

Adding a touch of colour

Some of the most striking pictures of Marilyn Monroe were taken early in her career, and in black and white. You might want to transform these greyscale images of the beauty into a full technicolour ones. Happily, *Photogenics* allows you to make this transformation beautifully, keeping all the underlying emphasis on the picture so you don't lose quality.

Colourising as it's known in the movie business involves using the Tint mode and filled freehand tool to overlay transparent colour onto the image.

The trick is to choose your

colour carefully from the palette selector, and try out any number until you are left with the hue you want.

The nice thing about the software is that you can see what an effect looks like, then Undo it before it's too late.

In this example above I dyed her hair yellow-blond, made her dress mauve and added a bluish background. I added a deeper red tint to her lips, and used white paint to emphasise her eyes. Finally, I touched up the shadow on the face to add a little more mystery to the image. Who says you can't improve on perfection?

Brush strokes

One fanciful idea is to incorporate well-known people into famous works of art. You can go from the sublime – Madonna as the Mona Lisa, to the ridiculous – John Major as Michelangelo's David.

For this quick demo I chose to place Kim Basinger at the heart of a Manet masterpiece. The physical manipulation of the image is identical to the Beatles example, with the exception of creating a texture to the new face.

The painting itself has a quality which makes a

normal photograph imposition, such as the one with Kim, stick out a mile. It was necessary to add grain to her face to blend into the scene. Luckily *Photogenics* has two ways of degrading an image like this – AddDust and Add Noise. Using Dust at a low setting I was able to give her face a convincing appearance. I also had to use Blur mode to smooth the areas where her face

blended into the original picture, and this was done in magnify mode. An obvious fake to anyone who knows the painting, or Miss Basinger, but a pleasant one I think.

More than a glove puppet

My hero. No, not Robocop – Sooty. He's always been a favourite, since I first saw the little chap as a kid. I even own an original Sooty. For this example I used a photo of my own puppet, picked up at auction, which was taken in black and white. The image had to be cropped within *Photogenics* and colourised. I also had to do some picture editing using Paint and Blur to give Sooty a neck. If you look carefully at the original image you may notice that his right paw obscures his neck. I used magnify mode extensively to get the right blend for this part.

Once again the Compose function allowed precise positioning and sizing of the Secondary image containing Sooty's head. A few minutes spent airbrushing around it and I replaced the original head of Robocop. Mean or what! Watch out Old Detroit, this bear's out to make a clean sweep... ■

Image FX

PART 1

Last month's cover disk was surely the best ever. Find out more about its features over the next few months, starting off with *Cinemorph*.

Cinemorph is an extremely powerful part of *Image FX*, giving you the chance to create professional quality morph and warp animations. To load it, double click on the *Cinemorph* icon in the *Image FX* disk window. You'll need 4Mb of RAM in order to run it. These instructions assume that you have installed the entire *Image FX* system onto a hard drive. *Cinemorph* will work on a floppy system in a limited capacity, but many of the features and demo files are only accessible from the hard drive-installed version.

Morphing explained

Morphing is the technique used to change the shape and colours of one image into those of another. Much as we'd like to get through this tutorial without mentioning it, Michael Jackson's Black or White video includes some classic examples of morphing in the section where a series of faces change from one to another. This is achieved by mapping parts of one image to corresponding parts of another. These areas are then moved, stretched and shrunk accordingly over a number of animation frames. The result is an animation that shows the first image 'morphing' into the second.

Getting started

Once you've loaded *Cinemorph*, it's a good idea to change the screen mode from high res interlace to non-interlaced high res or low res, unless you have a flicker-free display and plenty of RAM. Down-grading the the screen

mode will save you memory and minimise eye strain on most monitors and TVs.

Now you can load one of the example 'projects'. Select Open from the Project menu. Select Dual.project or SmallDual.project (the latter if you're low on memory) and click on OK. You'll be presented with two windows, in which you'll see digitised photos of two people. They're both covered in a kind of mesh. This mesh is used to connect parts of the first image with parts of the second.

Click on one of the points in the left window, and you'll see it turns yellow to indicate that it's active. Look to the window on the right, and you'll see one of the points there has turned yellow too. These two points are linked, so that when the animation frames are rendered, the area beneath the point on the left will shift to become the area beneath the point on the right. The same is true of all the other points, so what you get is a mass migration of pixels from their original colours and positions in the first image, to their new positions in

the final frame. This takes place over a specified number of frames, with the pixels moving just a little between each. When the animation is played back in full, the first picture appears to morph into the second. The easiest way to see how it works is to set the animation rendering. To save memory, you can select Lo-res from the Render menu. Now select Render

Sequence from the Morph menu. A file requester will pop up. Select a part of your hard drive that you want your animation saved to, enter a filename, and then click on OK. The frames will then be rendered one by one, and saved out to the hard drive. You'll end up with a series of IFF picture files with your specified filename followed by a three figure number. This is an alternative way of saving an animation (as opposed to saving the frames as one big file). In many cases, it is the best option, as the size dimensions of the animation frames can

Installation correction

There was a slight mistake in the hard drive installation instructions given in the June issue. To install *Image FX* (and *Cinemorph*) onto your hard drive, turn on your Amiga with no floppy disks in the drive, and boot from the hard drive. Now insert the *Image FX* program disk (no. 108) into any drive. Double click on the *Image FX* disk icon, and then double click on the Install_to_HD icon. The program and all of its supplementary files will be unarchived and installed onto your hard drive. Now reset, and you'll find the *Image FX* and *Cinemorph* programs resident on your hard drive.

confuse programs like *Deluxe Paint*, making them jump into strange screen modes. To view the animation, load the frames into *Deluxe Paint* or *Brilliance*. With *Deluxe Paint*, use the Load Picture option, and enter '8' into the box marked '# of Frames'.

Do it yourself

In order to create your own morph, you'll need two images with exactly the same dimensions. These can be in any of the 26 formats supported by *Image FX*. Click in the left window and select Load Image from the Cell menu. Select your first image, and it will be loaded into the left window. Now click on the right window, and load the second



▲ Warping is a way of stretching and shrinking certain parts of a picture and is especially useful for caricatures.



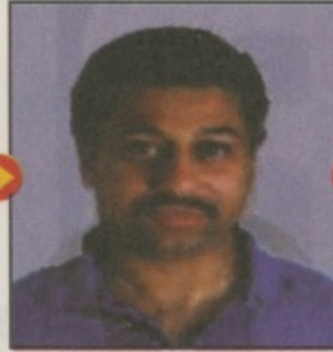
▲ Frame one shows the girl unchanged by the process.



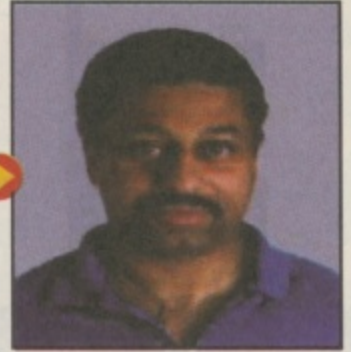
▲ Look carefully and you'll see a few minor changes here.

image in the same way.

Finer points

Now you have two images, with a mesh overlaid on each. The key to good morphing is assigning the right bits of the first image to the right bits of the second. Faces are some of the easiest things to morph, as the features of the first can be easily mapped to the corresponding features of the second. When morphing faces, it's essential that you match up eyes to eyes, ears to ears and so on. However, morphing two completely different objects calls

for a bit more planning.

A good place to start is around the edge. Using the points around the edge of the grid, outline your subject one point at a time, switching back and forth between the images for each point. Once you've got the outline sorted, move in and pick out the details and features, mapping them to features on the second image. Continue this until you think you've given enough information for a smooth morph. After a few attempts, you'll find out what works and what doesn't.

For finer control over the

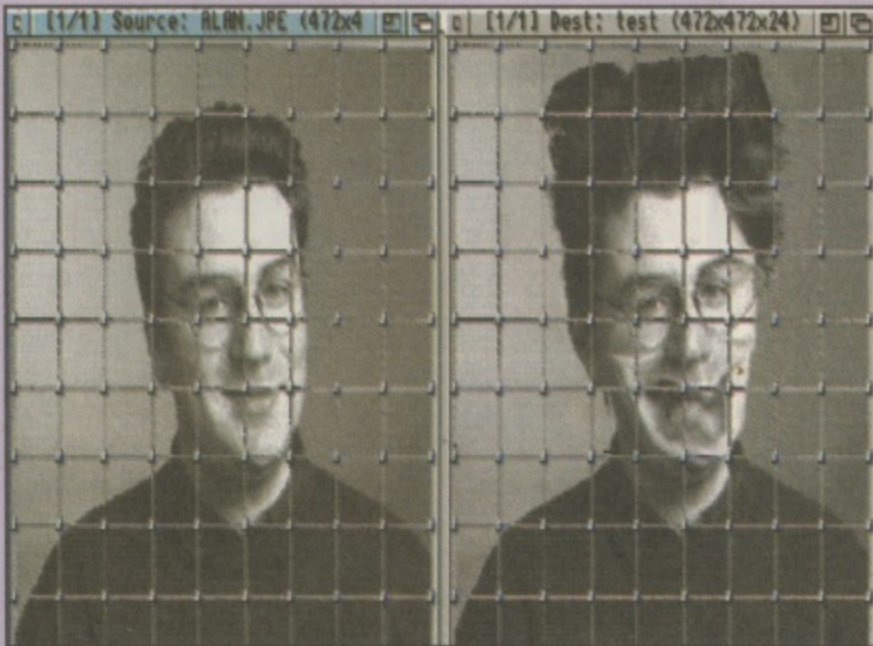
morph, you can add more points. Use the Add Row and Add Column options from the Point menu. Add Column inserts a column of points to each window, directly to the right of the currently selected point. Add Row inserts a row of points below the selected point. These can be removed with the delete functions from the same menu. So long as you have the patience, the more points you use the better. This will help you avoid problems like the girl's hair fading in the sequence above. ■

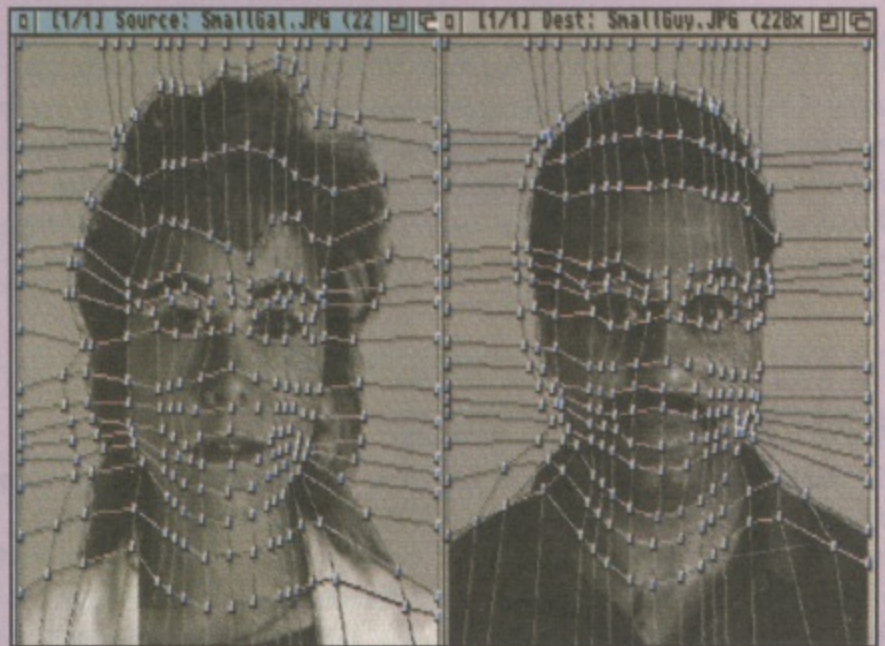
Next Month

Get ready for warp mode - full speed ahead

Warping is like morphing, but you only need one image to start with. The image is loaded into both windows and the points of the mesh are matched up and moved as before, only in the second window, you move the points so as to stretch, shrink and contort the picture. When the image or animation is rendered, you get a distorted version of the original picture. This is how those bug-eyed effects are done.

To do a single frame warp, select New from the Project menu, then from the Settings menu, choose Mode > Single Image. Now load an image as before from the Cell menu. This will appear in both windows. Drag the points around to line up with key features of the first image. With the left image selected, choose Copy Points

from the Points menu. This will duplicate the mesh from the left window in the right window. Now you can set about dragging the points in the right window to their new locations. When you're happy, select Render Single from the Morph menu. You'll be presented with a slider bar, which represents the number of the frame you want to render. In this case we want to render the final frame, so move the slider full across to the right, then click on Generate. Enter a filename in the requester, and the frame will be rendered, displayed and saved under the filename you just specified.

To generate an animated warp, do exactly the same, but use the Render Sequence or Render Animation option instead of Render Single from the Morph menu.

Directory Opus

Over the last few months we've covered everything needed to become an expert in the art of Opus. Now it's time for your questions and answers.

You can bank on it

A Mr. Blincoe from Devon called asking about button banks. He's changed the main buttons but has come across extra button banks in the configuration screen and wants to know what they are.

This was covered in the tutorial on changing buttons in the April issue. If you look at the normal *Opus* button bank you'll see several buttons have little ticks on the corner. This means that if you hold down the right mouse button when the pointer is over it a second button will appear. These secondary buttons are held in a second button bank, which is what Mr. Blincoe was seeing.

Having a hard time

We've had several calls from people getting completely lost when it comes to using *Opus* with hard drives. Firstly, to answer a Mr. Ramid, Cumbria, *Directory Opus* is supplied on floppy disk. Files and programs are put onto the hard drive by using Workbench or *Directory Opus* copy commands, you can't physically put the *Opus* floppy disk into your hard drive as this will destroy your hard drive. For information on how to do this refer to our March 95 issue.

The common problem most of you seem to be having is not a problem with *Opus* but with the names of your hard drives. When referring to any device (floppy or hard drive) that has a

space in its file name you'll need to put the device name inside quotes. So if your drive was called STAR TREK you'd need to type in "STAR TREK". Without the quotes AmigaDos will assume the space marks the end of the drive name and get hopelessly lost.

Multiple windows

One caller to our office asked if it was possible to have several destinations for copying a file at once. For example, copying a file to RAM, DF1 and HD0 in one go. Sadly this isn't possible in *DOpus 4*, although a way around it would be to set up a button to copy the selected files to the destination drawer and other set drawers for you but you couldn't specify the other drawers each time. This ability is, however, possible in *Directory Opus 5*. See this issue for a full review on the new version and its capabilities.

I need help

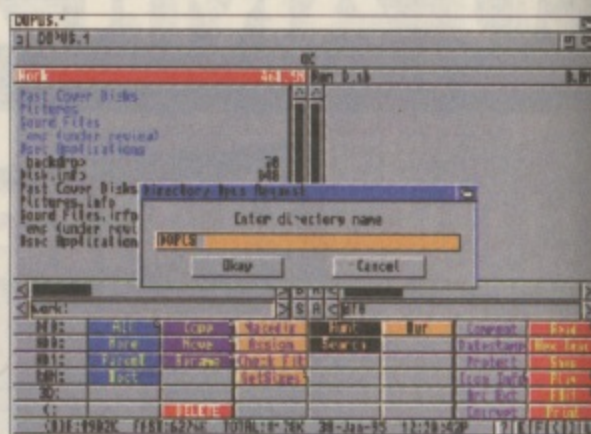
This next question has stumped me. A Mrs Harwood, Shropshire, has asked if it's possible to create new help messages for buttons you've created. The text for the help files is stored in a text file supplied with *Directory Opus* and this can be edited. Unfortunately, I couldn't see any quick way of getting this to work with new buttons. If anyone out there knows the answer drop us a line.

CDXL playback

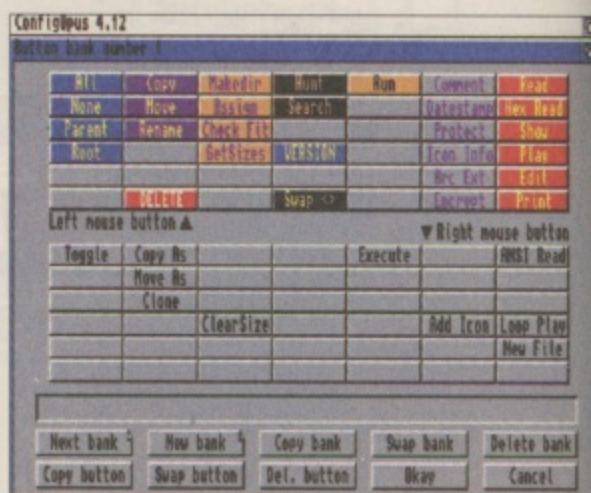
Tim O'Brian, Dublin, faxed us asking how he could get *Opus* to play CDXL video files. CDXL was Commodore's version of full-motion video, albeit in quarter of a screen. This is a feature of the recently released InfoNexus and can't, to our knowledge, be done in *Opus*. Again, if anyone knows of a way we'd be interested to hear about it.

Top tip

Cindy Long, London, gets this month's award for the best tip. Pressing TAB or Space when *Opus* is running will swap the active window between left and right. While the cursor keys will scroll the window sliders around. Nice one Cindy, have you got any others? Don't forget to send them in.

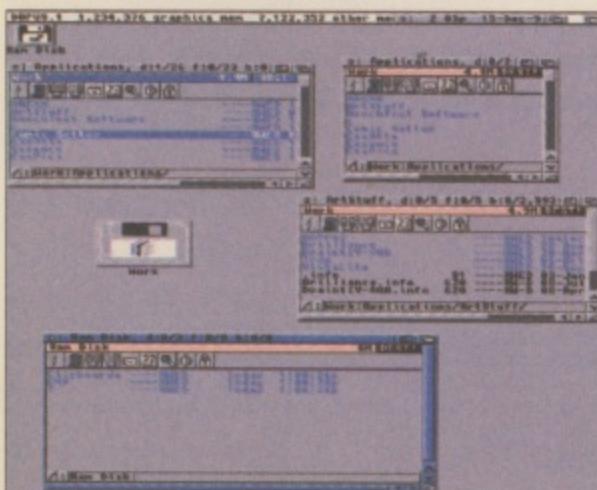

ProDraw

PART 2 It's time to be inspired! ProDraw is much more than a drawing program as you will see when we reveal how you can create some spectacular headings.

When it comes to creating fancy text effects, *ProDraw* is hard to beat and in this month's instalment of how to be an artist without really trying, I'll be showing you how to create a heading or two that will impress your friends and make your rivals green with envy.

Before we start, a few words about using fonts with *ProDraw*. If you are using a floppy disk based system, you will only have a choice of the two fonts that come with the program. These are Times (PD) and Triumvirate (PD). If you have a hard drive and bought the *ProDraw* Upgrade Pack from LH Publishing, you will have a wider range of fonts such as those seen in the screen shots accompanying this tutorial. If you want more information about how to use fonts with *ProDraw*, write to LH Publishing for a free information pack. The address is 13 Gairloch Ave, Bletchley MK2 3DH.

The right image

Now to get down to the business of creating some text out of

some nice illustrations. Run *ProDraw* and make sure you have Wireframe mode selected in the Preferences Menu. This speeds up the program and means that when you have white objects on the page, you can see them on-screen. Please remember though, that any object drawn while in Wireframe mode, will remain transparent with a thin border.

To start proceedings, choose Import Bitmap from the Project menu and use the requester to choose a bitmap picture for this tutorial. A photograph of a person, landscape and so on will do nicely. Once the program has loaded the image, it will appear attached to your pointer. Stamp it down anywhere on the page.

Change the picture's size by first holding down the Alt key. Then grab one of the picture's handles with the Null Pointer and use that handle to size the image. If at any time, you want to Undo an action, press the Esc key. To delete an object, press Shift-Delete.

Next, click on the Rectangle tool and draw a box a little bigger

than the picture. With the rectangle finished, make sure it is still selected by checking that the handles on all four corners are visible. Choose Fill/Solid from the Attributes menu. The short-cut for this is Right Amiga-F. Because you are running in Wireframe mode, you won't notice any difference in the rectangle's appearance. If you want to confirm that the fill is present in the box, use the keyboard short-cut of Alt-W which toggles Wireframe on and off.

The rectangle will have a line around it which needs to be removed. You can confirm the presence of this line by toggling Wireframe off. To remove the line, select Line Weight from the Attributes menu and choose None. When in Wireframe mode, a line will remain visible so don't panic if it doesn't disappear.

Making words

Now create some text. Click on the Text tool and a panel will appear on-screen. Choose a Font and a size (96pt) and then enter 200% into the X and Y gadgets next to the word Bold. Click OK, and then stamp the I-beam onto the page and type some text like the words CU Amiga.

With the text selected, double click on the Size tool and enter 200% into the Y gadget. This will stretch your text vertically. Place the text in the middle of the rectangle. Before performing the next step, make sure the colour of the text is white by toggling

Wireframe off and back on again.

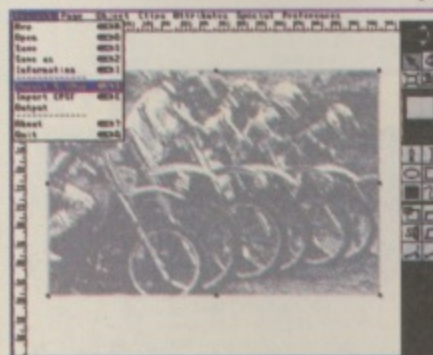
Your task is to now join the text and the rectangle together so that the text becomes clear and the rectangle remains a solid white. Select the text and then while holding down the Shift key, select the rectangle as well. With both objects selected, choose Make Compound Object from the Object menu.

Move the combined text and box over the top of the picture and turn off Wireframe. This should result in the effect of having the image blocked out by the rectangle with the picture showing through where the text was. By combining this effect with some of the other functions like Mirror and Distort, some spectacular results can be produced, especially if you have a colour printer to hand. ■

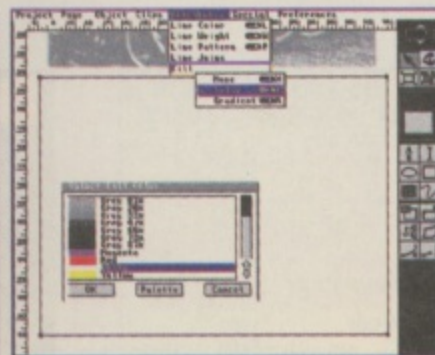

Upgrading your cover disk

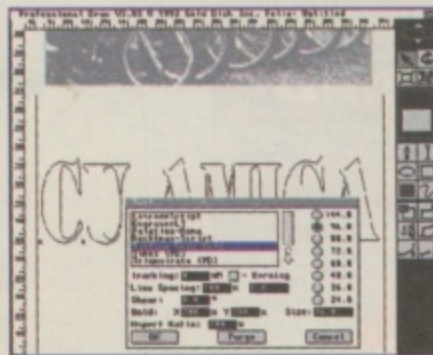
We've had a few callers asking about how they can print from *ProDraw*. The problem most floppy disk users are finding is that the program disk is so full, it's impossible to fit a printer driver on there. To get around this, Don Cox of Don's Genies fame has come up with a solution whereby a lot of the files are Power Packed leaving plenty of room on the disk for printer drivers and so on. This is in addition to the other version we have which will run on the Amiga 1200 or 4000. Both updates are available for £3 from LH Publishing, 13 Gairloch Ave, Bletchley MK2 3DH.



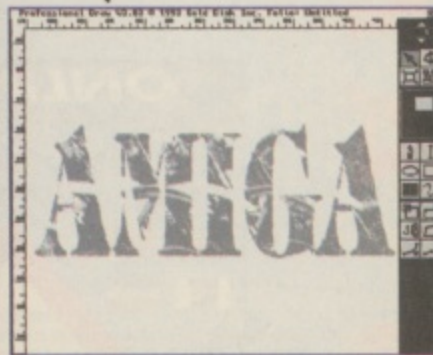
▲ To begin proceedings, import a bitmap and stamp it down on the page. A photograph like this is always useful.



▲ Next draw a rectangle larger than the picture and give it a white fill with no line weight. Then create some text.



▲ The bigger and bolder the text is, the better! Also, make sure that it is white, the same colour as the rectangle.



▲ Select the text and the rectangle and make them a compound object and you'll end up with a stunning result like this.

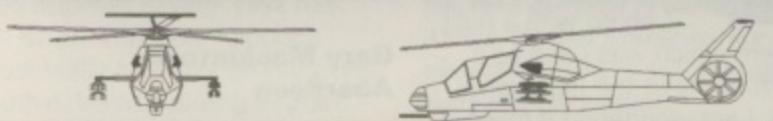

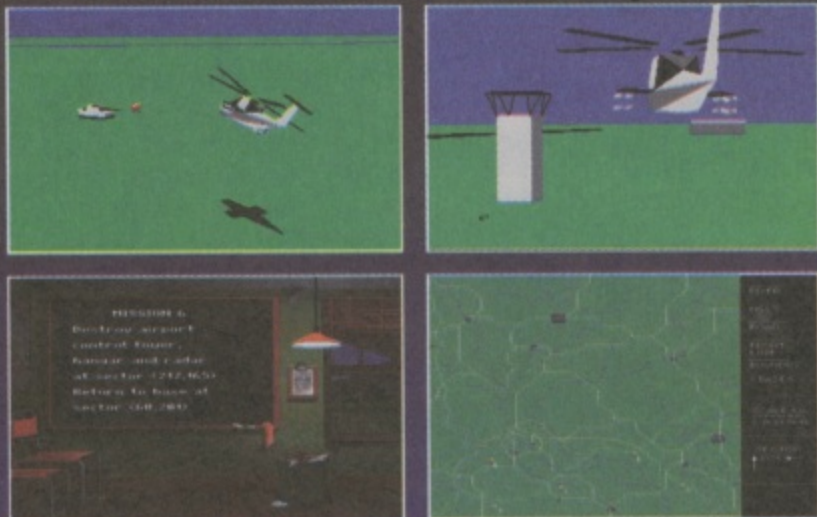

degree course – word processing, spreadsheets and, in future, database applications. I have some questions for you:

1. After reading the accounts of RAM upgrades/accelerator boards, the Blizzard 1230-III and Viper, I am at a loss! Which would suit my needs to maintain games capability without compromising the best possible upgrade to maximise the A1200?

The alternative would be to buy a PC or Apple Mac, but how can an outlay of £1000+ be justified when I already have a perfectly capable machine?

2. Where can I get a Commodore 1940 and 1942 monitor. Or is there an alternative?

3. I have recently taken out a subscription but missed the February issue, how can I get a back issue?

4. Would HiSoft's Squirrel be compatible with any of the expansion boards already mentioned and would it be a good investment for future expansion?

Finally, I enjoy the tutorials and would like to see more in-depth and taxing ones in the future. Also the Question and Answer pages are fascinating – I have learned more from them than from the manual – more please!

Firstly let's answer question one and four at once. If you're after an accelerator and also interested in SCSI there is only one choice. The Apollo 1230 must be top of your list. It has both the accelerator you need and SCSI compatibility for CD-ROMs and the like (see the review in last month's issue). Because it has SCSI

built in you won't need the Squirrel. It's slightly more expensive than the Blizzard or Viper but will cover all the bases and it's far cheaper than buying a PC or Mac.

The 1940 and 1942 monitors have been out of production for a little while now. We suggest you take a look at the Microvitec 1438. Many dealers stock it but it has no sound as standard so keep an eye out for offers which include speakers.

No February issue? Tut, tut. Missing an issue is a serious offence. Sadly, you are out of luck where back issues are concerned. February was our fastest selling back issue ever and was out of stock in days.

Is there any way to connect a Tandata Td2500 to my A1200? The Tandata is a keyboard with a built

Bad news I'm afraid Matthew. Looking at the diagram you sent of the Tandata's ports there doesn't appear to be a way of connecting it to your Amiga.

However, this is almost certainly a blessing in disguise. The Td2500's modem is old and slow and so your phone bills would be astronomical. It's far better that you budget the money and save up to buy a 14400

(or faster) modem. In the long run it'll save you money.

Partition probs



I have an A1200 with a 120Mb hard drive which I've had for over a year with no problems. I

recently did a spot of Spring cleaning and reformatted it from scratch into two partitions. Now when I try to open one partition I get the warning Volume Work: has a checksum error on diskblock 31100. I get no luck with 'Retry' but if I click on 'Ignore' the partition opens as normal. At the moment it is a minor inconvenience but I am concerned it may develop into something worse.

What action I can take? I am loath to format the thing again as I have a lot of data stored.

There are two courses of action you could take. The first is to get hold of a disk recovery utility such as DiskSalv. This will help you to sort out the error but do nothing to find the cause of the problem. The second is to do the thing you loath and format the disk again. This should be more effective in the long run. However, for best effect we recommend that you do a combination of the two. Use DiskSalv to find and eliminate the problem, then take a back-up and reformat the partition. Fairly drastic yes, but it's the best way to ensure your drive's integrity.

copyright laws? What if I want to make remixes and give them to

my friends on tape? Would I be in trouble with the law?

This question is a little tricky. The copyright on various samples and mods should lie with the originators. However, many of them are put into the public domain which makes them freely usable. The only way to find out with mods is to scrutinise them to see if an author is credited. Samples are trickier, if they're just instrument samples you are probably safe but breakbeats, lyrics, riffs and such like will almost certainly be copyright. Legally, we suggest that you only use those samples and mods which are either truly public domain or which have been offered for modification. In practice it is highly unlikely that anyone would even consider prosecuting you unless you were causing them lost revenue or making a profit from the tapes.

More X-CAD



I am writing to enquire about the excellent tutorial on X-CAD. In the tutorials several references were made to books.

What books? And when are we going to get some more tutorials? Also, when booting from my external drive a system requester sometimes appears saying 'Disk has boot error.' This only happens occasionally and only on my external drive. What's wrong with it?

Speed questions



for virtual memory management

I have an A1200 with a Viper-2 68030, 68882 and 4Mb of 32-bit RAM. I use Giga-Mem V3.12

and have some questions on it:

1. When I try to use *LightWave 3D v3.5* with Giga-Mem, *LightWave* crashes. Why?

2. Can *Final Writer V3* use virtual memory?

3. While simulations like *Dawn Patrol*, *Sim City* etc. run faster with the Viper-2, arcade games like *SWOS*, *Aladdin* and *Mortal Kombat 2* run slower than an unexpanded A1200. Disabling the 68030's caches doesn't do anything. Are those games programmed only for the 68000 and 68020?

4. Will there be a 68060 board for the A1200?

The only thing that we can come up with is that LightWave simply does not like using virtual memory. The same may well be true of Final Writer, though it seemed to work when we tested it with VMM.

As a general rule Amiga programs are not designed to use the 68030's MMU. Although Final Writer appeared to work we would be disinclined to do any essential work using a memory manager.

However, Final Writer shouldn't need it as you have 6Mb of memory in total, which should be plenty.

The problem with games slowing down is a strange one. I would be inclined to suspect that the Viper-2 is to blame rather than the games. It's not that there is anything faulty with the board, it's probably just the way it has been designed to interact with the Amiga. Various boards are not always compatible with, or will not optimise, every piece of software

As to a 68060 for the A1200, it's very unlikely I'm afraid. The board required would be too big to fit. Maybe someone will produce an external version though. There is also the possibility of using a new casing with the guts of an A1200, which would allow room for an 060 board.

Hard times



Can you help? I have an A590 hard drive and an A570 CD-ROM, both of which slot into the user

port on the side of my Amiga A500+, but ... only one at a time. Is there any way that both can be connected at the same time to save swapping to and fro?

Unfortunately no. It was a major foul up by Commodore that the two are

incompatible. You couldn't have them both in there at the same time even if you were to build a special adaptor, as they both try to use the same circuitry.

You could try using a SCSI CD-ROM drive with your A590, but then you'd lose compatibility with CDTV software.

Indy 500



I have an old A500 1.3 with 1Mb of memory, an Action Replay and an external drive. I would like

to upgrade to an A1200 but I can't find anyone advertising them in your pages (perhaps because they are out of production). So, I have a few questions for you to answer:

How can I run AGA games in my A500. I can hear you say 'that's impossible', and I thought that too, but yesterday when I was searching through your pages I came across a tiny advert for Communicator II. It said it offered AGA graphics to older Amigas by connecting a CD32. Would I be able to run AGA programs? Would it give me 2Mb of chip RAM? A hundred percent Compatibility? Are you going to review the Communicator II?

Finally two little questions: What are the requirements for running Power Computing's Super XL Drive?

Is there any problem with the 3.5Mb version as it has completely disappeared from the company's adverts?

All is not quite what it seems. The Communicator II definitely does not turn an A500 (or any other Amiga) into an AGA machine. Yes-you will be able to run AGA programs, but only on the CD32.

The A500 will never, repeat never, be able to run AGA programs. It just can't do it. The only 2Mb of chip RAM you'll have will be firmly secured in the CD32.

However, shout and jump for joy because now that Escom have bought Commodore you'll soon be seeing A1200s back in the shops. Show Escom they were right to buy Commodore by getting yourself an A1200 as soon as they hit the streets!

In answer to your two little questions, you need Kickstart 2+ to use the Super XL Drive.

The reason the 3.5Mb version is no longer advertised is that it Power

Compact 600



I own an Amiga 600 which is connected to a star LC 100 colour printer. Day in, day out I have been trying to

get it to print from *DPaint IV*, but a system message comes up saying 'can't open printer device.' Could you please tell me why this happens and how to solve it. Even going to the printer drawer and selecting the Epson X driver on *DPaint* and *Workbench 2* I still have had no luck. I have tried to print from *Notepad* on *Workbench 1.3*, it works but it only prints text with the built-in printer fonts and not with the actual *Notepad* fonts - italics, bold, underlined etc. Could you please explain what I am doing wrong and which are the correct EDS dip-switch settings for the printer to print with on-screen fonts.

The answer to this problem is a simple, but not all that obvious. Somewhere along the line you've lost a file or two from your DPaint disk. Assuming that you are using a copy of DPaint, the two files you need to check for are both from the 'Devs' drawer. They are: Parallel.device and Printer.device. The latter you are definitely missing, the former you should make sure is there. You can copy them across from your Workbench disk.

The problem with Notepad could be one of several things. The most likely one is that you need to select "Print Graphic" when you want to print fonts. Otherwise, check that you have the correct printer driver selected on your 1.3 disk.

As to the dip switches, I'd leave them well alone until you solve your software problems. Playing with them might exacerbate it.

Frequently Asked Questions

Everything you should know about buying a secondhand Amiga.

■ **Q. Where can I buy an Amiga?**

■ **A.** Currently no Amigas are being manufactured, although this situation is due to change soon as the new owners get into gear. This means unless you find a computer shop which has been in a time warp, you will be buying a used Amiga.

Most of the time a secondhand computer will work perfectly as long as the owner has taken reasonable care of it.

■ **Q. Which Amiga models are available?**

■ **A.** The first Amiga was the A1000. This is not particularly useful and is best considered a collections item. Memory expansion is extremely limited. Don't think that an A1000 with loads of signatures inside the case is extra valuable: it's not, as all A1000s have these marks.

The A500 was the entry level Amiga and the first models had 512K as standard and Workbench 1.2 or 1.3. The A500 could be expanded to Workbench 2 or 3, and all manner of memory boards inserted to give a maximum of 9Mb of memory.

The default 68000 processor could also be improved, with 68020, 68030 and even 68040 accelerator cards available. No hard drive or hard drive interface were included as standard: only a edge connect on the left-hand side of the keyboard.

The A500 was also released in a special A500 Plus form which had up to 2Mb of Chip ram and Workbench 2 as standard. A very small number of hybrid machines (called the Plus, but with 1Mb of Chip ram) seem to be in circulation too.

The A2000 has similar specifications to the A500, with the addition of Zorro II expansion

slots. These allow memory and hard drives to be added. The A2000 came as standard with a hard drive, and a UK variant, the A1500 came with two floppy disk drives instead. Both the A2000 and A1500 have huge desktop boxes with external keyboards.

The CDTV is a suave black box, with the guts of an 1Mb A500 inside. It has a single speed CD-ROM drive inside as well and an external floppy disk drive, mouse and keyboard can be added to give all the functionality of an A500. There is no external edge connector, although several hard drive and memory upgrades were sighted. The CDTV is now a bit of a white elephant, although at the right price it makes a cheap (and slow) CD-ROM drive.

The A3000 came in a box slightly smaller than the A2000, but with a 68030 processor available in two speeds (16 and 25Mhz). There is an integral SCSI interface and a hardware "flicker fixer" which makes it the only Amiga cable of easily driving a standard PC style SVGA monitor. Memory expansion is through tricky ZIPs, but the Zorro slots are type 'III' which means there are plenty of very fast graphics cards about. The A3000 is definitely a 'Best Buy' so keep a look out. The A600 took the A500 and repackaged it into a smaller case. It lacks a numeric keypad, but gains an internal IDE interface and PCMCIA slot.

The A600 was a bit of a disappointment, and unless it was very cheap indeed ignore it in preference to an A1200.

The A4000 is also hot stuff if you can track one down. It features the AGA graphics chipset as standard, along with Zorro III expansion slots. At the moment you can pretty much name your selling price and if you looking to buy one you need to be lucky to

find one. If you do, it will probably be the 68030 based version, which you can upgrade to a full 68040 or even 68060 for the best part of £1000.

The A1200 became the replacement for the A500 which the A600 never was. It features an 68020 chip, the AGA chipset and can be expanded both internally and externally. It's a terrific machine but when buying check to see what memory is provided (the 2Mb standard is all right, but more memory in the trapdoor makes it a lot faster) and if you are lucky there will be an internal hard drive.

The CD32 is the 'CDTV mark 2', with an A1200 inside and a double speed CD-ROM drive. There are plenty of games available and it is possible to buy extra hardware to provide full A1200 compatibility. However, if you buy an A1200 it is easier to add a CD-ROM drive to it, instead.

■ **Q. What should I look out for when buying?**

■ **A.** First of all, never buy a computer you can't see working. If the owner refuses to show it switched on, walk away: there are plenty of other computers for sale. Secondly, if you are upgrading or buying a second Amiga, bring some disks of your own which you know work.

Checks: switch it on (with no disk in the drive) and wait for the 'Insert Workbench' prompt to appear. This will also let you know which Kickstart ROM has been installed. Listen for the click of the internal floppy disk. If the keyboard caps lock light flashes several times, or the computer doesn't display an insert disk but crashes with a GURU or Software Failure message, something is amiss.

Insert the Workbench floppy disk (a good owner will have a back up of their original Workbench ready, although you should always bring your own). The normal Workbench display

should appear within a minute or two of inserting the bootable Workbench disk, whereupon you should find the Shell icon and open a Shell window.

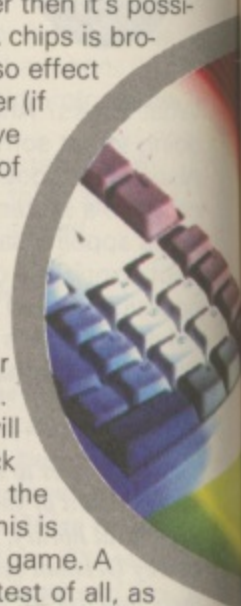
Test the keyboard by typing each letter and number. The function keys won't do anything, although if the other keys are OK then they are probably fine too. By typing AVAIL from the Shell you will also see a display of the amount of memory, split into 'Chip memory' and 'Fast memory'.

Check that the mouse moves freely and the on-screen pointer moves properly. A jerky movement is probably due to a dirty mouse ball but if the mouse doesn't seem work or sticks to one side of the screen or the other then it's possible one of the CIA chips is broken. This could also effect a modem or printer (if you happen to have portable versions of either, it is worthwhile bring them along to test). An A1200, A600 or A4000 will be expensive to repair in these situations.

A dodgy CIA will also stop a joystick from working, but the only way to test this is to load and play a game. A game is the best test of all, as it will also demonstrate the level of the Amiga's graphics and sound facilities.

If the Amiga is advertised as having a Real Time Clock, see if the time is correct when switched on (enter Date at the Shell or find the Clock tool). If it isn't right, set the time switch off and re-boot. If the time is still wrong, the clock battery is probably malfunctioning. Some kinds of battery can be replaced, others need unsoldered. Check to see if the battery has leaked acid in the form white powder: a pretty good sign that it has passed its use by date. ■

Masterclass

Thinking of installing a hard disk? Already got one but don't know how to partition it? (Or even what partitioning is!) Let us be your guide ...

Everyone should have a hard disk. They make life so much easier. No more disk-shuffler's-wrist. No more terminally slow grinding as you wait for Workbench to load.

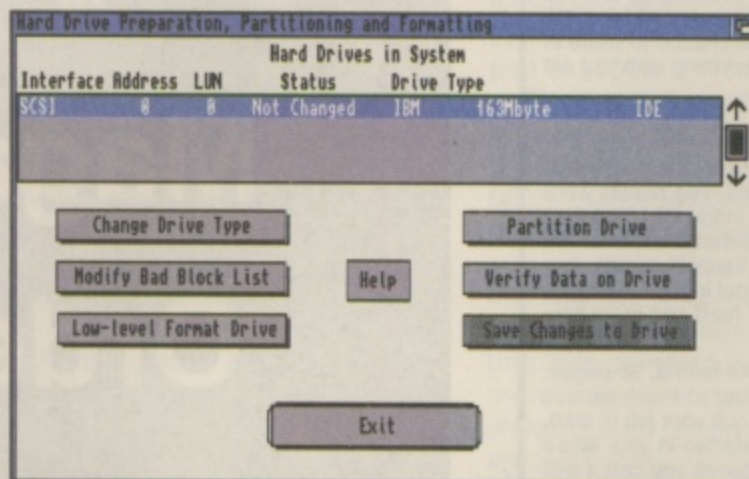
A hard drive is the classic I-don't-know-how-I-ever-survived-without-it scenario. In the May '95 issue we told you how to fit one to your A600 or A1200. Now we show you how to get a hard drive working properly with any Amiga. Indeed you may already have a hard drive fitted but you might need to partition or re-format it if its performance has been downgraded.

The most important thing to remember when using this article is that you will lose everything on your hard disk. If it's a new disk this isn't a problem but if you are optimising an old disk or transferring it to a new machine and you have valuable data there, be absolutely sure to back everything up to floppy first. If not disaster will ensue.

The second most important thing when sorting out a hard disk is to get Commodore's *HDTtoolbox* program. There are other programs which will do the job but *HDTtoolbox* is the program everyone knows. It may not be the best but it is the most widely documented. Any good PD supplier should have a copy they can sell you. The other thing you need is knowledge. Without it there are some nasty hurdles that can topple you.

Drive talking

Once you have a hard drive fitted that may seem to be the end of it. Things have only just started though. You have to let your



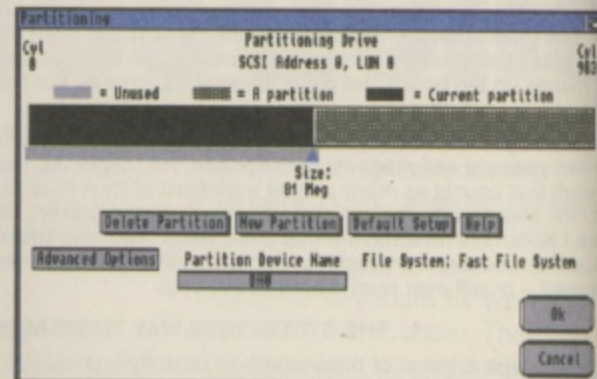
▲ Figure 1: The opening screen from HDTtoolbox. It's very easy to use once you get the hang of it and get to know what does what.

Amiga know that it has one resident. The *HDTtoolbox* program is there for this purpose. It organises the drive in a way your Amiga can understand.

The first thing you need to do is get *HDTtoolbox* going. Easy enough. The disk should be supplied as a bootable Workbench disk. Double click on the disk's icon and then the program icon. And up pops a screen like the one in Figure 1.

The second, very useful thing to know is what is printed on the the label of your hard drive. Before installing or replacing it copy all of this information. If you don't have it then carefully remove the Amiga's casing again and take down the information.

Although you now know what your drive is, it's a fair assumption that the computer doesn't. If it does then you'll probably have a properly defined 'drive type', see Figure 1. If the information on your drive matches what's in the window at the top of this screen then you're several steps ahead. This means that you can skip few paragraphs, and move on to

the one entitled 'Chop it up', which is all about partitioning the drive. If you have any problems though, try coming back to this part again and changing the drive type; perhaps the hard drives's specifications are not recognised by *HDTtoolbox*.

OK, time to plunge in. Click on the button marked 'Change Drive Type'. A screen like the one in Figure 2 should appear. It may not have the same text in the central window as mine, but it should have something in there. Now read the boxout on the opposite page headlined 'Machine Types'. This will tell you what sort of hard drive your machine should have. If you have an XT drive then click on the box marked 'XT' at the top of the screen. If you have a SCSI or IDE drive then click on the box marked 'SCSI.' Easy.

Being specific

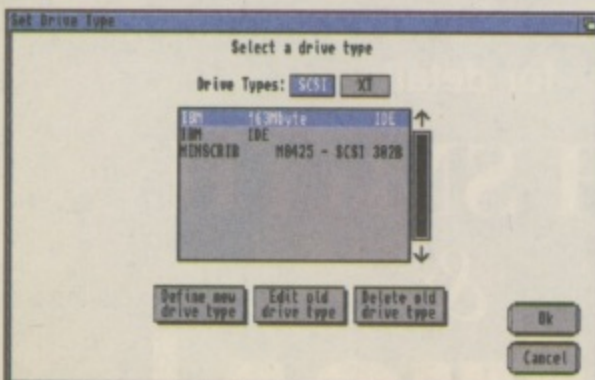
Next up we need to define the drive: your Amiga needs to know what the drive's specifications are. If you've got a new drive just click on 'Define new drive type'. If you're updating an old drive click on 'Edit old drive type'. Either will lead to the 'Define/edit drive type' screen like that displayed in Figure 3.

Here you need to do a few things. Again, it may seem daunting but it's deceptive. If you have an XT drive you'll need to enter those numbers you copied from the casing into the relevant boxes. Just click in each of the boxes and type in the data.

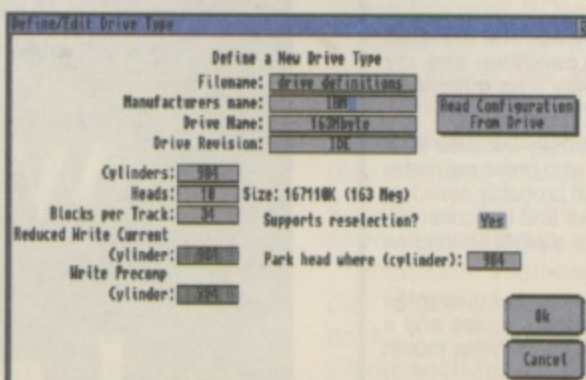
If you have a SCSI or IDE drive then you have the easiest option of all. Just click on 'Read Configuration from Drive' and let the software handle the pressure. Now all you need to do is enter the manufacturer's name, the drive type and revision. Assuming everything went to plan, click on OK. You can always click on cancel if you're not sure. Then do it again.

Chop it up

Next up comes partitioning. Wait! Come back! It's easy! Really! Although partitioning sounds complicated it's a simple concept. Basically, sometimes it's handy to have two,

three or even more hard drives. Especially if you use your Amiga for work and play. Rather than having more than one, you can tell your Amiga to divide a single hard drive into separate partitions, which act as different hard drives, and are known as Dh1 or HD1, Dh2 etc.

So, if you managed to make it back to the original screen (as in Figure 1) and you want partitions, click on 'Partition Drive'. You should now have a screen like Figure 4. It almost certainly won't be exactly the same though. They never are.

In the middle of the screen is a big bar. This represents your drive. There are also a few buttons. Don't touch the 'Advanced Options' unless you know what you're doing. First a word of warning. Every partition you create will eat 100K of RAM. It does this for a

very good reason: it acts as a buffer, but this means that you need to weigh up which you need more, partitions or more memory. If you only have 1 or 2Mb of RAM it may be best to only have one partition.

Cut it in half

As an example, I'll assume you only have one partition at the moment and want to divide it into two. The first thing to notice is the little bar under the big bar. There's a small blue triangle in it. Try moving it with the mouse. You should now realise that this is how you size a partition. So, move it until you get a figure that is half the size of your drive.

Now click on 'New Partition'. A new block should appear to the right of the one you just resized. You can swap between the two by clicking on either side of the big bar in the middle. Make sure that the partition names are Dh0, Dh1, Dh2 etc. Dh0 being the partition to the far left of the big bar. The reason I prefer to use Dh1 instead of Hd1 is because a lot of older hard drive installable software only recognises this name. Finally, if you're at all worried that you might have done wrong, you can always click on 'Cancel'. You could even use it as a way of practising before you do it for real. If all has gone as planned and you have the number of partitions needed, click on 'OK'.

Frank it

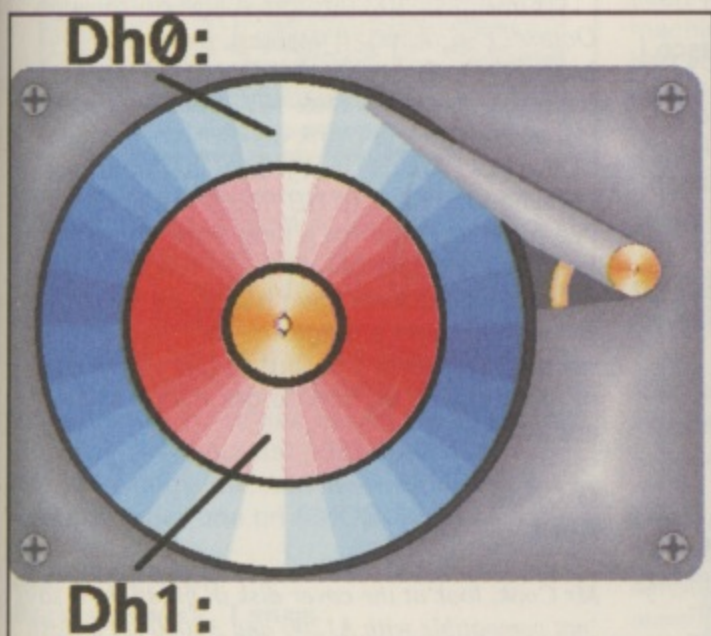
If you are certain, and I mean certain, that everything is properly sorted, click on 'Save Changes to Drive.' This

is the big one. It sets your decisions in concrete. Make sure you have done everything right first. If, and only if, you have an XT or SCSI drive you should now click on 'Low Level Format.' But: **DO NOT DO THIS TO AN IDE DRIVE! IT WILL KILL IT!** The reason for this is that IDE drives store information about themselves on the disk. A low level format will delete this information and hence the drive won't know who or what it is. Nasty stuff.

Finally, click on "EXIT." Which tells both the drive and your Amiga that everything is ready to go. The only thing you have to do now is format the partitions. They should appear on your Workbench as icons (Dh0:? and Dh1:?). Format them exactly as you would format a floppy disk. They may take a while though - they're likely to be considerably larger than an 800K floppy!

And that's it. The dirty deed is done. Easy when you know how. ■

Hard drive compatibility with different amigas

If you are purchasing and installing a hard drive, or you have a drive and want to partition or re-format it, this list should help you through the Amiga hard drive compatibility minefield. The information here should be viewed as a guide and if you have any doubts about your machine show it to an expert.

One of the things that can be confusing is that different Amigas use different drive types. Some use SCSI, others use IDE. Still others use XT drives.

To help sort out what kind of drive you have check out this table:

A500

The most popular type of hard drive, and the only official one, was the A590. If you are at all uncertain what type it is then turn the case over (be really gentle with it, it's delicate).

There are two types of drive used in these peripherals: SCSI or XT and here should be a nice big sticker on the underside telling you what kind of drive it is. If it's an XT then write down all the details from the sticker.

Other external drives have been available for the A500, but they vary in specification,

so examine them carefully. There is also an external SCSI port on the A590. This uses SCSI hard drives only.

GVP and other drives: DO NOT USE HDTOOLBOX!* Consult the manual which came with the drive!

A1500/A2000

These used the Commodore hard disk interface card which was either a SCSI or an XT, but definitely not IDE. The only real way of finding out is to open your Amiga up. It's a very easy thing to do, these machines were designed to be opened.

If you're not certain, try to get someone skilled to check. There should be details written on the hard drive itself. You only need to write down the details if it's an XT drive.

GVP or other manufacturer's interface card: DO NOT USE HDTOOLBOX!* Consult the manual which came with the drive!

A1200

The internal hard drive is an IDE drive. External hard drive: **DO NOT USE HDTOOLBOX!* Consult the manual which came with the drive!**

A3000

It's a SCSI. Be warned though! It might be best to check inside your machine if you bought it secondhand. There are several hard drive cards which will fit inside an A3000. Consult the manual which came with the card if there is one fitted*.

A4000

The A4000 uses an IDE interface. Be warned though, like the A3000 it might be best to check inside your machine if you bought it second hand. There are several hard drive cards which will fit inside an A4000, including SCSI ones. Consult the manual which came with the card if there is one fitted*.

CD32

If you've got a CD32 and an SX1 then you have the guts of an A1200 and you're looking at IDE drive compatibility.

***Note:** Some hard drives, most notably GVP ones, have their own *HDTtoolbox* style program. Always consult their manuals before trying anything with these drives. Using Commodore's *HDTtoolbox* program might damage your drive. Just to add to the confusion, some third party drives will use either,

LETTER OF THE MONTH

Walking the plank

I recently treated my A1200 to a 3.5" 270Mb hard drive, a Viper 28 4Mb accelerator and a multisync monitor. However, I'm not happy with the software problems I've been encountering. All the serious programs have worked fine but the games are a different story.

Originally I had problems with *Roadkill* but a letter to Acid software sorted it out. Another game I enjoyed was *Banshee* but despite having an installation program it refuses to work. I wrote to Core Design but they haven't bothered to reply despite my enclosing an SAE. My main complaint, though, is with Ocean whose *PGA European Tour* I recently purchased - twice. The first copy I bought was faulty but because Ocean did not bother to put an address either on the manual or on the box I have been unable to contact them. The second copy was the A1200 specific version and does work if you can stand the 20 or 30 attempts it takes before the computer recognises disk two which contains the copy protection.

I have never been or will be a pirate but these problems make me understand why people do it and it makes me less sympathetic to the publishers, some of which are so confident in their product that after you buy it you can't contact them.

Despite being pleased with my recent investment I am now beginning to wonder whether I might have been better off scrapping the A1200 and buying a PC.

Ian, we agree with you on this one. Sadly, some software houses are still reluctant to make their games hard disk installable and doing so because of piracy is utter rubbish. A serious pirate will copy disks by whatever means and they won't worry about hard disk installability. Upgrade?

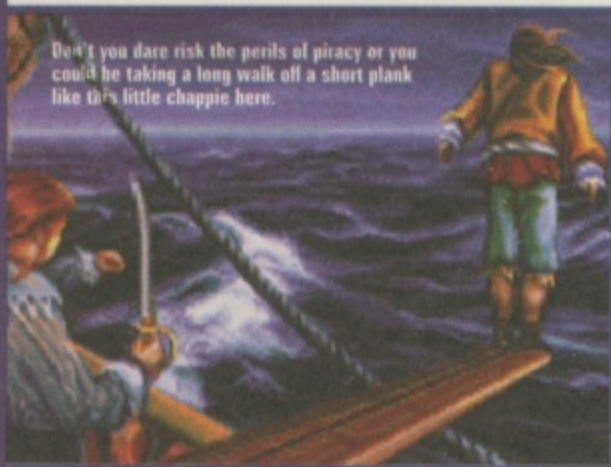

As for the Baldies demo, if you had an A500 your selective blindness may have misled you yet again, as the demo requires 1Mb chip RAM (which is why it is clearly stated that both it and OctaMED require WB 2.0 or better - on the disk). We've tested it again here in the office, on every machine from an A500+ to an A4000, via two A1200s, one with a hard drive and one without, and it works. Meanwhile our disk duplicators have assured us that, no, they haven't forgotten to put Baldies on mags going to Kent. Brave New World?



We in the Amiga community have nothing to fear in the short term and everything to gain from the Escom takeover. Nothing to fear because something, no matter what it is, is better than what we've had to put up with for the last year. And we have everything to gain because if the Amiga goes back on sale and clocks up impressive results then developers, both hardware and software, retailers and the general public will sit up again and take notice.

However, it all depends on the way things are handled. If the Amiga sells exclusively through Escom shops they will be able to put out a cheaper machine by cutting out the distributor/wholesaler middleman. But these very channels have been strong in supporting the Amiga in the past. Doing this would alienate an awful lot of UK retailers, many of whom have been the bedrock of the machine's support through thick and thin for the last ten years, selling Amigas and peripherals even after Commodore went bust.

This depth of experience should not be shrugged off lightly. With Commodore's refusal to countenance third party manufacturing of Amiga variants, the various wholesalers (Silica especially) co-operated with Commodore to create competitive packages which included more than just the Amiga, and these novel bundling deals made it even more attractive.

A new Amiga

Two weeks ago Manfred Schmitt, Chief Executive Officer of Escom answered a question I put to him about the Amiga's future in broad terms. He said that there was room in Escom's plans for a machine that was roughly one third the price of his cheapest PCs

(currently in the region of £600, excluding VAT), he expressed an interest in the Amiga as a set top box and in the world of comms, he saw it as a cheap and accessible machine.

But if that is all, then it will surely fail. We need a new Amiga next year if we want to remain competitive. A new Amiga that keeps the spirit of the old machine, with its all encompassing chipset, its ease of use, its home-friendliness and its affordability. A new Amiga which breaks away from the Motorola mould and gives us the power, the operating system and environment we need to multitask, move swiftly and create. That is what the Amiga is really about.

We've written 'till our fingers were blue about upgrading, and some of you may have thought we were talking tosh, just trying to sell more Amigas on behalf of Commodore. But get this: technology does not stand still, nor do prices, nor do the profit-making software publishers and hardware manufacturers of this world.

Rik Skews said it in last month's points of view: if you like your Amiga, if you want to continue using one because you believe it is the best machine, you must upgrade. Then you must fill out your warranty form, post it off and tell Escom that you want another Amiga as soon as possible, a bigger, better one. Waste of money? I don't think so. Even if Escom can't undercut the original £300 price point this still represents barely 85p a day for a year of Amiga use. If they were to bring out a new machine next summer, and it cost say £400 you'd still have made a saving over buying a PC or a MAC now (since whatever you buy now for under a grand will

be out of date by next year).

Escom should be developing A4000 and A1200 replacements, they should support, technically and financially third party developers, for theirs is not just a responsibility to the machine alone. If Escom wants to make long term money and if they want to maintain the Amiga as more than a cult machine, then serious investment needs to be made.

This investment can be paid for from UK or European sales, from Chinese sales, from development of the Amiga into other home consumer products, or wherever. But the investment must be made now, by you when the A1200/A4000 series goes back on sale and, on a larger scale, by the Amiga's new master. Otherwise the PC, the Playstation and the Saturn will see us off sooner than you think, and while Escom could still profit from this it will be the end user, as usual, who suffers.

All conjecture

I may be worrying prematurely. Due to the wonders of modern publishing, what I'm writing now gets printed about a week before the first 64 or so pages of this magazine, so you may have already read all about Escom's plans, on the cover and in our news feature. As it is I am writing this piece exactly one week before Escom's Frankfurt press conference, and the questions I've raised here may have been answered. Then we'll see. In the meantime my typing has got even slower because my fingers are permanently crossed. ■

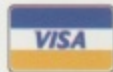
